Parish Mission Statement

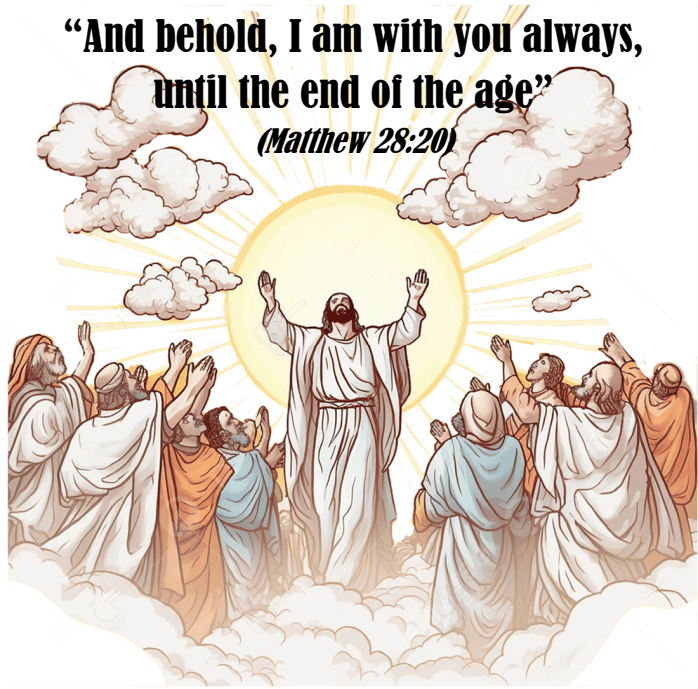

POINTS FOR REFLECTION

- How often have we wished that Jesus would come down from heaven and do something about the terrible things going on in the world today? Such a thought fundamentally misunderstands two lessons from today's readings. First of all, Jesus is already with us. As he promised his disciples, he is with us always, only not in the flesh any longer. Secondly, solving all the world's problems is not why Jesus came in the first place. He did not solve all the world's problems in 30 AD either. He did not bring peace between nations or harmony between peoples. He did not bring miracle cures that could wipe out diseases or disabilities. He did not bring prosperity and happiness to the whole world. No, he joined us in our human condition to share our suffering, redeem us from our sins, and lead us to eternal life with God. What he accomplished transcends the problems of every age, no matter how serious they are. It is now up to us, with the Lord's help, to do what we can to solve the world's problems, if only a little at a time.
- Not only does Jesus remain with us, as he promised his disciples, but we become Christ for others by virtue of our baptism. Today we hear Jesus commanding his disciples to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit . . ." (Matthew 28:19). When we are baptized, we "put on Christ," as the priest or deacon says in the baptismal rite. We become Christ for others when we allow him to do his work through us, when we give our time, our talents, and our energy to the Lord to use as God wills. Jesus has ascended, but he is not gone.
- Just before entering into his Passion, Jesus told his disciples that what they do for the least among them they do for him. Indeed, in addition to us putting on Christ in baptism, Christ is present in our neighbor in need. As Paul would say, with the "eyes of [our] hearts" enlightened (Ephesians 1:18), we can see Christ in those who are hungry or thirsty, those lacking decent clothes or shelter, those ill or imprisoned. No, Jesus is not only "up there in the sky"; he is also here on earth, in us and in the least of our sisters and brothers.

- May 17, Sunday – all classes gather in the church at 12:30 p.m. to celebrate the Blessed Mother. May is a Month of Mary. We will pray the rosary and crown the Blessed Mother. Children from each class will have the opportunity to offer flowers to the Blessed Mother.
- May 17, Sunday – after the crowning of the Blessed Mother, we will recognize and present Certificate of Achievement to children with the best record in attendance, participation in class, and knowledge of our faith according to their grade level.

- May 31, Sunday, 5:00 p.m. Mass. Be in the church no later than 4:00 p.m.

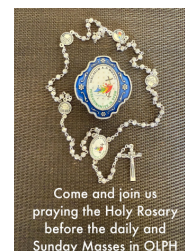
SACRAMENTS INITIATIVE

To everyone who picked up registration forms ---- please bring the completed forms back. Please return to the information table at any Mass or to the parish office, Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Special attention to those who will join the adult class that will start on July 1st. We need to order educational materials next week, hence we need your registration forms.

Praise God! The Holy Spirit is at work in bringing families to the Lord through the sacraments especially Baptism and First Communion. There are a good number of parishioners coming forward to receive the sacraments. Come and see us at our information table after each Mass. God's blessings to all.

Ask our catechists before or after each Mass if you, your family, or anyone you know would like information on the sacraments or register for any class as follows:

- * Baptism at any age, from infant to adults. Infant baptism is for children under seven years of age.
- * Full initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion for ages seven to adults
- * Confirmation only for those who have received Baptism and First Communion for adults
- * Confirmation and First Holy Communion for adults with Catholic baptism.
- * Reception into full communion of the Catholic Church, ages seven and up and with valid Baptism from a non-Catholic denomination
- * Religious education classes from Pre-K to high school
- * Matrimony – Catholic wedding either for the first time or marriage validation which means they were married civilly.



We thank those who have come to our Information Table to ask about Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation, and yes, Matrimony. Several families have taken registration forms for the next Religious Education classes which will start on August 9. May God bless us all and may we all continue to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit inviting us to start or deepen our relationship with the Lord.

IMPORTANT TRAFFIC ANNOUNCEMENT

Effective immediately, parking on Ma Ke Kula Street is prohibited. The City & County identified it as a fire lane; therefore, it is illegal to park on either side of the street. Vehicles parked there are subject to towing at the owner's expense. We have also recently received complaints from our neighbors.

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

As the Diocese continues the financial system conversions there are the gradual report updates received by the Parish. Progress continues albeit with several rain event interruptions. We are currently preparing for 5 separate Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours with control joints/saw cuts to prevent the floors from cracking. Concrete will then be ground & polished to show some of the aggregate. The Sanctuary, Baptismal Font, and possibly the center aisle will have a Mapei floor coating applied over the concrete.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining has commenced with roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing to follow. Simultaneously fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting & RTU AC curbs are being installed. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

This will be followed by DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the windows and the completions of the data com, electrical, and unisex restrooms. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambray is scheduled to arrive and installed in the July-August time frame. Interior work will take place over the next few months following that.
