Be thoughtful, be silent, be reverent; for this is the house of God.

Before the service, speak to the Lord; during the service, let the Lord speak to you; after the service (and during the peace) speak to one another.

Advent: Darkness & Light

Winter has drawn us into seasonal darkness. The sun often slides on pale clouds into a late morning and sets too early, while we long for just another hour of daylight. Often the darkness that envelops us in this season sits heavily with us. It might invade our inner being, causing us to 'feel' empty, void of energy on one hand – or being teased by tension on the other. Since humans first set foot into this seasonal darkness, they looked for ways to keep back the dark – fires, candles, and finally electricity.

But darkness is part of the cycle of nature. Not all darkness is bad. Nature needs the darkness of winter to hibernate and prepare for spring's renewal of growth. In darkness we might be able to sense the quiet within and the peace that contemplation cab bring — we often close our eyes to pray. Perhaps we could look at the natural darkness of Advent in a different way. Might we have gone too far, flooding our natural darkness with artificial light in this season? Sometimes, too much light may draw us into spending more than we have, forcing us to dash from store to store, enveloped by tension instead of peace. Do I have enough? Will everyone be satisfied with what they get? I have no time. There's no room in my soul for quiet.

Perhaps, as we wait for the Light that is the true Light of the world – the embodiment of peace, joy, and love – we could settle for a time in darkness. We might let the quiet surround us, the darkness of winter's rest shield us for time of prayer and reflection, regaining our inner peace. (The Rev. Dr. Suzanna Metz – Synthesis, November 27th 2016)




