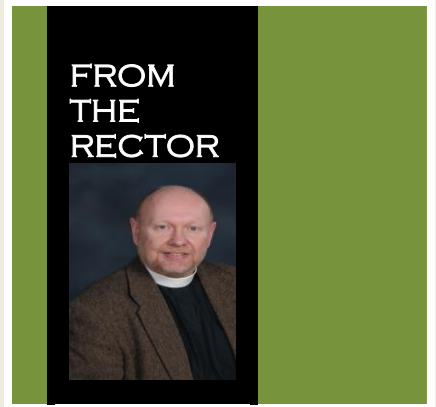

Dear Sisters and Brothers at St. Peter by-the-Lake, at the end of this month and the beginning of April we enter into that most holy time of the liturgical calendar, Holy Week and Easter.

Emotionally and liturgically, we will swing from celebration to utter despair and then back to celebration again. We will symbolically go with our Lord

Jesus from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, to the Last Supper with his friends, then to his betrayal, arrest, trial and execution. Then after three days, dead in the tomb, we will awaken on Easter morning to the incredible truth of the Resurrection. Every human emotion will be on display.



It is always my deepest prayer and hope that everyone here at St. Peter by-the-Lake will be able to participate in worship during Holy Week as we seek to be in union with Jesus during this most important of weeks. This is our Christian Passover. This week represents the central truth of our faith, and that truth is this: Easter Day is best understood and experienced in the light of all that comes before it, Palm Sunday – Holy Week – Maundy Thursday – and Good Friday. Please make this week a spiritual discipline and priority as together we walk the Way of the Cross with Jesus this Holy Week. Our schedule of services and events is listed below. Please plug yourselves in wherever and whenever you are able.

 8:30am – Holy Eucharist with the Blessing of the Palms
 10:30am – Liturgy of the Palms (outside, weather permitting), Holy Eucharist, with Passion Gospel presented by Drama & the Word Team.

Tuesday: March 31st (Tuesday of Holy Week)

7:00pm – The service of ‘Tenebrae’. (Tenebrae is Latin for ‘darkness’. The service of scripture and meditation is centered around the gradual extinguishing of candles as we remember Christ’s suffering.)

Thursday: April 2nd (Maundy Thursday)

7:00pm – Holy Eucharist with the Stripping of the Altar

9:00pm – All night prayer vigil in the dimly lighted

Nave.

Friday: April 3rd (Good Friday)

12 Noon – The Way of the Cross for all ages (outside, weather permitting)

7:00pm – The Proper Liturgy for Good Friday.

Communion from Reserve Sacrament.

Saturday: April 4th (Holy Saturday)

10:00am – Parish/Community Easter Egg Hunt with games.

Sunday: April 5th (Easter Day)

7:00am – Sunrise Service with Holy Eucharist (Begins in Memorial Garden).

8:30am – Festival Holy Eucharist.

9:30am - Mimosas in Fotinos Hall.

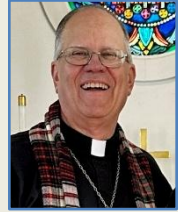
10:30am – Festival Holy Eucharist.

Lake Reflections

from Fr. Nick



On March 26th, the clergy of our diocese will gather with Bishop Jose to renew our ordination vows, as we do each year during Lent. Having grown up with The 1928 Book of Common Prayer, I find it helpful to review the bishop's admonition to ordinands almost one hundred years ago.

“The Church and and Congregation whom you must serve, is [Christ’s] Spouse, and his Body. And if it shall happen that the same Church, or any Member thereof, do take hurt or hindrance by reason of your negligence, ye know the greatness of the fault, and also the horrible punishment that will ensue (p. 540).”

I take some comfort in knowing that St. Patrick was guilty of a famous priestly error himself, and there is something serious to be weighed in considering the reaction of the one who suffered by it.

In Munster, around A.D. 433, Patrick baptized King Angus of Cashel, a man of great fame as a warrior. Preached with his customary fervor, Patrick accidentally planted his crozier,

which bore a pointed ferrule, with emphatic force upon Angus's foot, piercing it through and through.

Angus bore the pain without a flinch, allowing the bishop to complete the ritual. Right before the baptism proper, Patrick was alarmed to see the man standing in a pool of blood. When asked why he had remained silent, King Angus confided that he thought it was part of the ceremony: some sort of reenactment of the piercing of Christ that he was now to share, and so he endured it with heroic poise.

Patrick was deeply moved by this Irish hardiness, but distraught that it been brought about through an error of his - - an error which brought unnecessary pain to a member of his flock.

Inevitably, ordained clergy and others we look up to will wound the sheep committed to their care through things "done and left undone." Hopefully, we'll catch ourselves first, but if we don't, I hope you'll expand the advice from the NYC Metropolitan Transportation Authority: "If you See Something, Hear something, or Feel something, Say Something." Mutual healing begins with mutual understanding, so give voice to your pain in a timely way so that "quietness, peace, and love" may prevail.

Music Notes



For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. - 1 Corinthians 1:18

When I Survey the Wondrous Cross is one of the most important hymns in history. It was radical at the time because many churches were still restricted to singing only the Psalms; being able to offer a bold depiction of the cross as a congregational song helped to land Isaac Watts as a pioneering hymn writer.

Written by Isaac Watts in 1707, the hymn was originally titled "Crucifixion to the World by the Cross of Christ," a direct reflection of the themes in Paul's letter to the Galatians.

The hymn draws upon several scripture passages that relate to the crucifixion and its meaning:

- **Galatians 6:14:** This central verse, "But God forbid that I should boast, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world," highlights the hymn's theme of humility and devotion to the cross.
- **Philippians 3:7–9:** The sentiment expressed in the lines about counting gain as loss and pouring contempt on pride echoes Paul's declaration of considering everything a loss for the sake of knowing Christ.
- **1 Corinthians 1:18–31:** The hymn also reflects the biblical idea from 1 Corinthians that the cross, though

seemingly foolish to the world, is the power of God, dismantling human pride.

- **Isaiah 53:3–5:** The hymn's imagery of Christ's suffering, particularly the lines about sorrow and love flowing from his head, hands, and feet, aligns with the prophetic description of the suffering servant in Isaiah.
- **Romans 12:1:** "In View of God's Mercy": Romans 12:1 urges believers to offer themselves as a "living sacrifice" because of the spiritual mercies described in chapters 1-11. The hymn embodies this by focusing on the "wondrous cross" where the "Prince of glory died". The hymn calls for abandoning earthly pride and vain things, sacrificing them to Christ's blood, which aligns with the transformation of mind and refusal to conform to the world.

Focusing on the cross during Lent and Holy Week involves deep meditation on Christ's passion, death, and sacrificial love to prepare for Easter. Jesus' life and death show us that the cross is not optional. Taking up one's cross is required for all who follow Jesus Christ. Christ leads the procession carrying his cross; we, his followers, are to walk in his steps bearing our own crosses.

This hymn urges a reevaluation of life, where "vain things" lose their charm in light of Christ's sacrifice - moving the singer from self-centeredness to self-surrender. It contemplates the scene at Calvary, where "sorrow and love flow mingled down," representing the immense pain of the crucifixion balanced with God's immense love for all of humanity.

December Financials: (Jim Heil)

- Jim mentioned December 2025 was a good month and estimates between 20-30K surplus for 2025. Father Ron made a recommendation to split the anticipated surplus of 50% going towards the Building and Grounds Fund and 50% toward the Capital Fund for the Pre-School.
- Of the surplus for 2025, 50% will go toward the Capital Fund and Pre-School, 25% towards the Building Fund and 25% toward the Security/Safety Fund which was separately motioned, approved and seconded by vestry members.

Vestry discussed the estimates and decided to source additional estimates from other HVAC contractors

including but not limited to Henson Mechanical and Custom Comfort.

- Stephanie alerted vestry to the crack/opening near the rose window behind the Alter which will be investigated internally and repaired as needed.
- There are multiple lights in the sanctuary that need to be replaced.
