



Gospel Reading: Mt 27:11-54

Reflections for the Weekend of 28-29 March 2026

God so loves us that He sends His Son to die for us. God so wants to have a personal relationship with us, that He shares Jesus with us. When we experience pain and suffering, though, we wonder how this can be God's plan for us. Where is God in illness, violence, betrayal, economic hardship, natural disaster, and cruelty? Why does God, who desires intimacy with us, seem so far away? And where is the Father?

We may feel like God is far away, but He isn't. God reminds us: "When you call me, and come and pray to me, I will listen to you" (Jeremiah 29:12). Relying on God during difficult times draws us closer to Him. And if, during times of trial, we open ourselves up to God, we can be instruments of His love and grace, just as Christ was to those witnessing his passion.

As we enter this holiest time of the liturgical year, please consider ways you can pick up the cross and follow Jesus into greater intimacy with God. Please pray for the continued success of the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal, and please consider supporting the appeal to help lighten the crosses others are bearing.

Thankfully, we do not subscribe to the view that God is an angry, wrathful, vengeful God. In the oft quoted verse from 1 Corinthians, "love is patient, love is kind" (13:4), St. Paul reminds us what it truly means to love. He is showing us the face of God. To love like God is to love truth, to bear what life throws at us with quiet dignity, to return rudeness with good manners, to seek what is best for others, to forgive.

If we need a reminder that Our Father is merciful, we need only look at today's Gospel. It is apparent that God is not a vengeful God. He doesn't seek heavenly retribution on His Son's many afflictors. Pilate lives to see another day. The soldiers who crown Jesus with thorns, scourge him, spit on him, slap him, mock him, cast lots for his clothes and nail him to a cross are not struck down. The high priests who betray Christ out of fear and jealousy are not punished.

He is not absent but rather very, very present. Upon Christ's death, the veil of the sanctuary is torn in two, the earth shakes, stones are split, the saints who had fallen asleep rise from the dead. The Old Covenant is giving way to a New Covenant, whose foundation is love and mercy. When we extend God's love to those in need, such as making a gift to the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal, we are living this New Covenant. 

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Earlier this year the Diocese converted over to new accounting software. Unfortunately, the conversion did not go smoothly, and we were unable to receive any financial data as they worked through the issues. A few weeks ago, we received data through September. Construction work continued during that time.

A summary of the major milestones:

- Glu Lam beams have been erected & installed with the exception of those at the Narthex.
- Lower roofs have been sheathed with plywood and roof top AC curbs have been prepared in advance of TPO roofing.
- Electrical/Data Com/Fire Alarm/Security room:
 - ◊ HECO meter installed & inspected
 - ◊ Cabling from new transformer to meter completed
 - ◊ Awaiting HECO to power up to the meter
 - ◊ Initial coordination meeting with all service providers requiring rack/wall space
- High roof framing has commenced in preparation for plywood sheathing/roofing.
- Liturgical furnishings from Peru artisans received & stored.
- Altar, ambo, stations, crucifix, stained glass, mosaics for baptismal font
- Audio/Visual equipment ordered, received, and stored.
