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

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ST. PETER'S PRESCHOOL – FALL 2026

My dear sisters and brothers at St. Peter by-the-Lake, after lots of prayer, reflection and discussion with staff members and our vestry, we've made the decision to begin laying the groundwork for opening a parish based 'preschool'



in the fall of 2026! The continuing rising demographics in Denver/East Lincoln, along with our desire to serve the community and prepare children for elementary school have been driving forces in making this decision.

St. Peter's Preschool would be located downstairs in three separate classroom areas. The room that is currently used as the nursery (it would continue to function as such on Sunday mornings), the Kingdom Kids classroom, and a supply room directly across the hall from the Kingdom Kids classroom. The preschool would consist of a two year old, three year old, and four year old class. The preschool would begin, and remain small, with hopefully around 30 total students. Our Christian Formation Director, Ginia Edwards, would serve as the Preschool Director. She would also continue her ministry as our CF Director.

The First thing that you will notice on the campus will be the changing out of two windows in two of the classrooms downstairs. Those windows will have to serve as 'escape' windows in case of the need for an emergency exit. Those directives come to us from both the Lincoln County Fire Marshall, and Lincoln County Inspections Department. These windows have been funded by a very generous donation from

former parishioners who wish their gift to remain anonymous. We are very grateful and thankful for their love and faithfulness.

After the new windows are installed, there will be another inspection from Lincoln County. Following that, we can begin laying further groundwork by creating logos, by-laws, handbooks, and a Preschool Board of Directors. It is our hope to be able to begin advertising for students after the new year begins in January.

After reading this, some of you may be asking "How can I Help"? The first thing everyone can do is offer prayers for this new mission. Starting a new school from scratch is lots of work and contains lots of 'steps' to complete. We begin everything with prayers. Second, some of you may be asked if you would like to serve on the Preschool Board. Please prayerfully consider such a ministry. And third, as we did with the piano for our music department, we will be asking for donations for 'seed money' to help sustain the new preschool during this first introductory year. Prayers, expertise, and financial gifts will all be very much appreciated!

As this process continues during the fall and winter months, there will be more information and updates. For now, hold this possibility in your thoughts and prayers, as we seek to fill St. Peter's with the learning and laughter of children during the weekday mornings.



BACKPACK FOR KIDS

Hello from your Mission Outreach team. Many of you know who we support in the local community and beyond. We invite the opportunity to add other local, national, and international 501(c)3's and other types of charitable initiatives of interest to any of our parishioners.

This month we would like to highlight our support for Backpacks for Kids Ministry: an outreach program of St. James Elementary School. Our motto is "Helping Feed Local Kids One Backpack at a Time."

Backpack for Kids helps feed local, hungry school children on weekends and school breaks. The children served in this program qualify for free or reduced lunch and the food-filled backpacks are discreetly distributed through the school guidance counselor.

Each year, we pack backpacks of food for students in need and while the number varies, it is typically around 15 students in grades Kindergarten-5th grade. The program has expanded to cover weekend food needs as well, and even accounts for longer weekends and holidays when kids may not have any other food source than this program.

We rely on some funding from Mission Outreach but also depend on donations of our fellow parishioners here at St. Peter's. For a list of needed items or to volunteer to help sort or pack these backpacks, please see Carmen Hatley.

THE STEWARDSHIP CORNER

WHAT MOTIVATES YOU???

It's now September and everything is starting up again after our summer off. I have shared with you all before how I believe the Holy Spirit wakes me in the middle of the night to fill my head with thoughts and ideas when I am scheduled to write an article for the Net or perhaps give a lay stewardship sermon. Well, this month is no different.

It was the middle of the night sometime in July when I couldn't sleep. I was thinking about what I might want to write for the September Net but what kept coming to mind was Peggy Carlisle's last days in the hospital. I had gone to Cornelius to visit her on Wednesday, June 4th, only to find that she had been taken to Novant for blood tests. On Friday morning, I felt strongly that I should go to see Peggy but her daughter, Kim, had asked that I call or text before coming to be sure the doctor was not going to be with her so I texted Kim that I planned to visit around 2 that day and she indicated that would be good. Peggy and I had a really nice visit for about 45 minutes and then I left as she was really tired and wanted to nap. I learned that she went to be with the Lord on Saturday, not even 24 hours later. Had I not listened to that inner urging to go visit on Friday, we might not have had that last time together.

On June 16th as I was leaving a meeting at the church, Fr. Ron stopped me to ask if I was interested in serving on the Pastoral Care Team. My initial silent reaction was, "oh something more to take on" but during the conversation I again was prompted by perhaps the Holy Spirit to realize that I was already doing this because as I like to describe it, when the Sprit moves me (like with Peggy), I independently visit various members of the church such as Peggy in rehab, Mary LaBranche and Irene Stollery at Wexford House, and Linda Best in rehab following her hip surgery, so I told Fr. Ron I would join the Pastoral Care Team.

To end what is already a long article, my message this month would be IF you are thinking about or are invited to join any of the ministries here at St. Peter or in our community at large, you might consider honoring those nudges, urges, and yes, sometimes even shoves from wherever they originate as you never know where it might lead you, the difference it might make for you, or of even more significance, the difference you might make for others.
