RCW 4.24.530 and RCW 4.24.540 provide that an equine activity sponsor (i.e., an individual, group or club, partnership, or corporation, whether or not the sponsor is operating for profit or nonprofit, which sponsors, organizes, or provides the facilities for an equine activity) shall not be liable for an injury to or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity (i.e., Equine shows, fairs, competitions, performances, or parades that involve any or all breeds of equines and any of the equine disciplines), nor may he or she maintain an action against or recover from an equine activity sponsor for an injury to or the death while engaged in an equine activity. "Participant" means any person, whether amateur or professional, who directly engages in an equine activity (i.e., riding, training, driving, or being a passenger upon an equine, whether mounted or unmounted), whether or not a fee is paid to participate in the equine activity.

Release of Liability — Loss and injury. Whidbey Equestrian Center, leased facilities, members of the show committee, staff and their associates will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited or for any article of any kind that may be lost or destroyed in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be associated with any person whom so ever by any horses owned by, exhibited by, or handled by him and shall indemnify the afore mentioned individuals and organizations against all claims and demands of any kinds or nature that may grow out of and injury associated by any horses owned or exhibited by him or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. The owner, driver, handler, and rider, and any other agents or representatives acknowledge that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk, and that by participating they expressly assume any risks of injury and loss, and they agree to hold the competition and its officials, directors, employees, or agents. All horses exhibited will be at the owners/lessee's risk.

Schooling Show Rules

Covid	If you are sick, or have been sick in the last ten (10) days with Covid, please stay home. Social distancing is encouraged at these competitions. No more than three (3) people in office lounge.
Attire and Helmets:	Use appropriate attire for dressage. No shorts or soft shoes. Boots with one-inch heels must worn. All riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved equestrian safety helmet while mounted.
Entries:	ONE ENTRY PER HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION. USE SEPARATE ENTRY FOR <u>EACH SHOW</u> NO fax, email or phone entries. Participants must pay for all classes in full prior to the start of the show <i>Entries must include horse vaccination detail including Coggins</i> NOTE: We strongly recommend competitors have the completed USEF vaccination form completed for all competitions and/or travel.
Classes (TOC):	Classes may be combined or cancelled (manager's decision). Each class may be entered only once by a horse/rider combination. Test number/letter must be indicated on the entry, in the blank following the class number. If you do not indicate a test, we will put you in the highest test level for the class. Western or USEA classes – see website listed to make sure of test entered.
Horse:	Your horse may only have three (3) rides per day in this competition. Please do not enter your horse in more than three classes for this one-day show. If your horse is shared with another rider, there can only be <i>a total of three rides for the horse.</i> USEF rules are being followed regarding the ride levels and number of rides per day.
Ride Times:	First ride 9 a.m. as entries warrant. Ride times will be available by Thursday prior to show at www.ridewec.com
Tests:	Tests are the current USEF, USDF, WDAA and USEA tests. Shows conducted according to USDF and USEF rules. Safe Sport rules shall be adhered too.
Scored Tests & Music	Scored tests will be available when the class is complete. Results summary will be posted outside the show office. Unclaimed tests/ribbons or music will be held at show office for 14 days after show. If you cannot stay for results after your ride, please designate someone to pick them up. Unclaimed materials will not be mailed.
Awards:	Ribbons 1st thru 5th place. Ties to be broken by toss of the coin by show manager.
Arenas:	Competition arena is outdoors, full size (20m X 60m) Intro and USEA tests which are 20x40 (small) arena.
Parking:	Competitor and spectator parking by staling in field. No trailer parking by barns or arenas. Keep fire lanes open at all times. Contact the show manager for additional parking requests.
Facility Use:	No spectators or coaches in warm-up areas. Horses should not be tied to any fences or any place that would constitute a hazard. No haul-in horses in boarding resident barns. Stallions shall be stabled, and not be left unattended. Lunge in designated areas only. No lunging in the indoor arena. Barn wash racks for boarding residents only. No stall construction changes allowed. Any damage to stalls will incur a \$150 damage fee and be required to pay for repairs.

Stabling (Day Stalls):	Fee is \$listed per horse per day (8:00 am – 4:30 pm) All stabling is limited to space available. Limited Covered stabling available. Apr & May. Stabling includes haul in fee. If you are bringing a stallion, please contact show office.
Dogs:	<i>Dogs allowed in parking/stall area only. No dogs at competition arena, or in the barn areas. We do prefer your canine friend(s) safely stay at home.</i>
Haul In Fee:	Fee is \$ listed per horse per day. Horse must be attended to when at trailer. Park in designated parking area. NOTE: Stall IS required for stallions.
Familiarization Rides	For the schooling show competitors, the facility is available for a familiarization ride ONLY the day prior to the show, between noon and 4 pm. You MUST contact the show management and have turned in a release of liability form.
Refunds:	Prior to closing date, office fee is not refundable; and \$30 cancellation fee. 75% class entry if show is cancelled due to “Acts of God”. After show closing date (including scratch at show) – no refund.
Additional Overnight stabling:	\$50.00, <i>pre-arranged with management only.</i> NO stabling reservations prior to receipt of paid entry. Stabling is additional to Day Stall.
Schooling Horse (Non Competing Horse):	Schooling horse \$50. Schooling horse must complete show entry and pay haul-in or day stall fee and show fees.
Late Entry to show:	Entries received after the closing date will be accepted as time allows.
Post Entry to class:	Post entry is changed or added test after receipt of your show entry. Post entry is \$10.00 per test and is additional to class entry fee.
Decisions/ Disputes:	The judges’ decisions are final. If a judge or staff member decides that an animal is not fit to show, that decision will be final as well. Any disputes or problems during the show should be brought to the attention of the show manager at the show office.
Changes:	Change of Rider/Horse combination after the entry is received. The change needs separate entry form with office fee, class fees and post entry fees.
Disqualification:	The following may be grounds for disqualification andexpulsion without refund: -- Unsportsmanlike conduct or behavior towardhorses, dogs, or humans. -- Unruly, dangerous, or uncontrollable horses. -- Mistreatment of any horse including use of severe bits or training devices. -- Exhibiting a horse that is exhausted, injured or lame -- Deliberate abuse or damage to WEC property.
Incomplete Entries:	Incomplete entries will be assessed a \$10.00 office fee.
NSF Checks or declined Credit Card:	Returned checks (NSF, stop payment) or declined credit card will have a \$50.00 assessment.
Cats:	For your awareness, each barn has barn cats. Please refrain from petting or attempting to handle.
Concessions	Coffee, tea and water available at show office. Otherwise, concession not available at schooling show.
