

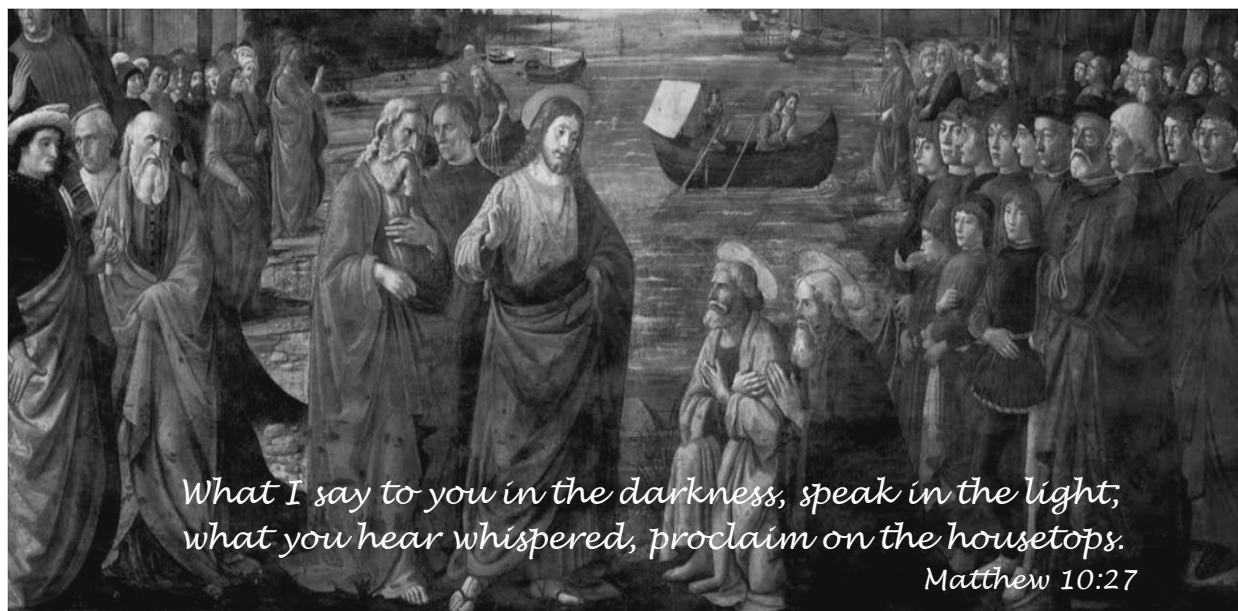

Points of Reflection

- The instructions we hear Jesus give today are addressed to his disciples, but they can also be read as the instructions he has already given to himself, instructions he will follow all the way to the cross. “Fear no one” (Matthew 10:26): Jesus will not be afraid to speak out against the authorities and those with power. “Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul” (10:28): Jesus stands up to Herod and Pilate, knowing that they cannot harm his soul. “Not one [sparrow] falls to the ground without your Father’s knowledge” (10:29): the Father will raise Jesus from the dead. This perspective makes our mission as Jesus’ disciples easier, for we know that this all has been proven true.
- Note that Jesus does not say that God will not allow sparrows to fall to the ground anymore or let you lose any of your hair! No, he just says that the Father watches over us all so that we need not be afraid of loss or death. Saint Paul is able to use the confidence he has in God to proclaim the gospel in hostile situations, eventually facing arrest, imprisonment, and death. As he writes to the Romans, the grace from the Father’s gift of the Son overflows to the whole world. We need not even be afraid of death, for Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life.
- Fear can lead us to all sorts of terrible thinking and actions. Fear of what those who are not like us may do can lead to prejudice and intolerance. Fear of what others may think of us can lead us to avoid standing up for our beliefs or for someone who needs our support. Fear of losing our jobs or our wealth can lead us to unethical and selfish actions. Jeremiah recognized the fears he had—of friends betraying him, of being persecuted, of terror—but trusted in God, who would rescue him from all wickedness. Three times Jesus reassures his disciples that there is no need to fear, even of those who might kill them, since we have God on our side. Our only fear should be of denying our faith and giving in to the devil, for then our soul is in true peril.

Question of the Week

What do I fear the most about witnessing to my faith in the light of day? How can I see my failing to stand up for what I believe in as a greater fear?

MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;
- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

As the Diocese continues the financial system conversions there are the gradual report updates received by the Parish. Progress continues albeit with several rain event interruptions. We are currently preparing for 5 separate Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours with control joints/saw cuts to prevent the floors from cracking. Concrete will then be ground & polished to show some of the aggregate. The Sanctuary, Baptismal Font, and possibly the center aisle will have a Mapei floor coating applied over the concrete.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining has commenced with roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing to follow. Simultaneously fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting & RTU AC curbs are being installed. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

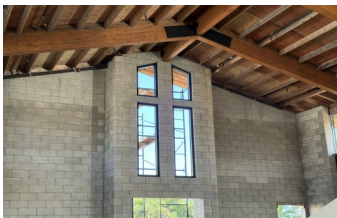
This will be followed by DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the windows and the completions of the data com, electrical, and unisex restrooms. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry is scheduled to arrive and installed in the July-August time frame. Interior work will take place over the next few months following that.
