British Values



The fundamental British values are:

Democracy

We support children's personal, social and emotional development by giving them opportunities to develop their self-confidence and self-awareness, to make choices and decisions about what they want to explore and how they're going to use the resources we've made accessible to them.

Rule of law

We help children learn to manage their own feelings and behaviour; about learning right from wrong; about behaving within agreed and clearly defined boundaries and about dealing with the consequences. Understanding emotions as a topic is a contributing factor.

Individual liberty

We focus on children's self-confidence and self-awareness and people and communities. We help children to develop a positive sense of themselves. We provide opportunities to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and increase their confidence in their own abilities.

Mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs.

We help children learn to treat others as we want to be treated. How to be part of a community, manage our feeling and behaviour, and to form relationships with others. We believe in inclusivity and acceptance in our settings, where views, faiths, cultures and races are valued and where we encourage children to engage with their wider community. This includes our SEND families too.
