Holy Eucharist Rite II: 8:30 AM



Be thoughtful, be silent, be reverent; for this is the house of God.

**Before the service, speak to the Lord; during the service, let the Lord speak to you;
after the service (and during the peace) speak to one another.**

Twice in this morning's Gospel, John the Baptist proclaims, "Here is the Lamb of God," and his disciples are drawn to Jesus and His message.

In a cathedral in Copenhagen, Denmark, there is a magnificent statue of Jesus by the noted sculptor Albert Bertel Thorvaldsen. When Thorvaldsen completed the clay model of the sculpture, he gazed upon the finished product with great satisfaction. It was a sculpture of Christ with His face looking upward and His arms extended skyward. It was a statue of a majestic, conquering Christ.

Later that night, however, after the sculptor had left his fine new work of clay to dry and harden, something unexpected occurred. Mist from the Tyrrhenian Sea seeped into the studio in the night. The clay did not harden as quickly as anticipated. The upraised arms and head of the sculpture began to drop.

The majestic Christ with arms uplifted and head thrown back was transformed into a Christ with His head bent forward and arms stretched downward as if in a pose of gentle invitation.

At first Thorvaldsen was bitterly disappointed. As he studied the transformed sculpture, however, he came to see a dimension of Christ that had not been revealed to him before. It was the Christ who is a gentle, merciful Savior, so Thorvaldsen inscribed on the base of the completed statue, "Come Unto Me," A full-size replica of the Christus Consolator has greeted patients and visitors to Johns Hopkins Hospital for 130 years and that picture of the Lamb of God in His mercy has inspired millions around the world.

The First Lesson

Isaiah 49:1-7

Reader: A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away!

He made my mouth like a sharp sword,
in the shadow of his hand he hid me;
he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away.

And he said to me, "You are my servant,
Israel, in whom I will be glorified."

But I said, "I have labored in vain,
I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity;
yet surely my cause is with the Lord,
and my reward with my God."

And now the Lord says,
who formed me in the womb to be his servant,
to bring Jacob back to him,
and that Israel might be gathered to him,
for I am honored in the sight of the Lord,
and my God has become my strength--
he says,

"It is too light a thing that you should be my servant
to raise up the tribes of Jacob
and to restore the survivors of Israel;
I will give you as a light to the nations,
that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations,
the slave of rulers,

"Kings shall see and stand up,

The Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 1:1-9

Reader: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,

To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and

knowledge of every kind-- just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you-- so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: **Thanks be to God.**

The Gospel (*standing*) **John 1:29-42**

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People: **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

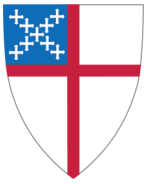
