



First Sunday of Lent

Gospel Reading: Matthew 4:1-11

Reflections for the Weekend of 21-22 February 2026

If we think the devil is a make-believe "boogie man," a comical cartoon villain who whispers into our left ear while angels whisper into our right, then the Gospel dispels this notion. The devil exists. He is crafty (he quotes Scripture to Jesus). He is persistent (he tries three times to get Jesus to bow to him). He can subtly lead us down seemingly harmless paths with small sins – the white lie here, the flash of anger there. He can also launch aggressive assaults when we are weak and vulnerable.

He tries this with Jesus, who was susceptible after 40 days of isolation, prayer, and fasting. Fully human, Jesus understands our weakness. He was born and baptized as we were born and baptized. He grew up, like all of us do. He learned a trade from Joseph, just as our parents have taught us important lessons. And like us, he is tested by Satan. But Jesus did not fall into temptation. That is the difference. Our Lord never strays from the Father's plan for Him, not with the devil in the desert and not with his crucifixion at Calvary.

This Lent, let us remain ever vigilant to the devil's attempts to draw us away from God. Let us explore different ways to pray, perhaps saying the rosary on our evening walk. In addition to observing Friday's abstention from meat, we can fast from criticizing others. And supporting the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal – almsgiving – is a powerful way to share our blessings with those in need.

This Sunday is our Commitment Sunday for Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal in the Diocese of Honolulu. May we respond wholeheartedly to this appeal in the context of our prayers, fasting, and almsgiving.

OCIA's Rite of Election

Today, Sunday, February 22, 2026, our diocese will celebrate the Rite of Election for our island at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa. Our parish will send our catechumen, Ronald Nomura, to the 1:00 p.m. celebration.

The Rite of Election is the second step in the OCIA process (first step is Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate; third step is the celebration of the sacraments of initiation). In the Rite of Election, the "Church makes her 'Election' or the choice and admission of catechumens, who by their dispositions are fit to take part in the next celebration of Sacraments of Initiation... it is called 'Election' because the admission made by the Church is founded on election by God, in whose name the Church acts; it is also called 'Enrollment of Names' because the catechumens write their names in the Book of the Elect as a pledge of their faithfulness" (OCIA Par. 119).

DIOCESE OF HONOLULU 2026 LENTEN REGULATIONS!!

FASTING

- In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both
- Ash Wednesday (Feb. 18) and Good Friday (April 3).
- To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on days of fasting.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

- Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- To abstain means refraining from eating the flesh, marrow and blood products of beef, veal, pork or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

EASTER DUTY

- All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent and the Easter Season up to Trinity Sunday (May 31).

LENTEN PRACTICES

- The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink, and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls this year on Feb. 18. Ashes are to be blessed as a sign of our entry into a season of conversion, repentance, and reconciliation. Ashes are to be blessed by a bishop, priest or deacon. Others may be associated with the clergy in the distribution of ashes.
- Funeral Masses may not be celebrated on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday, nor on the Sundays of Lent. When pastoral reasons require that a funeral be celebrated on these days, only a Funeral Outside of Mass may be held. To afford the faithful opportunities to participate in Lenten prayer services, pastors are encouraged to have such prayer services at least twice a week, including the Way of the Cross on Fridays, Exposition and Benediction, Evening Prayer and evening Masses. A homily or instruction should be included.

BLESSING OF THE OILS AND CONSECRATION OF THE CHRISM

- In order to allow participation of Catholics throughout the islands, the sacred oils will be blessed during the Chrism Mass to be celebrated in several locations. All the faithful are encouraged to join in one of the following celebrations:
- Maui-Lanai: Tuesday, March 3, 7 p.m., St. Anthony Church, Wailuku
- Big Island: Tuesday, March 24, 5:30 p.m., St. Joseph Church, Hilo
- Kauai: Thursday, March 26, 6 p.m., Immaculate Conception Church, Lihue
- Oahu-Molokai: Tuesday, March 31, 7 p.m., Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa, Honolulu

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Earlier this year the Diocese converted over to new accounting software. Unfortunately, the conversion did not go smoothly, and we were unable to receive any financial data as they worked through the issues. A few weeks ago, we received data through September. Construction work continued during that time.

A summary of the major milestones:


- Glu Lam beams have been erected & installed with the exception of those at the Narthex.
- Lower roofs have been sheathed with plywood and roof top AC curbs have been prepared in advance of TPO roofing.
- Electrical/Data Com/Fire Alarm/Security room:
 - ◊ HECO meter installed & inspected
 - ◊ Cabling from new transformer to meter completed
 - ◊ Awaiting HECO to power up to the meter
 - ◊ Initial coordination meeting with all service providers requiring rack/wall space
- High roof framing has commenced in preparation for plywood sheathing/roofing.
- Liturgical furnishings from Peru artisans received & stored.
- Altar, ambo, stations, crucifix, stained glass, mosaics for baptismal font
- Audio/Visual equipment ordered, received, and stored.
