History

Current-day Monroeville was once the home of the Creek Indians, where the land was clashed over by France, Spain, and England. In 1815, the Creek Indians surrendered the land at the Treaty of Fort Jackson and the county was created by proclamation of the governor of the Mississippi Territory. The county was once about one-third of the size of present-day Alabama and is often referred to as the "Mother County."

Monroeville, named Monroe County's seat of government in 1832, was incorporated in 1899. Both Monroeville and Monroe County were named in honor of U.S. President James Monroe.

While visiting Monroeville, make sure to

partake in a historic walking tour, Literary Capital Sculpture Trail, or participate in the town's 10K Volkswalk sponsored by the Monroeville/Monroe County Chamber of Commerce. Visitors can access a guided walking tour brochure by visiting the Chamber's welcome center at 86 North Alabama Avenue. Tourism information is also available in a kiosk located on the corner of Pineville Avenue outside of the Chamber office.

Famous historic sites throughout the county include the Masonic Hall at Perdue Hill (circa 1823 and visited by the Marquis De Lafayette), Burnt Corn (the site of the outbreak of the Creek Indian War of 1814), Rikard's Mill (a restored gristmill and park north of Beatrice), the old railroad town of Peterman, and many other historic towns and neighborhoods.

Monroe County Museum



Monroeville's 1903 courthouse, which once served as the county seat, is home to the Monroe County Museum. The building was lovingly restored in a grassroots effort beginning in 1989 and concluding in 2002. In 2021 the iconic Monroe County Courthouse was named a National Historic Landmark. Fewer than 3 percent of properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places are NHLs. The designation is the highest recognition bestowed by the federal government and reflects the national importance of the site to the American people.

The museum today features permanent exhibits dedicated to Monroeville writers Nelle Harper Lee and Truman Capote, who were childhood companions. The museum annually attracts thousands of visitors from all over the United States the world at large.

Harper Lee's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, *To Kill A Mockingbird*, was published July 11, 1960. Its publication put Monroeville on the map for literary tourists; the novel, now in its 60th year of publication, continues to draw visitors to Monroeville from all over the world.



The film version of *To Kill A Mockingbird* debuted in 1962, and won a Best Actor Oscar for Gregory Peck, who portrayed Atticus Finch, and an Adapted Screenplay Award for Horton Foote.

Christopher Sergel's ever-popular theatrical version followed and has been a springtime tradition at Monroeville's historic courthouse since 1991. Enacted by a volunteer cast, *The Mockingbird Players*, and set in the Otha Lee Biggs Amphitheater, on the west side of the courthouse square (Act 1), and upstairs in the historic courtroom (Act 2), the production annually plays to sold out audiences. The 30th Production of "To Kill A Mockingbird" has been listed in the Top 10 Events for Alabama Tourism.

A whole industry has grown up around Monroeville's role as "Literary Capital of Alabama," a title bestowed in 1997 by official declaration of the Alabama Legislature. There are two self-guided walking tours of the downtown area; one narrated with signage that relates a history of homes and structures in the downtown historic district. In 2009, over 400 structures in Monroeville's historic downtown were designated by The National Park Service as worthy of designation on The National Register of Historic Places, including the 1903 courthouse museum, the post office, and many other commercial and residential structures.

Located inside the Monroe County Museum, The Bird's Nest is a one-stop shop with something for everyone! Its offerings include wedding & baby registries, gifts, souvenirs, books, local art, kitchen & food items, home décor and MORE!

Monroeville is a featured stop on the State of Alabama's Civil Rights Trail, as well as a prominent stop on the Southern Literary Trail. The Monroeville Literary Festival previously called the Alabama Writers Symposium, held each spring in Monroeville, brings writers, scholars, and literary tourists to the area. Whatever the occasion, a visit to Monroeville is not complete without an extensive tour of the courthouse square area!

and tour the Monroe County Museum which was recently designated as a National Historic Landmark. Come back to the museum for one of their many events and take time for the fun and educational walking tours. Stop by the Monroe County Public Library to check out a book and attend one of their arts or educational events. Also, be sure to stay in an Airbnb in one of the newly renovated historic buildings.

There is constantly something new happening in the Main Street district which offers one-of-a-kind experiences and events with a diverse mix of businesses, shopping, and dining. We hope you will join us for some of the annual Monroeville Main Street events in

our downtown such as Second Saturdays on the Square, the Paint the Town Paint Out, a seasonal Pop-Up Art Gallery, and our annual Farm to Table Dinner. Check out our programs including- BUOY – a young entrepreneur class, the Small Box Shop – an entrepreneurial launchpad, and the Monroe Council for the Arts.

Economic Development

Monroeville, centrally located in southwest Alabama, has much to offer new and expanding businesses. The town has diversified from one of the leading textile communities in the south to focusing on clusters in manufacturing, forestry and agriculture, logistics and distribution.


The Monroeville/Monroe County Economic Development Authority works very closely with the Alabama Department of Commerce to identify prospective businesses and assist existing industries. The Monroeville Industrial Park has seen substantial growth in the past years, which was boosted by the addition of Sterling Packaging, LLC Inc. The Canadian company has

created over 50 jobs and millions in capital investment. Adjacent to the Monroeville Industrial Park, another facility recently reopened. The local workforce also attracted the addition to Fruit of the Loom's Vanity Fair, when its sister company, Russell Brands located here in April 2022, creating an additional 50 new jobs. Monroeville remains poised for new growth inside the park with a 30-acre Advantage Site. This site is pad ready and additional acreage is available.

The BC Hornady Industrial Incubator is now home to Green Product Technologies, J & L Industrial Services, and Reid State Technical College. The incubator has remaining space for lease and focuses on

emerging and expanding start-up manufacturing—as well as a growing workforce development center. Monroeville and Monroe County has continued to see growth in existing industry as well as new. Georgia Pacific Cellulose, formerly known as Alabama River Cellulose, is the county's largest employer and the largest bleach fluff producer in North America. Georgia-Pacific has invested over \$170 million dollars in Alabama River Cellulose in the recent years and continues to make capital improvements and employment expansions in two of its Monroe County facilities. Georgia-Pacific also manufactures panel products and dimensional lumber in Monroe County and at its other industrial location in

Monroeville boasts several diverse forest products companies, such as Harrigan Lumber Company, Owens Lumber Company, Scotch Plywood and B&B Cabinet Doors. Harrigan Lumber recently completed an expansion spanning over three years with a total investment of rough \$100 million dollars with a goal of two complete shifts producing lumber for construction and furniture.

The Monroeville/Monroe County Economic Development Authority received a rural infrastructure grant for \$2.5M to extend the natural gas pipeline from Peterman to Beatrice. This project will provide an

opportunity for Scotch Plywood and Monroe Sausage to remain competitive.

Gate Precast Company, which manufactures architectural precast concrete, has continued to ramp up employment as it “shapes skylines” in the south, with projects such as the new Atlanta Falcons Stadium, the new Atlanta Braves stadium, Navy Federal Credit Union headquarters in Florida and other recognizable additions to a variety of institutions.

The county is also well served by Monroe County Aeroplex, with its 6,100-foot runway. The airport is heavily utilized by civilian and military aircraft, and, in fact, serves as a training area for the military.

Business today revolves around logistics. Monroeville’s optimal location, with two connections to Interstate 65, and its location as the hub of the El Camino East/West Corridor (U.S. 84) in Alabama, puts it within 24-hour access to two-thirds of the U.S. economy.

The agricultural industry thrives in Excel and Uriah both in row crop and cattle. Still the No. 1 industry in Alabama, agriculture is a mainstay in the county as well as the state.

The tourism industry is another important spoke in the economic development wheel with the author of *To Kill a Mockingbird*, Harper Lee’s former home being in downtown Monroeville. Other famous authors who have lived

Educational opportunities of highest quality and academic excellence in safe and orderly learning environments for all students. PRIVATE SCHOOL

Monroe Academy, founded in 1969, is a private day school with approximately 360 students enrolled in K3 through 12th grade, consisting of preschool, lower elementary, upper elementary and high school. The school is committed to

“excellence in education in a Christian environment.” The feeling of family is deeply rooted in the school with many students representing third and even fourth generations enrolled at Monroe Academy.

Small class sizes are preferred allowing opportunities for more individual attention for the students. Over the past 10 years, the school’s graduation rate has been 100 percent and in an average year, 95 percent of graduates enter colleges or technical colleges with 75 percent or more receiving scholarships.

The school offers a diverse range of activities including service clubs, band, team sports, chapel, fine arts, foreign language, student government, 4-H, and

technology classes. Participation in the AISA offers jr. and sr. scholars bowl, creative writing contests, spelling bee, visual art show and other technology and fine art options. Summer enrichment opportunities are also available each year. Monroe Academy aims to produce well-rounded students, who graduate and go out into the world and to become a productive and beneficial member of their community.

Monroe Academy also offers a fully accredited day care program for three- and four-year-olds. The facility is self-contained on the MA campus and is open from 6:45 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. The preschool classes offer ABEKA curriculum, technology rich environment,

imaginative free play, and a variety of fine arts. A secure playground area is available and utilized multiple times throughout the day.

Students are encouraged to be involved in the community and develop an appreciation for the community. All students are required to serve the community with a minimum of 75 service hours prior to graduation.

Monroe Academy is a member of the Alabama Independent School Association (AISA) and is a Blue Ribbon School. Both specifications denote the hard work of the students, educators, staff, families, and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools where students master challenging and engaging content.

tower of the famous downtown area. Serving hundreds of students, this campus is integral to the higher education access for Monroe County and the surrounding areas.

Coastal Alabama Community College is the second largest community college in the state serving 10 counties in southwest Alabama and neighboring counties in Mississippi and Florida. Overall, the college serves approximately 10,000 each year across credit and non-credit programs.

In regard to apprenticeship programs, the college has become a pacesetter for the State. In fact, Coastal Alabama Community College has been recognized for developing the first nursing apprenticeship program for licensed

practical nurses and registered nurses in the State. This paid apprenticeship program allows students to earn money while completing their studies. And the partnerships do not stop there. Industries across south Alabama have partnered with the college to help recruit and retain a quality workforce through these apprenticeship programs.

Workforce training is a priority of Coastal Alabama Community College. But, that is one of many as the college continues to be a valued institution for students who want to obtain general studies courses then transfer to four-year institutions. In fact, it's relatively seamless due to the legislatively backed Statewide Transfer and


Articulation Reporting System (STARS). Academic courses are guaranteed to transfer to public universities across Alabama. Health Care

Currently, Monroe County Hospital is the largest employer in Monroeville. However, MCH opened its doors in 1962 with just 35 employees. Since that time, growth, and development have been continuous for the rural hospital with major building additions in 1967, 1974, 1980, 2000, 2017, and 2020. Recent renovations inside and outside the hospital have given a much-needed facelift to the facility. The long-awaited new Monroe County Hospital Emergency Department opened its doors in March of 2020. The \$2.5 million project tripled the size of the emergency area to 9,000 square feet. The department expanded to 12 beds which include multiple trauma rooms, an isolation room and a decontamination room. Each room features a nurse-call system for better patient communication and new bedside cardiac units.

For over 60 years, Monroe County Hospital has been delivering a high level of quality care while being responsive to the needs and values of patients, physicians and employees. MCH understands that caring for your health is a team effort. You are more than just a name on a chart. To MCH you are a neighbor and that is how you will be treated. As a patient, MCH is dedicated to providing you with excellent care. As a guest, MCH wants you to feel at home. MCH is a 94-bed facility with employees committed to providing exceptional hospital and home health care. MCH offers a full range of modern medical and surgical services in a clean and safe environment, close to home.

The eight-bed MCH Intensive Care Unit is newly renovated and staffed by seasoned Registered Nurses. They are proficient at taking care of a realm of patients including pediatric, adult, geriatric, and surgical patients. MCH's Medical-Surgical unit offers quality care to patients of all ages.

Monroe County Hospital's full-service Emergency Department with 24 hours a day, seven days a week and offers nursing and physician coverage with a combined 180 years experience. The staff is here to ensure that the very best in evidence-based practices are delivered to patients. They also guide patient safety and care practices, lead quality improvement efforts and promote solutions to prevent patient safety events.

The Cardiopulmonary Department provides inpatient and outpatient treatment and diagnostic testing. These include respiratory therapy, sleep studies, cardiac testing and cardiovascular imaging. Monroe County Hospital also has a Radiology Department that provides state-of-the-art CT, MRI, ultrasound, digital mammography, diagnostic imaging with digital fluoroscopy and bone density. They also have a PACS (picture archive communication system) for image storage.

MCH's modern birthing unit consists of spacious birthing suites, a postpartum unit and nursery. In 2017, MCH was designated as a Baby Friendly birth facility. Monroe County Hospital is extremely proud of the obstetrical, clinical, and

medical staff for their hard work, dedication and commitment to become a Baby-Friendly Designated birth facility. These kinds of designations are very hard to come by and it takes total "buy in" from the entire team to achieve this status. MCH was the first rural hospital in Alabama to receive this prestigious designation. MCH also encourages a breastfeeding mom's support group for the local area.

Monroe County Hospital offers outpatient and inpatient general surgical services including laparoscopic hernia repairs and gall bladder surgeries, obstetrics, breast surgeries, and endoscopic procedures. The Chemotherapy/Oncology Department services 16 surrounding counties and has a Board-Certified Oncologist available Tuesdays and Wednesdays for clinic appointments. Appointments

are available Monday through Thursday with a Board-Certified Nurse Practitioner who specializes in Oncology and Hematology. MCH has four chemotherapy certified Registered Nurses and a patient reimbursement specialist to assist patients with treatment assistance. The Oncology Department allows patients to receive their cancer treatments in a comfortable and convenient atmosphere, close to home.

MCH Rural Health Clinic is a family medical clinic located in the downstairs wing of Monroe County Hospital. They provide families with preventative and routine medical care for all ages. Services offered by the clinic range from physicals to diagnostics to treatment of minor illnesses. These caring professionals see patients from pediatrics to geriatrics, Monday through Friday.

The MCH lab is a full-service

laboratory providing hematology, chemistry, coagulation, blood bank, urinalysis, serology, microbiology, and drug monitoring. The lab is staffed 24 hours and provides outpatient services between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Monroe County Hospital's Pharmacy Department provides medication services to patients including the oncology clinic, diabetes education and ambulatory infusion patients. The pharmacists and staff work along with the physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals to provide the most appropriate drug therapy for each patient. Pharmacists educate patients, their family members, and caregivers about safe and effective use of medications while in the hospital and after discharge.

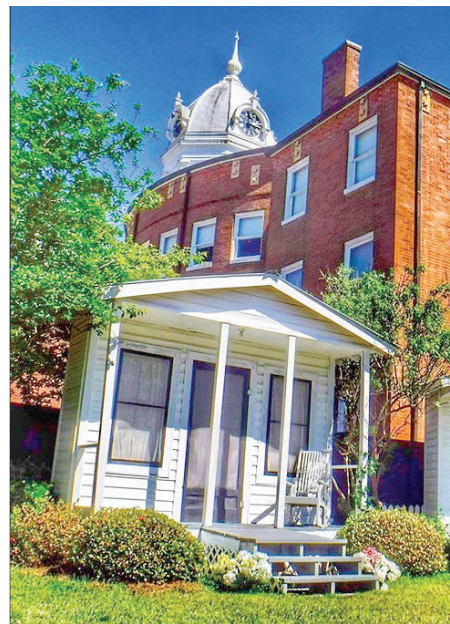
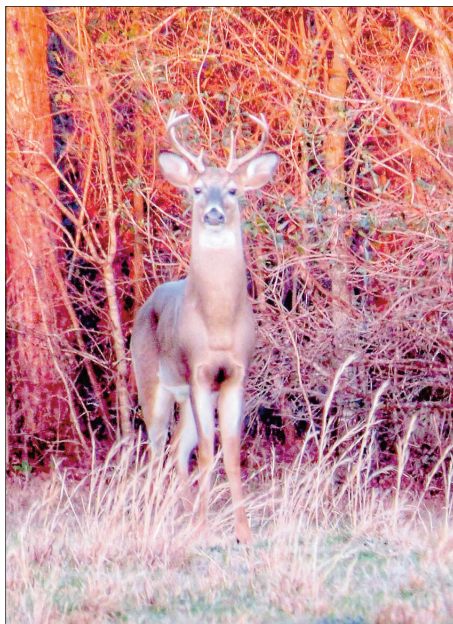


Government

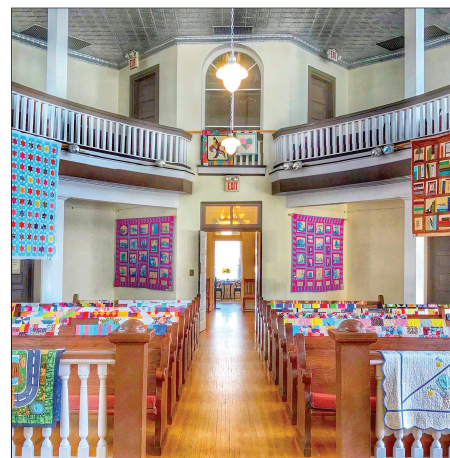

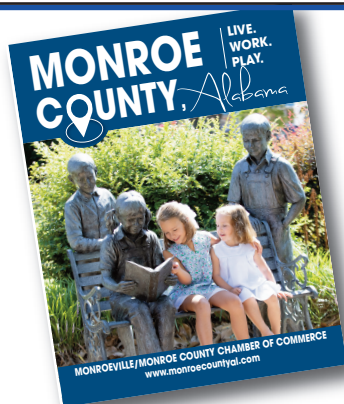
