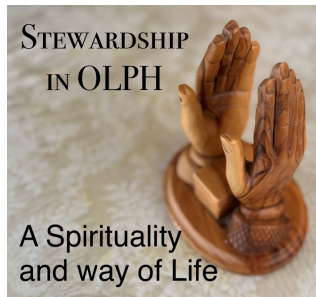

PASTOR'S PAGE

Points of Reflection

- The Chosen People decided to pitch their camp at the foot of Mount Sinai, the place they thought God's presence would most likely be found, as it was the highest mountain they'd seen. In fact, it was on this mountain that Moses would later receive the ten commandments. We have pitched our tent, so to speak, in this place, in this church, blessed by the bishop, and blessed with the Lord's presence whenever we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. May we realize how precious we are in the Lord's sight in this holy place.
- It is tricky to reconcile the words we hear Jesus tell his disciples today—to avoid Gentiles or Samaritans—with his parting words to his disciples (which we heard just a couple of weeks ago) to make disciples of all nations. Was curing the sick, raising the dead, and driving out demons really only for the lost sheep of the house of Israel at first? It is important to note that Matthew wrote his Gospel for Jews and Jewish Christians. He portrays Jesus as the promised Messiah, linking his identity and mission with the Jewish tradition. He wants his audience to know that Jesus firstly came for them. Secondly, when Jesus sees crowds of folks who are troubled and abandoned, he immediately recalls the words of Ezekiel about the lost sheep of Israel. Jesus realizes that this is a message that will not resonate with non-Jews. Finally, Matthew explicitly points out that there are twelve disciples whom Jesus sends out, symbolizing the twelve tribes of Israel. Later we hear of dozens of disciples (sometimes 72, sometimes 120), numbers more appropriate for going out to the whole world.
- Today, Jesus' disciples number in the millions and so we are able to cover the whole world to proclaim the Good News to everyone, without regard to race, language, nationality, or tradition. Let us welcome the lost sheep to the fold (or back to the fold) and guide them to the love and mercy of the Good Shepherd, for when we see and serve the Lord in those in need, his kingdom is at hand.

Question of the Week

Whom do I know, or know of, who is troubled or abandoned? What can I do to bring them serenity, make them feel valued, and restore hope to their lives?

Preparation for Initiation Sacraments

Registration for all classes in Religious Education is going on with deadline as noted below. We have to order books and educational materials. Parents: registration after July 5 for pre-K to high school is subject to additional fee as we would have to order additional materials. Please know or be reminded that shipping charges to Hawaii from the mainland are high. Which class to register for:

- ◆ For adults 18 years old and above who need Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist or First Holy Communion. Classes will start on July 1st, Wednesday, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and every Wednesday thereafter. Applications are due on June 14. If you have already picked up a form (Diocese of Honolulu Adult Initiation Inventory), please bring it back either to the Information Table after any Mass or to the parish office, Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Please note that the parish office is closed on holidays and weekends.
- ◆ First Grade to High School: classes will start on August 9, Sunday, from 12:30 p.m. to 1:45 p.m. and every Sunday thereafter. Registration forms are due no later than July 5. There will be additional fee for late registration. Baptism certificates are required for those who were baptized and birth certificate for the unbaptized. Pick up registration forms after any Mass on weekends or come to the parish office Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;
- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

As the Diocese continues the financial system conversions there are the gradual report updates received by the Parish. Progress continues albeit with several rain event interruptions. We are currently preparing for 5 separate Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours with control joints/saw cuts to prevent the floors from cracking. Concrete will then be ground & polished to show some of the aggregate. The Sanctuary, Baptismal Font, and possibly the center aisle will have a Mapei floor coating applied over the concrete.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining has commenced with roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing to follow. Simultaneously fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting & RTU AC curbs are being installed. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

This will be followed by DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the windows and the completions of the data com, electrical, and unisex restrooms. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambray is scheduled to arrive and installed in the July-August time frame. Interior work will take place over the next few months following that.
