With that in mind, several years ago, a group of individuals who found themselves single in the middle stages of life began meeting for lunches and discussion at CPC.

The group has grown, and now, Single Vision regularly includes around 30 people who meet for a social outing every second Saturday, and for lunch and conversation every fourth Sunday at The Commons. This year, they are discussing a devotional book titled *Hope: Living Confidently in God*. They also meet regularly for impromptu events and service projects.

"Being single and trying to interact socially with married people can be intimidating," explained Dierk Copeland. "When I feel isolated, it's easy for me to pull back and not want to be involved. Single Vision offers a chance to spend time with people that are all wrestling with similar thoughts and emotions around singleness and how God is using that for his plan and our good."

New CPC Offices

CPC staff received a very special Christmas gift with the completion of new office space at The Commons in December. Having outgrown the prior office in the Lighthouse, and working from both locations for the past couple of years, pastors, ministry leaders and service staff are now working together again throughout the week.

The new, two-story office features two meeting rooms and dedicated space for the printer and supplies, along with a coffee/meal prep room for the office and events in the adjoining banquet room.

"As we continue to grow the ministry impact and outreach of The Commons, it is such a blessing to have our staff be a part of the weekly activity here," said Pastor Hugh Barlett. "We are so incredibly thankful for the team of professionals and volunteers coordinated by Elder Kent Whitaker that made this vision a reality." In February, an open house will allow everyone to see the new space.

"The purpose of Single Vision is to create a community for adults who find themselves single for any number of reasons," added Rick Miller.

"Participants regularly comment on how much they appreciate the sense of understanding they feel within our group. I am humbled to see God ministering to us through each other."
