WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY,

ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and 2023 Whidbey Equestrian Center USEF Event ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or
 dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions
 (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also
 exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan *USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

GREATAMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP USDF REGIONAL Dressage CHAMPIONSHIPS

Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2023 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

 Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules).

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. (reference: https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/CoGGskaV6AA/membership-statement)

USEF MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT (GR1301.7 & 1301.8)

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF POLICY ON SHARPS DISPOSAL (GR1210.4)

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or his designee and/or the Hearing Committee.

For the competition, Sharps containers are located at the ends of each barn aisle, in the show office and at the ends of the portable stabling areas.

- Office hours during the show days are as follows: Office opens one hour prior to the first ride of the day and closes one hour after the last ride.

TESTS: This show will use the current USDF and FEI tests.

- US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds, and includes the arrival day BEFORE the show begins. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.
- ATTENTION COMPETITORS It is the responsibility of all riders to know the rules applying to showing in the Dressage Discipline. THE RULES MAY HAVE CHANGED FROM THE CURRENT RULE BOOK. IT IS THE COMPETITORS' RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK THE CURRENT US EQUESTRIAN RULE BOOK FOR ANY CHANGES. The listed rules are only general and are subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Directors of USEF. Current rules can be found on www.usef.org
- **Covid-19**: For 2023 the Wa State rules apply. Covid-19 (Coronavirus) awareness and personal health self-monitoring is essential to the well being for all participants. For Wa State please see https://www.coronavirus.wa.gov/ for Covid information and current state requirements.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES including Golf Cars/Mopeds Etc.:

Operators must be at least 16 year of age, with valid driver's license to operate any motorized vehicle. See GR1301.7 and GR1301.8.

2023 USEF SHOW PASS: Riders and Owners are now only eligible for one (1) Show Pass (or non member fee) per competition year. This fee must be purchased online from USEF. The Show Pass is only good for one competition. Trainers and Coaches are no longer eligible to be non-members or use a Show Pass. Trainers and Coaches must be members and this includes parents that sign as trainers and coaches.

ACCOMMODATIONS, LODGING & CAMPING, PARKING:

- Competitor parking is at the stabling area as designated.
- FIRE LANES WILL BE MARKED KEEP THE FIRE LANES AND BATHROOM CLEAR FOR ACCESS!
- LIMITED parking is available at the Show Office is reserved for farrier, veterinarian, show staff and/or persons who need assistance.
- Parking for campers and motor homes is available. No showers, utility, or electrical hookups available. Toilets are available. There are NO fees for camping during the show.
- Portable, self-contained, QUIET generators may be used in the parking area. Generators should be off from 10 p.m. to 4:30 a.m.
- No generators in the barns, stalls or tack stalls.
- NO wood, briquette, open or pit fires allowed at any show. Unless otherwise posted, gas barbecue permitted.
- A variety of hotel/motel accommodations can be found at <u>www.coupevillelodging.com</u>. Please see visitor's linkat www.ridewec.com.

SHOW TIMES (& Ride times):

- Entry confirmation and tentative ride times will be e-mailed to the *Rider's email* address provided.
- Official and final ride times will posted on https://horseshowoffice.com/#/events.
- Official show times will be available at the show office on the day prior to show start and posted on the announcement board.
- It is the responsibility of the *rider* to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Ride times cannot be changed unless dire need is demonstrated and an equitable solution among all riders affected is available.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Announcements and ride time announcements will be posted at the show office and the concessions areas. Please check for announcements each morning.

ARENAS:

- All tests will be ridden in a standard size outdoor 20m x 60m arena. Warm-up will be in a 20m x 60m coveredarena or a 150 ft x 260 ft outdoor arena. Footing is either only sand, or Combination of Sand, Athletix Light Footing, and ProStride by Premier Equestrian
- Competition arenas are closed at **5 PM** the day PRIOR to the competition date. Unless otherwise posted, NO horses in, or around, any of the arenas after this time.
- Horses are not permitted in or around the competition arenas on any show day, except for the competitor's ridetime.
- No one (including trainer and coach) on foot is allowed in designated warm-up arenas.
- NO lunging in the indoor (covered) arena, outdoor warm up or competition arenas at any time for the
 duration of the competition INCLUDING from your time of arrival at the facility. Lunging shall be done in the
 designated areas only.
- Watering Arenas are watered as necessary by large equipment. Be aware that equipment moves around the facility at any time of the day.

STABLING & TACK STALLS:

- Stabling and tack stall rate as stated on fee schedule for this show.
- Stabling is done on a "first come first serve" basis". Stabling is allocated according to postmark/on-line entry completion for the two day and three day shows (exceptions: stabling for sequential shows -- example: the "ONE DAY" and "Summer" show, is prioritized by postmark in the following order: (1) competitors entering both shows for all three days, (2) entries for the "Summer" show only for both days, (3) entries for the "ONE DAY" show).
- Stabling is per horse, and is assigned for the duration of the competition. No subletting/sharing of stabling between horses.

- Facility and Stabling map is will be posted on reader board at facility entrance. Stabling map will show locations for stall assignment. Facility stabling will also be posted to media (facebook).
- Primary stabling will be in portable stalls (10x10) with full doors.
- For requests for permanent stall, please request on entry. Pending availability, permanent stalls have additional \$25 per day fee. Rider will be contacted before stall assignment.
- Tack Stalls are on a space available basis. Tack stalls will be assigned by post-marked after all stabling assignments have been fulfilled.
- Day stalls are on a space available basis. Only one horse is allowed per day stall. Day stall pricing per calendar day, per horse, as listed for each show. Entry must include date of arrival. Horses must be out of the day-stall by the end of that day's competition or 5 PM whichever is earlier.
- Please confirm/complete the emergency contact details on the stall cards provided on the stall door.
- Stallions must have stabling and be attended by and adult at all times.
- Horses shall not be tied to any fences or any place that would constitute a hazard.
- Bring your own wheel barrows, water buckets, and feed.

BEDDING:

- Initial stall bedding not provided.
- Bedding material is dried wood chips. Please do not bring straw as it does not compost-recycle!!
- Bedding is available by the bale from the Show Secretary at the price listed or the current market price.
 Indicateguantity of bales on entry form. Purchased bedding will be placed in your stall, unopened.
- Bedding requested by 3 PM to be delivered the evening of that day. Requests after 3 PM will have bedding delivered by 8 AM the following day.

Bicycles: No bicycles (of any kind) around at the arenas. Bicycles (and tricycles) to stay in parking area.

Competition Numbers (Bridle Numbers): must be worn at all times when a horse is out of the stall, being exercised or being ridden.

FACILITY DAMAGES:

- 1. No stall construction changes, marking or painting allowed.
- 2. All riders, owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage caused by them, their agents, theirhorses, or their employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly.
- 3. Damage to stalls (example excessive kicking resulting in breakage) will incur a \$250 damage fee to be applied for repair expenses. Expenses above this will be billed to the rider (if over 18 years age, otherwise the billed to the horse owner or rider's parent).

HAUL-INS (a.k.a. Jump Outs, or non-stabled horse): All horses must have stabling. No haul-in or working from trailer only.

NON-COMPETING HORSES (including Schooling Horses and Companion Horses):

Schooling-only entries are subject to the same rules as competing horses with additional restrictions on the times and general use of any facility amenities.

- 1. Any participant's horse(s) not competing, but on the show grounds, must: (1) complete an entry signed by rider, parent, owner/lessee, coach and trainer; (2) pickup and wear an Exhibitor's number; (3) Pay applicable office fee and non-competing horse fee and (4) pay stabling/haul-in fees.
- 2. Non-competing horse (including schooling horse and companion horse) will be accepted on a space-available basis.

Dogs - Please leave your dogs at home!

- Dog(s) are to be at your stabled area. NO dogs in seating areas, or around the concession stand, any of the barns or at the WEC Office or Lounge area!!
- Dogs (GR1301.6) are not permitted to be loose and must be leashed. We request leashes not bemore than six (6) foot long and be non-retractable.
- Dogs shall not be tied to any fences or any place that would constitute a hazard.
- If your dog becomes a hazard to any person or other animal at the facility YOU (the dog owner) are responsible for any/all damages. YOU will be requested to leave the competition without refund.

AWARDS and Prizes:

- For Classes with sufficient number of competitors, positional ribbons up to FIVE places.
- For a class with entries that multiple rider division, the classes will be awarded by rider division note in the Prizelist (AA, JrYr, and Open).
- If a Class is held with less than three (3) entries, no award(s) will be presented.
- Ribbons and awards will be determined and presented at the completion of each class.

Facility Rules:

- Please DO keep entrance gate closed and latched at night (9 p.m. to 8 a.m.).
- All children under the age of 13 must be chaperoned by an adult at all times.
- Keep out of hay-lofts in ALL barns.
- Barn wash racks for WEC boarding residents only.
- Barn Cats Please leave barn cats alone.
- No climbing, sitting, or using rockeries or planters as mounting blocks.
- Photography only from seating area. No photography from the A entrance of the Rings or around/behind the judges boxes. No photographywhen calling/reading tests. No overhead/drones allowed.
- NO SMOKING on the show grounds, barns, arena or stabling areas. Smoking is allowed in the Main Barn office.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- (a) The title page of the prize list publishes the OPENING and RECEIVED BY (CLOSING) DATE.
- (b) A COPY OF ALL APPROPRIATE USEF & USDF MEMBERSHIP CARDS, (OWNER, AGENT, LEESE, RIDER, TRAINER, & COACH) HORSE REGISTRATIONS AND REQUIRED PREREQUISITE TEST(S) MUST ACCOMPANY EVERY ENTRY. The horse, owner and rider information must be identical on all submitted USEF and USDF membership cards AND Horse registrations/HID information on the entry form. Horses must be entered in qualifying classes under their official recorded names and ownership, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules prior to the competition.
- (c) A complete entry form is required for each horse/rider combination for each show (only <u>one</u> horse-rider combination per entry form). Each WEC show requires a separate entry form.
- (d) Complete entry definition: To avoid Incomplete Entry fee, each entry must be filled out in its entirety, and signed by rider, owner, and trainer (even if same person), and coach (if applicable). Copies of all current rider/owner/trainer/coach USEF/USDF membership cards and Horse ID number (or registration) MUST accompany EACH entry. Emergency contact information must be completed. Safe Sport must be completed and not expiring during competition.
- (e) The entry form, and the signature pages are valid for only one show and SHALL NOT is used for multiple show entries.
- (f) All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. If the show is over-subscribed, show management shall determine IF complete entries will be place on wait list.
- (g) Entry form must have <u>rider's</u> email address clearly and legibly printed to receive the ride-time schedule and/or entry confirmation.
- (h) If the test number and/or description is not indicated on the entry, test will be assigned the highest test for the

class.

- (i) Riders must clearly specify division choice. When rider's not designation is made, riders will be automatically entered as OPEN. Riders may only enter one division per class.
- (j) NO phone or email entries will be accepted.
- (k) No Minor's entry will be accepted without signatures by a parent or guardian. The signature of an instructor, coach, trainer, agent or other unrelated persons will NOT be accepted.
- (I) If after the Received By (closing date), any change to an entry (horse, rider, trainer/handler) will require a completely new entry form and a change fee.
- (m) Post entries (at show) will be taken as scheduling/space permits, or in the case of scratches or cancellations. Post entries accepted if rides are available. Written requests for post entry must be done by 3:00 p.m. the day before the test. See Fee Schedule.
- (n) An entry received after the RECEIVED BY (CLOSING) DATE is a Late Entry.

 Late entries: Entries postmarked after closing date will be accepted on the basis of stabling availability but will becharged a late fee. This fee is in lieu of the post-entry fee.
- (o) A horse/rider combination may enter each Test of Choice class only once. Any change in test choice level after the class is scheduled be considered as a Test Level Change.
- (p) **Dropped off entries** (at facility office) shall be coordinated with the show manager and be *initialed and dated* by the show manager. The show manager's date shall act as the post-mark. *Note:* No entries shall be "dropped-off" at the facility residence.
- (q) On-line entries: Online show entries through Horse Show Office are required. Payment can be made via credit card or check. Payment may also be mailed to Whidbey Equestrian Center. Include printed entry from Horse Show Office with check. There are no processing fees for submitting payment online. All signature pages must be printed, signed, scanned, and uploaded to each online entry.
- (r) Faxed Entries:
 - a. Faxed entries include an additional fee per entry, in addition to the office fees
 - b. All faxed entries must include credit card detail on the entry form.
 - c. Entries using a credit card shall have a convenience fee of 4%. Convenience fee shall only be charged once for the show entry. Receipt for convenience fee to be provided when charged.
 - d. Electronic Entries with unpaid fees will be considered the same as a RETURNED CHECK.
- (s) **Payments:** (1) All entry forms must be accompanied with full payment (US Funds only). If requesting tack stall, please put on separate check; (2) Bridle number will not be issued until all entry, late fee, membership fees, or incomplete are paid; (3) All check and/or credit cards will be processed on the stated closing date of the show, and upon receipt thereafter.
- (t) **Incomplete Entry:** Each entry submitted and received without ALL required information, legible documentation copies or signatures will be considered to be an incomplete entry and shall pay an incomplete-entry fee. Incorrect or incomplete entries maybe returned at rider's expense.

REFUNDS: All entries are accepted with the following understanding:

- (a) After the Show Closing Date, no refunds for any reason.
- (b) Refund request before to closing date:
 - a. \$40 cancellation fee for cancellations or withdrawals, and
 - b. Only Stabling, drug fees, tack stall and bedding will be refunded, and
 - c. Refund request shall be submitted in writing (not by email) and postmarked prior to the show closing date.
- (c) No refunds if show (or any part of the show) is postponed or cancelled due to Act of God.
- (d) No transfer of fees for entries, stabling, or bedding from show to show, or exhibitor to exhibitor.
- (e) No refunds will be made if the entry is a no-show.

RETURNED CHECKS / DECLINED CREDIT CARD: Checks returned by a bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedures.

- \$50.00 will be assessed for each returned check or any check with a stop payment.
- \$50.00 will be assessed for declined credit cards.
- Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full or they will be turned into USEF for further disciplinary

action.

• Accounts left unpaid – rider, owner or horse will not be allowed to compete in WEC event until past account(s) are paid in full.

CHECK-IN (& No-Shows):

- Exhibitor number will not be released until show fees are paid.
- All exhibitors or representatives must check in with the Show Office and pick up their exhibitor number at least 60 minutes PRIOR to their FIRST class for the show.
- Exhibitors that have not checked in with the Show Office and received their show number, will be
 considered a NO-SHOW and be scratched for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. All "No
 Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and
 time slots may be filled.
- No Refund for No-Show entry.

MANAGEMENT RIGHTS:

- Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.
- Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind.
- All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by Show Management and the Show Management's decision shall be final.
- The Show Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes for award purposes when
 less than three horses are entered. Show Management also reserves the right to change the order of the
 classes as they are listed in the prize list, including change rings or rotate, add or vary officials and
 changing a class to a different day. Competitors in changed classes will be notified.
- Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualifyany exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without beingliable for damage or compensation.
- Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

EXHIBITOR / COMPETITOR RESPONSIBILITY:

- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify the accuracy of test scores. Any scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary and/or assistant within one hour of the last ridden test for that class. Failure to report any errors within allowed time will mean the error will not be corrected and there will be no change in class placing.
- It is the rider/owner/member responsibility to make sure of their membership status is correct. WEC is not responsible for refunding membership fees that have been submitted to USDF or USEF.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to indicate to the Show Management if they are NOT eligible to compete under the judge listed on the show ride time schedule. If the judge has been added/changed, show management will make every effort to make adjustments to schedules as long as we are notified 72 hours BEFORE the first show ride.
- Exhibitors are responsible for presenting themselves to the ring at their designated time and accept the fullresponsibility for doing so.
- Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the correct show time and their scheduled performance time regardless of announcements or ring stewards. No protest will be upheld, nor ride time changed due to failure of the exhibitor to meeting their responsibilities.
- The rules may have changed from the current USEF Rule Book. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current USEF Rule Book for any changes. Current rules can be found on www.usef.org.

Headgear Rule: (DR120.1) Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag.

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration. See DR136 for dress code rules for exhibitions.

Opportunity Classes - No Cross Entry allowed.

- Opportunity classes are intended for entry level riders.
- Horses and riders entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership
 requirements, and do not have to pay non-member (show pass) or HID fees or USEF drug fee. In addition
 owners, trainers & coaches are exempt from membership requirements IF ONLY in opportunity classes.
- While membership requirements are waived for riders in "opportunity" classes all USEF Dressage Division rules apply (including dress & saddlery requirements) in addition to all applicable General Rules & Medications.
- Opportunity class riders may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.
 Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider
 chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in
 DR120.1.6. Scores earned in Dressage Opportunity classes may not be used towards USEF or USDF
 awards or programs. See USEF GR821 for complete rules.
- Riders and/or horses entered in "opportunity" classes MAY cross enter into other recognized classes at the show, however the above exemptions apply only to the Opportunity Classes.

Horse - Classes per Day and Class Levels (DR119)

- Horses under 36 months of age may not compete in any dressage under-saddle class. Proof of horse's ageis required for all 3-year olds.
- No horse may be ridden more than once in any Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class).
- Horses may only show in two consecutive levels (freestyles included), even with more than one rider.
- Horse are limited to a maximum of three (3) Dressage tests per day through Fourth Level; two (2) tests
 Dressage per day above fourth level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their
 equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day.
- Dressage Seat Equitation and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximumlimit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Adult Amateurs: Only active Federation members may obtain amateur status. Every person who has reachedhis/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur status issued by the Federation. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur status. Adult Amateur entries must enclose a copy of their current USEF membership card.

Open Classes: Open classes are open to anyone eligible to compete, including professionals.

JR/YR - Open to Juniors and Young Riders only; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Only riders ages 14-18 may ride FEI JR Tests. Only riders age 16-21 may ride FEIYR Tests. Only riders ages 12-16 may ride FEI Pony Tests. Must include birth date on entry form. Specify as Jr or YR, but not both.

Candidates for FEI Championships (NAYC) are responsible for knowing and complying with the North

American Youth Championship Qualifying Criteria and Selection Procedures and all FEI and USEF rules regarding participation in qualifying competitions for this championship.

- **COACH (and Coaching):** A coach is defined as "any adult or adults who receive remuneration for having or sharing the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider, driver, handler or vaulter in equestrian skills."
- Coaching must be done from OUTSIDE of the arena, and in such a way as not to impact the otherriders.
- NO LOUD/AUDIBLE COACHING IN THE DESIGNATED WARM-UP AREAS.
- NO COACHING BETWEEN THE END OF THE COVERED ARENA AND RING ONE, OR BETWEENRING 3
 AND RING 2.
- **TRAINER (defined):** A trainer is the person who has responsibility for the horse on the competition grounds andmust sign the entry form. Lessons and/or clinics ARE NOT to be conducted on the show grounds during thecompetition. Lessons and clinics are beyond the scope of "coaching".

FOOD & CONCESSIONS for 2023: Concession will be available, with times posted.

FEI Pony / Pony Measurement: If ponies are entered in FEI Pony Test(s) and in need of a USEF measurementcard, an appointment for measuring MUST be made with show management *prior to the show.* Owners must notify show management of any ponies needing measurement so a time can be arranged for this service. Management will pro-rate the fee charged by the veterinarian among the pony owners. This fee will be the actual charge by the veterinarian and due upon vet visit. Owner will pay veterinarian directly for this service.

freestyle Information - see pg 20

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying Management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

GAIG/USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES (membership/registration requirements)

- Riders and owners must have an active USEF Membership. Riders are required to have a USDF Participating Membership; Owners may have a USDF Participating or Business Membership. Group membership is not sufficient.
- Horses must be Annual or Lifetime Recorded with USEF and USDF Lifetime Registered, an HID is not sufficient.
- Great American qualifying entries must include a copy of the horse USEF and USDF registration, and all rider's and owner's USEF and USDF card(s).
- To compete in a qualifying class for GAIG/USDF Regional Dressage Championships, declare the
 qualifying ride on entry form. Please indicate that the class is to count for qualifying by placing a Q after
 the class number. Qualifying will not require a separate ride in the class. Fee is class fee plus Q-fee and
 must be paid prior to start of the class.

HORSE RECORDING NUMBERS:

- Except for horses entered ONLY in Opportunity or Introductory classes, every horse entered in this show
 must have an USDF and/or USEF identification number. Horses without a USDF HID number must
 include the USDF fee with their entry. If you are riding Qualifying classes these must be USDF Lifetime
 numbers and a USEF annual or lifetime numbers.
- If NOT riding qualifying classes, the number may be a USDF HID & USEF HID. If you have used an
 annualUSEF number in the past, this will suffice for USEF, but you must have at least a USDF HID
 number.
- Horse owner and/or Leasing names must be correctly recorded and verifiable with USDF and USEF.
- Proof of USDF and/or USEF Membership: The proof of membership numbers must be in the form of either their actual membership/registration cards or a facsimile of them. Proof of membership must be included with entry form. Please provide the USEF/USDF Master Verification (www. eqverification.org) although membership cards or photocopies of cards are still acceptable. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership be an incomplete entry and possibly have non-member fees. Members that are unable to produce the USDF memberships cards/registrations or a facsimile will be asked to sign an affidavit and pay the applicable affidavit fee. Also see membership requirement for Opportunity Classes.
- Special Non-Membership Notice: Non-members may apply for USEF & USDF membership at the show office, prior to commencing exhibition classes. Payment of the required fees and completion of a special membership application form makes this possible for points to count. HOWEVER, horse recordings are not changed and not effective until the forms and fees are received in Lexington KY. Riders or owners may applyfor horse recordings at the show office. For points to count, application must be made on first day of show. Ifafter first day, points count ONLY after recording received at show office.
- Horse Medication Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware ofthe US EQUESTRIAN rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Ave, Columbus, Ohio 46212 Phone: (800) 633-2472
- VACCINATIONS/HEALTH CERTIFICATES: See GR844 for details. Exhibitors are reminded of USEF's vaccination policy, applicable to horses more than 7 months of age. All horses must have proof of Equine Influenza and Equine HerpesVaccinations (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months of show date. Health certificate and documents must list the same horse name and description as is listed on the entry blank and on the USEF horse identification or recordingdocuments (GR906). Bring the appropriate, completed, and signed document(s) with you to the competition. Competition Management reserves the right to review vaccination documentation. Non-compliant entries may be quarantined or denied permission to unload, and will not be allowed to compete nor to mingle withother horses. No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the Vaccination Record is missing or incomplete. Whether the horse is vaccinated by a veterinarian, or by an owner or agent, or is exempt for medical reasons, documentation is required. For your convenience a downloadable form is available at: www.usef.org. Search 'Equine Vaccination Record'.
- Health Papers/Coggins: WEC does not require health papers/Coggins to be submitted with your entry. However, Riders should be aware that current Interstate Health Papers are required to be in your vehicle when attending shows not within their home state. Some states also require health papers when transporting between facilities within the same state. The State of Washington requires current (6 month) health certificate from the State of origin, identification papers on the horse and Coggins test. The Washington State Department of Agriculture at (360) 902-1878 has the most recent information.
- **FEI Para Equestrian Classes:** Para Equestrian riders must have current International (FEI) or National (USEF) Dispensation Certificate indicating classification status. Riders, horses and owners are no longer exempt USDF membership requirements. All tests for para equestrians are ridden in a standard (20m x 60m) arena, except Grade I- III freestyles are ridden in a shortened (20m x 40m) arena. For more info see https://inside.fei.org/ or USEF.org.

SAFE SPORT and Training Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

(GR1303) The Federation Safe Sport Policy defines a "Federation Participant" as any Federation member, or non-member, who participates in or attends a Federation Licensed Competition or sanctioned event. The Federation's Safe Sport Policy can be found at www.usef.org and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code can be found at www.safesport.org. Every Federation member and Federation Participant shall abide by the Federation's Safe Sport Policy and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, which can be found at www.safesport.org respectively. Beginning January 1, 2019, every Federation adult member (18 years of age and over) with a "Competing Membership" shall complete Federation-approved Safe Sport Training in accordance wFith the U.S. Center for SafeSport's Education & Training Policies.

Ensure ALL Safe Sport trainings are completed before submitting entry for the competition.

SCRATCHES: Prior to the ride time, riders are requested to complete a written scratch request at show office. Scratches at gate will be considered as a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots <u>may be</u> filled. No refunds for scratched entries or classes.

TIME CHANGE WITHIN A CLASS:

- Competitor can request a class change in writing and management reserves the right to accommodate individual class/schedule changes subject to availability.
- All class changes must be in writing and include contact information including cell phone. Entry changes by phone message will not be accepted.

WITHDRAWALS: USEF rules require that competitors must request permission of the show secretary prior to withdrawing or removing their horse from the show facility prior to the end of the show. (GR1305.1)

Warning: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.

Freestyle Prerequisite Requirements:

- Prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class, rider/horse combination must have achieved a minimum qualifying score (ref DR129.9).
- A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.
- It is the responsibility of the rider to have a standard-size, good quality CD submitted to the Show Secretary a check-in. Music should be in a non-proprietary format useable on a commercial CD player. Rider and Horse names must be on CD.
- Sound check will be published in the show office and/or ride times.
- Management will not be responsible for music left after the closing of the show.

DR 129.9: "Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Para Novice Test, Para Intermediate Test or Para Grand Prix Test) at the rider's classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level."

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
