# The Ninth Sunday after Pentecost Holy Eucharist Rite II: 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM

#### Watchful & Faithful

The Scriptures are filled with admonitions to God's people to be watchful and to be faithful. Watchfulness is an attitude which requires us to be always in readiness for the Lord's return, loins girded and lamps lit, expectant and prepared.

Faithfulness is an attitude and a behavior pattern which describes how we are to live out our lives as we watch and wait. Abraham is a paradigm of both watchfulness and faithfulness, in that he accepted the promise of God even when there was no sign of its fulfillment. He was ready for any opportunity to witness God's presence in his life and to celebrate it.

Waiting for the return of the Lord means being prepared to acknowledge him when he comes to us, not just on clouds of glory...but in the neighbor who is suffering, in the child who is hungry, in the friend who is depressed and whose 'waiting' is filled with anxiety and hopelessness.

Jesus tells us to watch and to wait, and he demonstrates to us what is means to be a faithful servant while we live in the expectancy of his coming. The joyful expectation of the Kingdom (watchfulness) is enhanced by our living as though the Kingdom was here in its fullness (faithfulness). Faith is enlivened by our expectant watch, and waiting is meaningful when we spend our interim time celebrating His daily coming through worship, prayer, and service to our neighbors. But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

#### The Second Lesson Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-12

Reader: A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old-- and Sarah herself was barren-- because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. "Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

"But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." 


