



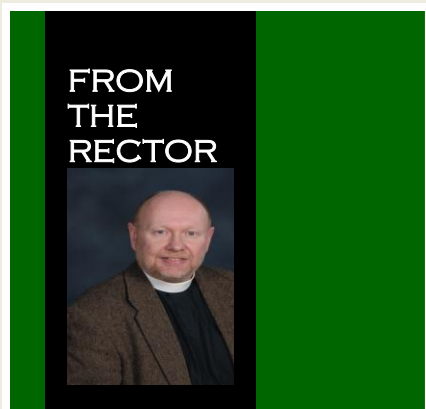

With the month of December embracing both the Advent and Christmas seasons, I'd like to share with you my reflection from this year's St. Peter by-the-Lake 'Advent Devotional'.



The Church seasons of Advent and Christmas are times of great promise and fulfillment. We enter Advent longing once again for the coming of the Christ Child. We live this out in our worship each week with the lighting of the Advent Wreath, and hearing once again the stories of waiting and anticipation. Then on Christmas Eve, the colors change from purple to white and we experience the joy of the Christ Child through sacrament and song. Every year it's different. Every year it's thrilling.

Yet, in the midst of the anticipation and fulfillment, it is a good thing to pause and remember that not everyone may be feeling happy, contented, and blessed. The time between Thanksgiving and Christmas are, for many people, a time of pain, grief, anxiety and/or depression. In many instances it's because someone important is missing from the table. I have been feeling the weight of this myself this year. Since the onset of Covid, I've lost one person from my family each year. Since 2021 I've lost a brother, a sister, a sister-in-law, and a nephew. These were all faces that graced our family's table over the generations. They ranged in age from 45 to 84. I have precious memories of each one. And I know that there are folks in our congregation who suffer, sometimes in silence, as they grieve the absence of a loved one. Whether the loss was incurred this

year, or in years past, the time doesn't matter. There is no expiration date on grief and loss.

It can be difficult to stand with those who are experiencing pain and grief when the culture around us expects everyone to be celebrating and festive. It's OK. Being with someone who is sad can be just as simple as sending a card of care and love in solidarity with the person that suffers. A text, e-mail, or phone call can be helpful as well. Pray for them. Words matter much less than presence. Just being with someone who has experienced the loss of a loved one lets that person know that they are not forgotten, that they are loved just as they are, sadness and all.

The days before the coming of Christ into the world were dark days. There was a longing for a new light to come and bring truth into a hurting world. God heard those cries, and Jesus was born to a Virgin named Mary in a small village called Bethlehem. The light was small at first, but it grew into a force that continues to change this world two thousand years later. The Kingdom of God is breaking into this tired old world each and every day. This Advent and Christmas, remember that you and I are partners with God in helping others to see this light. A light that can never be overcome by darkness. In the toughest of times, when we stand with our brothers and sisters who are hurting, we help to bring the light of Jesus.

Music Notes



One of our beloved Christmas carols is not a Christmas carol at all. The song is so familiar to us, and its words are so well known that we probably haven't noticed that the song does not include a single detail from the story of Jesus' birth: no stable, no shepherds, no wise men; no Mary or Joseph; no little town of Bethlehem or choirs of angels or silent nights.

When Isaac Watts wrote "Joy to the World," he was reflecting on Psalm 98 as part of his hymn series *The Psalms of David Imitated*. Watts wrote this series for his congregational church in London, which sang only the text of the Psalms in their worship services.

When Watts came to the second half of Psalm 98, he read the following words:

Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all the earth:
make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise ...
With trumpets and sound of cornet make a joyful noise before the Lord, the King.
Let the sea roar, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.
Let the floods clap their hands: let the hills be joyful together
Before the Lord; for he cometh to judge the earth:
with righteousness shall he judge the world, and the people with equity.

After absorbing this image of the whole earth bursting into song because the Lord comes to judge the earth, Watts wrote the four verses of "Joy to the World," inspired by Psalm 98 with his own words:

*Joy to the world, the Lord is come,
Let earth receive her King;
Let every heart prepare Him room,
And Heaven and nature sing...*

*Joy to the world, the Savior reigns!
Let all their songs employ,
While fields and floods, rocks, hills, and plains
Repeat the sounding joy...*

*He rules the world with truth
and grace,
And makes the nations prove
The glories of his
righteousness
And wonders of his love.*

Watts gave this hymn the heading “The Messiah’s Coming and Kingdom,” capping off what could be considered the perfect hymn for the Advent season. During Advent we anticipate the second coming of Christ and the “life of the world to come,” before remembering and celebrating his first coming in the Incarnation at Christmas.

The lyrics of “Joy to the World” remind us. Jesus will reverse the curse that was placed upon creation at the Fall, and sin and sorrow will cease; thorns will no longer infest the ground; and his blessings will flow “far as the curse is found.” Christ will free all of creation from its bondage, and in response, every part of creation will burst into a song of joy at his advent.

The word of hope during Advent is that we know the end of the story; our King will bring a final and lasting justice and joy to our world. As you sing “Joy to the World” during Advent; and may its words remind you that one day Jesus will rule the world with truth and grace and make known the wonders of his great love for us.

- I. Call to Order & Opening Prayer/Devotion – done by Father Ron
- II. Vestry Check-in:
 - a. Father Ron said that the Valle Crucis retreat was a huge success. It was full and there were 12-15 first-time attendees. There was also a diverse age group. The dates for the 2026 retreat are scheduled for 10/9-10/11/26 so mark your calendars!
 - b. Father Ron also provided updates on several pastoral concerns.
- III. Discussion/Decision:
 - a. September minutes approved with no changes.
 - b. Jim went over the September financials:
 - i. The month of September ended with a net positive amount of \$8,149. It was a great September. The main reason is because the revenue received was higher than expected in September even though the expenses were a little more than what was budgeted for the month.
 - The added expenses this month were due to increased salaries due to the audit and to ensure adequate staff coverage.
 - ii. Year-to-date is also at \$3,912 net positive.
 - c. First look at 2026 budget: Jim will present in next month's vestry meeting a budget for 2026 so it will be a longer meeting.
 - d. Reports from Jr. and Sr. Wardens:
 - i. Jessica: Nothing to report other than stating that Valle Crucis was great this year and she

loved seeing all of the new people there. Also, the food was much better than in previous years.

ii. Stephanie:

1. Pamela reported that the water in the sacristy has sediment in it and is yellow. Stephanie called to get it checked out. Until it is fixed, using bottled water.
2. HVAC: Stephanie will call Integrity this week to get an estimate to fix the unit that covers Fotino's Hall and the offices. Also, the Furr Hall unit makes a lot of noise (it may be the belt) so Stephanie will ask them to look at that unit as well.

iii. Fire Pit is complete! Evan completed it and it looks great. Jessica will check with Stephen to make sure they received the donations needed to cover the cost. Father Ron said we will bless it in a future 10:30am service.

iv. Bill Reid contacted the tree guy who will come out to cut the trees behind the playground and by the prayer path. It will be a two-day job (two Friday's in the future).

e. Escape Windows & Video Streaming updates:

- i. Bill Reid contacted the window installer and the windows have been ordered and should be installed in early November. Father Ron explained that everything needs to be done by February for pre-school. Bill will continue to follow up with the installation company.
- ii. The video-streaming issues continue. Bill contacted a vendor to try swap out the connector and the new one has been shipped out. Bill will also contact AT&T to have them check the connections to make sure there are no issues there. Until it is fixed, we will continue to record and upload the 10:30am services.

- f. 2026 Vestry Interest: Father Ron said there will be the normal three openings for 2026. Pamela, Bill, and Jessica will be rolling off. Any vestry candidate must be a baptized and confirmed adult member.
- g. Associate Priest update: Father Ron spoke to the bishop when he was with him at the Clergy Conference in Lake Logan. Looking for a part time priest for about 10 hours a week.
- h. Upcoming events/schedules:
 - i. 10/21: The first session of Supper and the Word – 33 people signed up.
 - ii. 10/25: 2nd annual Fall Festival scheduled on the church grounds at 2pm.
 - iii. 10/26: 2nd Youth confirmation class – 6 kids are enrolled.
 - iv. 10/26: EYC 5-7pm
 - v. 11/2: All Saints Sunday
 - vi. 11/13: Altar Guild dinner (Pamela Weed will send an email).
 - vii. 2/1/26: Bishop Jose is scheduled to visit for confirmation.

IV. Other Matters:

- a. Pat Higbie asked about cleaning the Memorial Garden stones. Father Ron will talk to the Bowden's about it since they are the custodians of the garden.
- b. Pat Higbie will also be willing to donate an extra vacuum, so we have another one at the church. She will make sure it runs okay and, if it does, will bring it to church.
- c. Pat Higbie also offered to pay to have the walkway behind Fotino's Hall pressure washed. She will reach out to the power-washer she has used before.

V. Closing Prayer done by Father Ron

Next Vestry Meeting will be on 11/24 at 7pm because Father Ron is travelling the weekend before and is not sure if he will be back in town on 11/17.

Episcopal Relief and Development

ERD is familiar to many as St. Peter's has participated in the ERD (Episcopal Relief & Development) Year-End Match initiative every year with monies collected during the Christmas service. For those not familiar with ERD, it is an organization whose mission is to answer the call for help globally and be "... the compassionate response of The Episcopal Church to human suffering in the world. Hearing God's call to seek and serve Christ in all persons and to respect the dignity of every human being, Episcopal Relief & Development serves to bring together the generosity of Episcopalians and others with the needs of the world." FIVE TALENTS

The second is Five Talents, an organization that Bill Baker served as the church's sponsor for many years. Libby Motto has assumed this role and stays up to date on its efforts to help people throughout the world. In their own words, Five Talents' mission is "transforming lives through economic empowerment... [it] provides training for those living in some of the world's lowest income countries to start their own small businesses." Historically, Five Talents has supported international partners in over 20 countries in high-risk, underserved communities where most residents lack access to traditional loans or other banking services. Currently Five Talents is focused on supporting small business owners in

Bolivia, Burundi, Kenya, Myanmar, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, and Uganda with the goal of self-sustainment.

As always, we invite the opportunity to add other local, national, and international 501(c)3's and other types of charitable initiatives of interest to any of our parishioners.
