Welcome Back Sunday & a Modern Day Parable

James Martin tells this wonderful story: Twenty years ago, I worked with the Jesuit Refugee Service in Nairobi, Kenya. My job was to help refugees begin small businesses to help them support themselves & their families. One day I was driving my jeep outside of the city, near the Rift Valley...Suddenly, seemingly from nowhere, a lone white sheep clambered down the hillside and darted in front of my car. I swerved to avoid hitting it. Then I watched the sheep gingerly climb down into the valley on the right side of the road.

Just then, from my left, a figure darted across the road. It was a young Maasai shepherd. In the Maasai culture the youngest boys, sometimes as early as five or six years old, tend the sheep. The shepherd dashed in front of my idling car. Barefoot, he smiled and waved to me as he passed. He scrambled down the side of the hill in pursuit of the lone sheep, calling loudly all the while. Then I looked up and saw the rest of the flock up the hill on my left. How stupid, I thought. He is leaving behind the whole flock for that one sheep! Then it dawned on me, and I laughed out loud. It was the parable of the lost sheep in action! If God pursues us with even half the energy as that young Massai boy, then humanity has nothing to worry about.

On this annual 'Welcome Back Sunday', know that whether you have been away for a couple of weeks this summer, or for months or even years, our Lord is always searching for us. All are always welcome at the table of our Savior Jesus Christ!

The First Lesson

Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28

Reader: A reading from the prophet Jeremiah.

At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert toward my poor people, not to winnow or cleanse-- a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgment against them.

"For my people are foolish, they do not know me;

they are stupid children, they have no understanding.

They are skilled in doing evil, but do not know how to do good."

I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light.

I looked on the mountains, and lo, they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro.

I looked, and lo, there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled.

I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce anger.

For thus says the Lord: The whole land shall be a desolation; yet I will not make a full end.

Because of this the earth shall mourn, and the heavens above grow black;

for I have spoken, I have purposed; I have not relented nor will I turn back.

People: Thanks be to God.

The Second Lesson 1 Timothy 1:12-17

Reader: A reading from the letter to Timothy.

Let I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners-- of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.



The people kneel or sit.

Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.Do this for the remembrance of me."




