Time for every purpose

A couple of years ago, as I did lunch-mum duty, I noticed one of my little girls (around nine years old) sitting by herself on the playground. Her eyes were closed, her arms stretched out, her thumb and first finger held together, and she was whispering, "peace, peace, peace..." Pretty impressive, I thought. So I sat down and joined her. And when we stopped, I asked her if she did that a lot. "Oh, sometimes," she replied, "when I want some quiet time." Then she ran off to play with her classmates. Wouldn't it be nice, I thought, if we all realized the importance of quiet time, peace, and contemplation in our busy lives?

I remember being quite impressed with Queen Elizabeth II's Christmas message in 2013. She noted the importance of contemplation and reflection: "I once knew someone who spent a year in a plaster cast recovering from an operation on his back. He read a lot and thought a lot and felt miserable. Later he realized this time of forced retreat from the world had helped him to understand the world more clearly. We all need to get the balance right between action and reflection" the Queen continued. "With so many distractions, it is easy to forget to pause and take stock...For Christians, for all people of faith, reflection, meditation, and prayer help us to renew ourselves in God's love as we strive daily to become better people."

This, I believe, is what today's Gospel teaches us. As the world turns increasingly faster, bringing change upon change in dizzying amounts, we need to turn away and seek silence to be able to hear God's voice within. Mary knew it. Martha would be gently reminded of it. My little schoolgirl seemed to understand it. The Queen wasn't afraid to make it the focus of her televised message to the United Kingdom. We all need to take time to sit at our God's feet.

The Second Lesson Colossians 1:15-28

Reader: A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians.

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers-- all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross. And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him-- provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.



The people kneel or sit.

Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.


