CPC Children Learn About God's Provision & Care by Lynn Norfleet

On Sunday mornings during CPC's 9:00am worship service, children from age 2 through third grade fill every downstairs classroom, learning from God's Word and singing and playing together. This past year, they have been learning about God's care for his people as he rescued them from slavery in Egypt and wandered in the desert. This month, they will begin a new series about Joshua, the promised land, and God's provision for his followers who struggled in the midst of trials and sin.

Sunday School groups include: Kindling (2 years to Pre-K); Spark (Pre-K-1st grade); and Ignite (2nd-3rd grade.) "Our leaders: Beth Perry, Lisa Shirley and myself; and adult shepherds nurture children through age-appropriate lessons and small group discussions," said Children's Ministry Coordinator Melissa Tarantino. "We also offer nursery care upstairs for infants and toddlers, led by Sheriden Newlin."

During the 10:30am worship service, children ages 4-3rd grade are dismissed before the sermon and led downstairs for a "mini church service" designed just for them called KidsChurch. The service, led by Lisa Shirley, includes a call to worship, time for prayer and praise, and a lesson that covers important questions of faith. In the fall and spring, the ministry also offers KidsClub, a Sunday evening program led by Ellie Schertz that features fun games and fellowship at the same time many Lifeline groups meet at the church.

Now, the ministry is gearing up for Vacation Bible School (VBS), which will be June 3-7. This year's theme is "Get in the Game," and in addition to lots of games, there will be an obstacle course, escape room, crafts, Bible stories, music, and more.
