As a new year dawns for us all here at St. Peter by-the-Lake, there are a few mission & ministry ‘bullet points’ that I want to share with everyone:

*This month we welcome the Rev. Nick McDonald to our staff as part-time ‘Assisting Priest’. Nick and his wife Jan have been attending services here for much of the past year, with Nick singing in our Chancel Choir. Nick will be working approximately 8 hours a week, preaching once a month, spelling me when I’m away, and helping out from time to time with home and hospital visitations. It’s a great joy to have Nick and Jan with us, and I know you will welcome them both with open arms.

*We are moving with all deliberate speed in laying the foundation for a fall 2026 opening of ‘St. Peter’s Preschool.’ We’re working through the bureaucracy of Lincoln County to make sure everything is done in order, and this month we hope to call the first meeting of a new preschool board of directors. Work is proceeding downstairs to turn three of our Sunday School rooms into classrooms that will be ready for students next fall. We’re also working on things like enrollment forms, parent handbooks, and bylaws.

With the advent of a new year, now is the time to think about building as much financial capital as possible for St. Peter's Preschool before it opens. If you would like to make a financial contribution to this new community outreach, you can make checks out to St. Peter's, with the notation for the preschool in the memo column. Thanks so very much!

*On January 25th, we will welcome Sister Madeleine Mary of the Community of St. Mary, Southern Province, to St. Peter by-the-Lake. She will preach at both services, and lead an adult forum between services on St. Mary's, and the ministry of nuns and monks in the Episcopal Church. At the 10:30am service, I will be inducted as an Associate member of St. Mary's. I hope you can be present for this very special day.



Lake Reflections

from Fr. Nick



As you might guess from my last name, I'm a huge fan of all things Scots-Irish, a legacy I share with many of the early settlers of Western North Carolina. So, let me begin by wishing you *Bliadhna Mhath Ùr!* That's "Happy New Year" in Scottish Gaelic, and it's roughly pronounced "BLEE-na Va OO-er."

I am absolutely delighted that my joining with the St. Peter Chancel Choir in December, 2024 for our Piedmont Deanery Epiphany Festival of Lessons and Carols, has culminated in my being called as the church's Assisting Priest, beginning this month!

The parish is certainly familiar with the ministry of assisting clergy through the solid work of my predecessors. What's different in this instance is that I have been called out of formal retirement from The Episcopal Church, USA to serve in a role distinct from that of "supply clergy" or "priest-in-charge." Furthermore, the ministry entrusted to me is a part-time, paid staff position for eight (8) hours per week.

Like Father Ron, I have an abundance of energy and believe – along with actress Billie Burke (Glinda, the Good Witch of the North in *The Wizard of Oz*) – that "Age is something that doesn't matter... unless you are a cheese!"

I'm looking forward to dusting-off the skills that have served me for over forty years as a parish priest, health care chaplain, crisis volunteer, and interim rector to inform,

nurture, support, and encourage the mission and ministry of the clergy and people of Saint Peter by-the-Lake.

Under the direction of Father Ron, and in collaboration with the total ministry team of the parish, I will preach approximately one a month at both Sunday services; lead worship and preach when Father Ron is away; provide pastoral and sacramental visitation among those in hospital, nursing home, and at home, in times of illness and as part of the clergy home visitation period each summer.

I have also been invited to join, participate in, or facilitate many of the Christian Formation and Fellowship programs offered by the church, while also remaining active with the Adult Chancel Choir.

At the outset of the ordination discernment process of my early twenties in The Diocese of Maryland, I struggled to articulate a clear call to either the diaconate or the priesthood. The *sacramental* aspect of the priesthood and the *service* facet of the diaconate were *both* attractive to me, but the diocese insisted that I express a distinct call to *one or the other*.

Eventually, I learned about the “worker priest” movement in the Roman Catholic church, especially in France and Belgium after World War II. The movement sought to reach the working classes, who had become largely alienated from the church. The worker-priests set aside their clerical garb and left their clerical dwellings to take jobs in factories and on construction sites, sharing the living conditions and social and economic problems of their coworkers. Their experiences impelled some of the worker-priests to become politically active, joining their fellow workers in various demonstrations regarding such matters as housing, antiracism, and peace.

My own “worker-priest” ministry was informed by my work in sports park maintenance, quarrying and blacktop production; began in earnest when I became a volunteer firefighter and public safety chaplain; and continued as I split my time between working in health care settings and family-sized congregations. More recently, I was self-employed as a handyman in Asheville for six years before moving to the Denver-Stanley area in 2022.

Happily, I discovered that the urgings of the Holy Spirit in my calling could not be thwarted by a one-size-fits-all approach to discernment. I was able to enjoy 4 decades of serving as *both* a deacon and priest, in spite of the good intentions of the folks involved in the discernment process.

Please know this: for Jan and me to choose Saint Peter by-the-Lake as our home church in retirement – prior to this calling – speaks volumes about the character and spirit of the congregation, the clergy, the staff, and the priorities of the parish. As a neighbor said to me recently, “You really have something very special there at Saint Peter’s.” Jan and I could not agree more!

Finally, as a Baltimore native, you may learn a few idiosyncrasies of my native tongue, Baltimorese a.k.a “Bawlmer-ese.” For example, at a parish supper, you may hear this exchange between Jan and me:

“Jeet?”
“Did you eat?”
“No!”
“Joo?”
“Well, let’s eat while it’s hut.”
“OK. We’re necks in line!”

Music Notes



I am grateful for the dedicated musicians at St. Peter by-the-Lake. The Advent/Christmas season is busy with extra rehearsals in preparation for Lessons and Carols. I hope you were blessed, as I was, by our choir, ringers and instrumentalists.

Rehearsals resume for Chancel Choir, Wednesday, January 7 and for Handbell Choir, Wednesday, January 14. Additional singers and ringers are welcome. Please let me know if you would like to participate in the music ministry.

Advent serves as a powerful reminder that we live in a world and in personal lives marked by darkness (sin, fear, suffering) but it's a season of hopeful waiting for the coming of Christ, the ultimate Light who conquers that darkness. Hymns for the Advent and Christmas seasons frequently utilize the "light and darkness" motif to symbolize the transition from a world in sin and waiting to the arrival of Christ, the "Light of the World".

Experiencing limitations with a detached retina – surgery, healing, and pirate patch in order to "see" – gave pause to consider the gift of sight. As usual, my thoughts are rooted in great hymnody.

Lyrics by Charles Wesley we recently sang remain in my ear-

Hail the heaven born Prince of Peace! (Isaiah 9:6)
Hail the Sun of Righteousness! Light and life to all he
brings,
risen with healing in his wings! (Malachi 4:2)

Kathleen Thomerson's hymn "*I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light*" – Hymnal 490 also came to mind..

She regards this hymn regards as a meditation and prayer deeply rooted in many scriptures, most connected with theme of light: Genesis 1:1; Psalm 139:12; Isaiah 60:19; Malachi 4:2; John 14:8; Ephesians 5:8; Hebrews 12:1-2; 1 John 1:5' and Revelation 21:23.

The hymn reminds us, there is no darkness in Jesus, "*the night and the day are both alike, the lamb is the light of the city of God*" The hymn continues, "*shine in my heart, Lord Jesus! I want to see the brightness of God, I want to look at Jesus, Clear Sun of Righteousness, shine on my path, and show me the way to the Father.*"

Let us call on the brightness of Jesus, for we know, deep in our souls and with every fiber of our being, Jesus can penetrate the darkest corners of humanity and is the balm to make the wounded whole.

As we call on the brightness of Jesus and fix our eyes on Him. May we also be the light and let it shine in us and through us, this day and forevermore.
