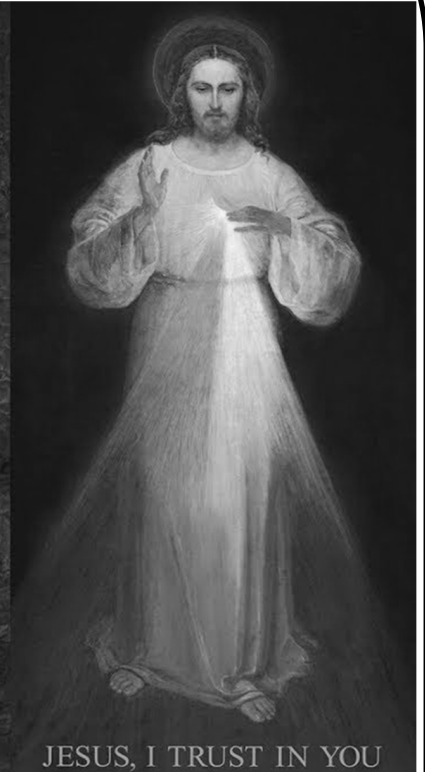
Parish Mission Statement

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body & the Blood, Soul & Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

When you feel overwhelmed by guilt, fear, or suffering, the Divine Mercy Chaplet becomes a prayer of surrender. It reminds us that no sin is greater than God's mercy, and no darkness stronger than Christ's redeeming love. In this simple yet profound prayer, we place our trust not in our own strength, but in the infinite mercy of God.

Homily Helps

Each year the Fifty Days of Easter have a kind of “shape” formed by the Sunday scriptures: The second and third Sundays offer encounters with the risen Christ. The fourth always brings us into the arms of the Good Shepherd. The gospels of the fifth, sixth, and seventh Sundays are drawn from Jesus’ “farewell discourse” in John’s Gospel, and often the subject is Christian love. In these passages, as in other places in John’s Gospel, Jesus identifies himself with the divine title “I am,” followed by another title—such as “the way and the truth and the life” and “the vine.”

- The first two readings go hand in hand in describing the experience of the early church. The first three words of the first reading are key: “They devoted themselves” (Acts 2:42). Members of the early church were nothing if not devoted. They devoted themselves to learning from the apostles, to living communally with other Christians (the word they’d started using to describe their identity), to prayer, to worship, and to the Eucharist. They also devoted themselves to making sure that everything they had was divided equitably among them so that no one was in need, to meeting together to share and strengthen their faith, to eating together as Jesus had with the apostles, and to growing in number. The second reading hints at the persecution they faced. But they were able to endure the trials they suffered because of their faith: a certainty of their salvation, which they called “a living hope . . . to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading” (1 Peter 1:3–4). No wonder they experienced “an indescribable and glorious joy” (1 Peter 1:8)
- Jesus returned to his disciples in a glorified body, but his body still had the wounds from the cross, wounds that could be seen, felt, and probed. Wounds remain on the Body of Christ still. These are real wounds that are visible and palpable. These are wounds that still need healing. Pope Francis famously described the Church as a field hospital, where the wounded and ill are treated and restored to health. We are called to do this. We are called to heal the wounds of the body of Christ.
- “As the Father has sent me, so I send you,” Jesus tells his disciples after greeting them and offering them peace (John 20:21). Years before, Jesus had taught the disciples to pray that the Father’s will be done here on earth. The Father’s will in sending Jesus was to win our salvation by suffering and dying for our sins. Now Jesus is sending us on a mission in accordance with the Father’s will. Before he ascends to be with the Father forever, he tells his disciples to make disciples of all nations. God created every one of us for a reason and Jesus is telling us what it is. As he did what he was sent to do, so must we.

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Earlier this year the Diocese converted over to new accounting software. Unfortunately, the conversion did not go smoothly, and we were unable to receive any financial data as they worked through the issues. A few weeks ago, we received data through September. Construction work continued during that time.

A summary of the major milestones:

- Glu Lam beams have been erected & installed with the exception of those at the Narthex.
- Lower roofs have been sheathed with plywood and roof top AC curbs have been prepared in advance of TPO roofing.
- Electrical/Data Com/Fire Alarm/Security room:
 - ◇ HECO meter installed & inspected
 - ◇ Cabling from new transformer to meter completed
 - ◇ Awaiting HECO to power up to the meter
 - ◇ Initial coordination meeting with all service providers requiring rack/wall space
- High roof framing has commenced in preparation for plywood sheathing/roofing.
- Liturgical furnishings from Peru artisans received & stored.
- Altar, ambo, stations, crucifix, stained glass, mosaics for baptismal font
- Audio/Visual equipment ordered, received, and stored.
