

Here at St. Peter by-the-Lake, the months of October and November are filled with lots of spiritual activity. We enjoy and benefit from a variety of bible and book studies, the parish retreat to Valle Crucis, the Fall Festival, diocesan convention, weekly celebrations of the Holy Eucharist, and Thanksgiving.



This is also the time when together we embark on our journey to seek the ministry funding of 'time, talent, and treasure' for the upcoming year. It's always a time to remember and celebrate all the ministry that together we have rendered to God's glory, and to continue to build on foundations that have been here for over 50 years.

Our 'theme' this year comes directly from the words of the Prophet Micah from the Hebrew Scriptures. When asked what the Lord requires from God's people, Micah is very straightforward. We are to 'do' justice, to 'love' mercy, and to 'walk' with humility in relationship to God and neighbor.

Doing justice includes many of the ministries that spring forth from St. Peter's. Our work with the Answered Prayers ministry with St. Mark's in Gastonia to help with the needs of the unhoused. It includes feeding those in need through the Corner Table Soup Kitchen in Newton and in helping to shelter the unhoused at the Hesed House of Hope in Lincolnton. It means supporting through donations and volunteer hours the East Lincoln Christian Ministries here in Denver. It means filling backpacks with food for hungry children. It means working with our Creation Care team to recycle and to help keep Fairfield Forest Road clear of garbage. It means welcoming the stranger,

the outcast, the foreigner, the hurting in our midst. These are just a few examples. There are many more.

To love mercy is to understand that all of use have fallen short in our relationships with God and our neighbors, that no one is perfect save Christ. It means extending grace and forgiveness to others as the same has been given to us in our lives.

Walking with humility is understanding that giving back is for the follower of Jesus a way of life. We don't do it for attention or accolades, we give out of our deep thankfulness for all that God has given us in our lives. All of the words from Micah's passage talk about 'action': Do justice – love mercy – walk humbly. Every health professional will tell us that movement is vital to human health throughout our lives. When we stop moving, health suffers and the body and mind begin to atrophy. The very same is true in our religious and spiritual lives. Faith increases as faith is exercised. It's kind of like a muscle. If one does not use it, it atrophies. But using it causes it to strengthen every day. Faith begets faith.

This fall, I encourage everyone at St. Peter by-the-Lake to prayerfully and thoughtfully consider your gifts back to God through the ministrations of the Church. Then take the next step and turn in your pledge and time/talent information. Every kind of gift, to matter how large or small, is vital to the movement and health of the Church in this corner of God's Kingdom.

Thanks so much! And may God continue to bless us as we journey in faith together.


The New Coventry Psalter

The choir introduced a new "TONE" from the Coventry Psalter for the Psalm. I encourage the congregation to join with the choir in chanting the Psalm. The TONE has 4 measures with 8 tones.

For example by half verse:

(vs. 1) Sing text (By the waters of Babylon we sat down and wept) on the first tone and change to the second tone on an underlined word "wept"

(vs.2) Sing text (As for our harps, we hung them) on the third tone and change to the fourth tone on the underlined word "land"...

- 1 By the waters of Babylon we sat down and wept, * when we remembered you, O Zion.
- 2 As for our harps, we hung them up * on the trees in the midst of that land.



Lincoln County Coalition Against Child Abuse

Hello from your Mission Outreach team. Many of you know who we support in the local community and beyond. We invite the opportunity to add other local, national, and international 501(c)3's and other types of charitable initiatives of interest to any of our parishioners.

This month we would like to highlight our support for the Lincoln County Coalition Against Child Abuse. The LCCAC is a citizen-based organization dedicated to preventing child abuse and neglect and providing intervention and treatment when children have become victims.

From the website, LCCAC describes that their "Child Advocacy Center was established to respond rapidly and effectively to reported cases of child abuse, with intent to minimize further trauma to the child and non-offending family members, to promote appropriate therapy for the child and non-offending family members, and to follow-up with the child and family throughout the periods of investigation and therapy.

The CAC is a comfortable, safe, child-friendly place where young victims of abuse and neglect and their families come to have a forensic interview and receive referrals for medical care, therapy services, and other resources they may need."
