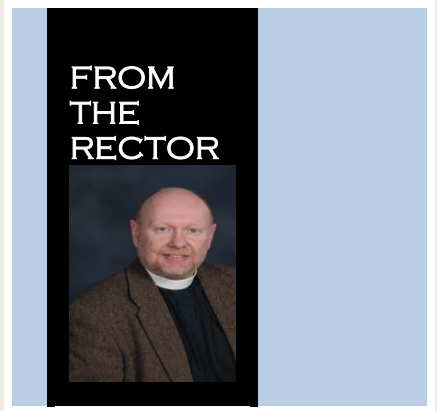

With the month of May comes the end of the academic year in schools and colleges all across our country. For many churches, this also includes the end of the 'program' year as formation classes go on 'hiatus' for the summer vacation season. But as we look towards graduations and the end of this program year, I

want to spend a few minutes looking forward to the next program year here at St. Peter by-the-Lake, and I want to highlight two programs for spiritual enrichment and education.



The first of course is St. Peter's Preschool. Our director, Ginia Edwards, is working hard now on putting final touches on the classrooms, designing signage for the roadside and sidewalk, and recruiting students for our very first year. St. Peter's Preschool will offer classes for 2, 3, and 4 year-olds. Beginning this September,

classes will run from 8:45am through 12:30pm on Monday – Thursday. The Preschool will not be a 'daycare', but a fun-filled learning experience that will help prepare these kids for Kindergarten and beyond. And we'd love to have all of you to help with advertisement and recruitment. Let your friends and neighbors know about this new preschool nestled at our church in the Westport community. information. We need everyone's prayers and active involvement to help get St. Peter's Preschool off the ground!

Second, I want to also put in a 'plug' for our Education for Ministry Program. Also known simply as 'EFM', this is a program of adult formation and religious education that's administered by the School of Theology, University of the South, in Sewanee, Tennessee. This is one



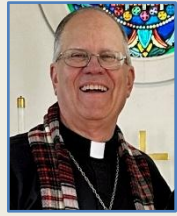
of the most comprehensive adult formation programs that exists in any Christian denomination. The class must have at least 6, but no more than 12 students. We meet here at St. Peter's in Fotinos Hall each Wednesday night from September through May from 7 – 9pm. This is a four year program that you commit to one year at a time. During the four years you will study the Old Testament, New Testament, Church History and Christian Theology using seminary level textbooks as well as on-line articles and videos. EFM now also offers a single year program that touches on each of these four disciplines that's called 'EFM Wide Angle.'

Along with academic study and discussion, students in EFM engage in a learning technique called 'Theological Reflection', which is really the heart of the EFM experience. Sherree Brady and I are both trained and certified 'mentors' for the program. We are not teachers, but we are guides and companions along the way as we learn together. There is cost involved, and if you are interested in the program, please contact either Sherree or myself and we'll get you more information. The next class begins in early September, and we'd love to have you on board.

# Lake Reflections

from Fr. Nick



On May 10<sup>th</sup>, our parish celebrate the lives and accomplishments of our graduates, which underscores the importance of both their formation and their futures. How has Saint Peter by-the-Lake prepared them for their next endeavors and how will they minister in Christ's Name?

One must look no further than the Episcopal Church's May 13<sup>th</sup> commemoration of the life and ministry of social reformer Frances Perkins (1880-1965), an active member of the Episcopal Church and the first woman to serve a President of the United States as a member of the Cabinet.

As a young adult, she discovered and was confirmed at the Church of the Holy Spirit in Lake Forest, Illinois. She remained a faithful and active Episcopalian for the remainder of her life. After her graduation from university and move to New York, she became passionate about the social problems accompanying industrialization and urbanization and became an advocate for industrial safety and labor law reform. In 1933, Franklin D. Roosevelt appointed her as Secretary of Labor, a position she would hold for twelve years.

During her years of public service, Frances Perkins depended upon her faith, her life of prayer, and the guidance of her church for the support she needed to assist the United States in facing the enormous problems of the time. Every month, she would take time

away from her duties to make a retreat at the Episcopal convent of the All Saints Sisters of the Poor in nearby Catonsville, Maryland.

She spoke publicly of how the Christ's incarnation informed her conviction that people ought to work with God to create a just Christian social order. She was an eloquent example of lay and women's ministry, writing that "The door might not be opened to a woman again for a long, long time, and I had a kind of duty to other women to walk in and sit down on the chair that was offered". On a lighter note, she also wrote, "'Being a woman has only bothered me in climbing trees".

Loving God, we bless your Name for Frances Perkins, who in faithfulness to her baptism envisioned a society in which all might live in health and decency: Help our graduates to contend tirelessly for justice and for the protection of all, that we may be faithful followers of Jesus Christ, in whose Name we pray. Amen.

**Senior Warden: (Stephanie Heil)**

- Nothing to report.
- The carpet coming up in the sacristy is fixed.

**Junior Warden: (Mary Sansbury)**

- Safety and Security Team, Dave and Michelle Moss are still trying to meet with the Sherriff Beam and will wait until after Easter. Sherriff Beam will send a deputy to do a walk-through of the church. Chad Hamby will help with the safety end of that.
- Bill Reid is still working on a security system for the preschool. We will have to have a separate surveillance, like an iPad and camera for downstairs.
- Regarding the lighting in the parking lot, we have contacted Duke Power, and we have not heard back from them.
- We are still working on getting quotes for the HVAC system, hopefully will hear back from Integrity.
- There is a crack on the inside wall near the Alter. Tom Grace looked at it and said no critters can get in. All we need to do is seal it on the inside, it's not that critical. We just need someone to crawl up there with a tall ladder. Gary Jarvis will do some research to figure what to seal it with. Will also get advice from a carpenter.
- The Preschool molding is fixed around the walls.
- The HVAC window unit's downstairs don't seem to be working properly; they will heat then turn to cool and never go back to heating mode. We need to get these serviced. We will wait to see who will end up doing our HVAC work and put on hold.

- The ice makers are fixed, the leak in the hall is fixed and but we don't have invoices yet.
- The light in the Nave is fixed, and the elevator phone is fixed.
- Mason Rudd replaced wood on the picnic tables.
- For our Parish Workday, the stones in the memorial garden need cleaning, and will also need pine needles. Mary will talk to past Junior Wardens to find out what to do.

### **Preschool Updates: (Father Ron Taylor)**

- There was money transferred into the Pre-School fund, we are sitting at 50k, a good start for the Pre-School.
- The Pre-School is incorporated. Work is continuing downstairs; the tables and chairs are here. The cubbies and bookshelves are done
- We are ready for tours in all three classrooms for prospective parents.

- Sunday, March 29, is our Palm Sunday service 8:30 and 10:30 (outside). We will have two trumpeters. It will be a beautiful service.

- Friday, April 3, is our Good Friday Way of Cross Service at noon for all ages.

- Saturday, April 4, at 10:00am is our Community Easter Egg hunt.
- Sunday, April 5, is our 7am sunrise service in the Memorial Garden, followed by an 8:30 and 10:30 Easter Service. Mimosa Bar at 9:30 in Fotinos Hall.
- Wednesday, April 15, the Bishop is rescheduled for confirmation at 6:30pm, with Holy Eucharist and a reception in Furr Hall at 8pm.

## Haitian Hope

Hello from your Mission Outreach team. We are grateful for the many ways our parish supports ministries both near and far.

This month we would like to highlight our support for Haitian Hope, an international organization founded in 2004 by a Sunday School class at St. Francis' Episcopal Church in Macon, GA—where our parishioner Libby Motto grew up.

Haitian Hope partners with the community of Trouin, Haiti, to provide education and resources that help break cycles of poverty. Through support of St. Marc's Episcopal School, donations help fund teacher salaries, daily meals for students and staff, school uniforms, books, and essential supplies.

Operating with an all-volunteer U.S. staff, Haitian Hope directs 100% of donations to its work in Haiti. Over the past two decades, this support has helped expand school facilities, add vocational training opportunities, build an outdoor kitchen, and install a clean water filtration system that serves the entire village.

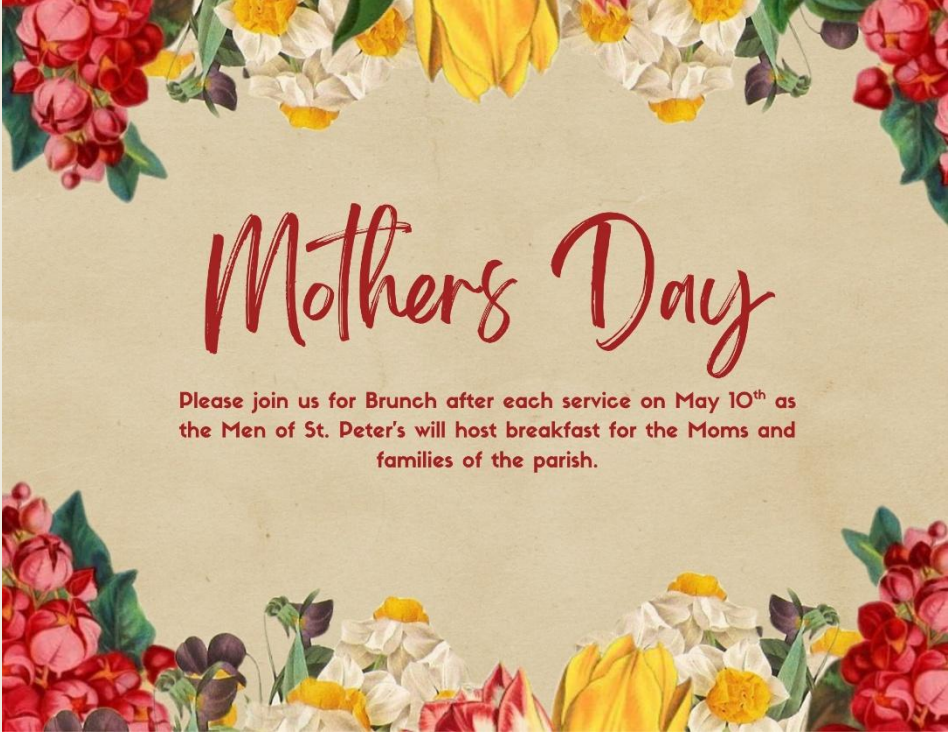

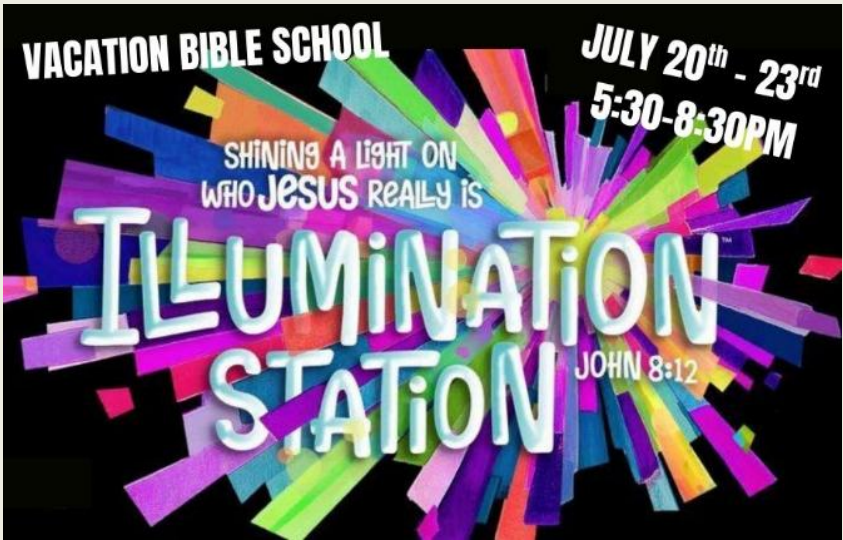
