Fifth Sunday of Lent

Gospel Reading: John 11:1-45

Reflections for the Weekend of 21-22 March 2026

Time and time again, we see examples of Jesus working miracles that demonstrate his identity as the long-awaited Messiah. This powerful passage cements Jesus' divinity. Yet, at the same time, it confirms that Christ is also human. He loves Lazarus, Mary, and Martha. Jesus weeps for the loss of his friend and is deeply touched by the sorrow Mary and Martha feel at the death of their brother. He experiences these very human emotions because he is *fully* human.

But he is also fully divine. He brings Lazarus back, from the death to life, from the darkness of the sealed tomb to the bright light of his family home and sisterly love. Christ's deep love for this family reflects God's love for us. It is personal. God is always present and wants to be part of our lives.

Lazarus' rising from the dead foreshadows Christ's resurrection. Death has no power; Jesus will be with us always. When he is born, he is called "Emmanuel," or "God is with us." When he visits the apostles the last time before ascending into heaven, he reminds them that he will be with them always, "even to the end of time" (Matthew 28:20). In times of darkness, we can be emissaries of this very real, very personal, love that Our Lord has for us. By making a gift to the *Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal*, we can make his presence known to those who need it most.

Trust and faith seem like absolutes, but many times they are not. The adage "trust but verify" indicates that we like to hedge bets. We say we trust others, but we're going to check up on them just to be sure! Like poor doubting Thomas, who has to see the risen Lord, even place his fingers in Jesus' wounds, before he accepts that Jesus had triumphed over death.

How very different these examples of trust are from the faith Martha exhibits. When Jesus first arrives, Martha calls him "Lord," indicating that she believes he is the Promised One. She then states that her brother would still be alive if Jesus had come earlier. She trusts in his healing powers. Finally, when Jesus asks her if she believes that he is "the resurrection and the life," she responds, "I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." She believes, despite the deep sorrow she feels at her brother's passing, that all will be well. Jesus is now with them.

This Lent, we can help dispel the darkness so many people, like Martha and Mary, feel. Through a faith that calls us to action, we can bring the life and light of Christ to others by supporting the programs and initiatives of the *Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal*. Our gifts can fortify their faith.

SPRING CLEANING THROUGH THE INITIATION SACRAMENTS

Spring is here! What does the Spring mean to you? For some, it's spring cleaning at home, planting time, flowers blooming, getting out in the sun especially for those who live in cold places, fresh look at home or in the yard, new life as trees or plants from the dead winter will have buds coming out.

How can we relate spring cleaning to our initiation sacraments?

- **Baptism.** Baptism washes us of the stain of original sin we inherited from our first parents. We become a new creation in Christ. Par. 1265 of the Catechism states "baptism not only purifies from all sins, but also makes the neophyte 'a new creature,' an adopted son of God who has become a 'partaker of the divine nature', member of Christ and co-heir with him and a temple of the Holy Spirit".

Baptism is offered for infants to adults. Do you have anyone in your family who needs the Sacrament of Baptism? Other than your family members, do you know of anyone who needs it? Would you invite them to come to the Lord? We have a mandate from Him to "go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit ..." (Mt 28:19) The next baptism for children under seven years old is on April 18, 2026. Please call the parish office at 808-689-8681 Ext. 107 for baptism of those over seven years of age or for baptism packets for infant.

- **Confirmation.** Paragraph 1285 of our Catechism states that "Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of initiation" whose unity must be safeguarded. It must be explained to the faithful that the reception of the **sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace.** For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence, they are true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.

Were you baptized in the Catholic Church, has received your First Holy Communion but not the Sacrament of Confirmation? Our sacrament records show that many stopped their initiation sacraments at First Communion (or baptism for that matter). Read the phrase in bold letters above. If you're missing Confirmation, your baptismal grace is not complete which might prevent you from having and living the gifts of the Holy Spirit: knowledge, understanding, wisdom, courage, piety, counsel, and fear of the Lord,(CCC # 1831) thereby not manifesting the fruits of the Holy Spirit: "charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control and chastity" (CCC #1832).

- **Eucharist.** Par. 1322 of CCC states that "the holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation. Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation, participate with the whole community in the Lord's own sacrifice by means of the Eucharist." And we participate in the Eucharist by coming to Mass!

Our weekly attendance at Mass is on the rise and we are on our way to reaching our pre-covid figures. Let us spread the word about our Sunday schedule. Invite people to Mass. Feed our soul and somebody else's. We eat three meals a day with possibly snacks in-between so let us feed our souls at least once a week. The Lord Jesus and His Church are counting on all of us to continue building His Church physically and spiritually.

Do we have to come to Mass? Yes! Consider:

- It's a commandment given to Moses by God: Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day. For us Christians, the Sabbath was changed to "the Lord's Day" because the Lord rose from the dead on the third day.
- At the Last Supper of the Lord, he instructed his disciples to "do this in memory of me" (Lk 22:19). Read Luke Chapter 22 verses 14 to 20.
- To hear the Word of God proclaimed at the Liturgy of the Word. You may read the Scriptures at home, but you will miss the homily wherein the priests or deacons explain the reading and guide us how to live our Christian lives. You will also miss the community praying together.
- The Body of Christ is not complete without you. You are part of the whole.

Did you know that our venial sins are forgiven at Mass? That's spring cleaning our soul and spiritual life.

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Earlier this year the Diocese converted over to new accounting software. Unfortunately, the conversion did not go smoothly, and we were unable to receive any financial data as they worked through the issues. A few weeks ago, we received data through September. Construction work continued during that time.

A summary of the major milestones:

- Glu Lam beams have been erected & installed with the exception of those at the Narthex.
- Lower roofs have been sheathed with plywood and roof top AC curbs have been prepared in advance of TPO roofing.
- Electrical/Data Com/Fire Alarm/Security room:
 - ◊ HECO meter installed & inspected
 - ◊ Cabling from new transformer to meter completed
 - ◊ Awaiting HECO to power up to the meter
 - ◊ Initial coordination meeting with all service providers requiring rack/wall space
- High roof framing has commenced in preparation for plywood sheathing/roofing.
- Liturgical furnishings from Peru artisans received & stored.
- Altar, ambo, stations, crucifix, stained glass, mosaics for baptismal font
- Audio/Visual equipment ordered, received, and stored.
