Points of Reflection for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time *February 8, 2026*

- Later in Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus speaks to his disciples about the last judgment, his words sound very much like Isaiah's do today. In both cases, we are told to share what we have with those in need. In fact, both Isaiah and Jesus specifically mention feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. However, Jesus adds another dimension. Jesus teaches us that when we do so, we're not just doing it for that person in need, we are doing it for him. He challenges us to see him in the person in need. In responding to their need, Isaiah tells us, our light will overcome the darkness. That light will also illuminate the face of Jesus in the person whose need we are satisfying.
- In the Gospel of John, Jesus tells his disciples that while he is in the world, he is the light of the world. In today's Gospel, Jesus calls his disciples the light of the world. We are called to be that light now. However, Jesus is actually still in the world. We incarnate Jesus when we act as he did, caring for those in need. Jesus is also present in that person in need, as he taught his disciples in the context of the last judgment. Finally, the Lord is present in the act of generosity itself. An act of charity reflects the gift of the Lord that we have received from God.
- In most cases, if we give something away, we no longer have that thing. Giving food or clothing or money means our pantry or closet or bank account has less. But there are exceptions. One is light. When we open a door or window shade to allow light to spread, the light doesn't get dimmer by its source. When we light someone else's candle with our own, our own candle remains just as bright. Putting a light in a bushel basket does not "conserve" the light. Putting it on a lampstand widens the lit area. Spreading light does not diminish its intensity or brightness at all. Another exception is love. Treating someone else with love does not exhaust our supply even one little bit; in fact, acts of love multiply the love within us and in the world, engendering more and greater acts of love. In spreading light and love, we participate in God's expansive plan for the world.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This Wednesday, February 11, is the optional memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. In addition, in 1992, Pope John Paul II designated February 11 as World Day of the Sick. To these ends, our parish will celebrate the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick within the morning Mass at 8:15.

Who is the Anointing of the sick for? Paragraph 1514 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) reads “the anointing of the sick ‘is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him (her) to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived”

Par. 1515 also reads “it is fitting to receive the anointing of the sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced.”

Who can receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?

- Baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason, i.e. 7 years old, and above
- Person in danger of death due to illness or old age
- Someone who will undergo serious surgery
- Those who are chronically ill

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Earlier this year the Diocese converted over to new accounting software. Unfortunately, the conversion did not go smoothly, and we were unable to receive any financial data as they worked through the issues. A few weeks ago, we received data through September. Construction work continued during that time.

A summary of the major milestones:

- Glu Lam beams have been erected & installed with the exception of those at the Narthex.
- Lower roofs have been sheathed with plywood and roof top AC curbs have been prepared in advance of TPO roofing.
- Electrical/Data Com/Fire Alarm/Security room:
 - ◇ HECO meter installed & inspected
 - ◇ Cabling from new transformer to meter completed
 - ◇ Awaiting HECO to power up to the meter
 - ◇ Initial coordination meeting with all service providers requiring rack/wall space
- High roof framing has commenced in preparation for plywood sheathing/roofing.
- Liturgical furnishings from Peru artisans received & stored.
- Altar, ambo, stations, crucifix, stained glass, mosaics for baptismal font
- Audio/Visual equipment ordered, received, and stored.
