

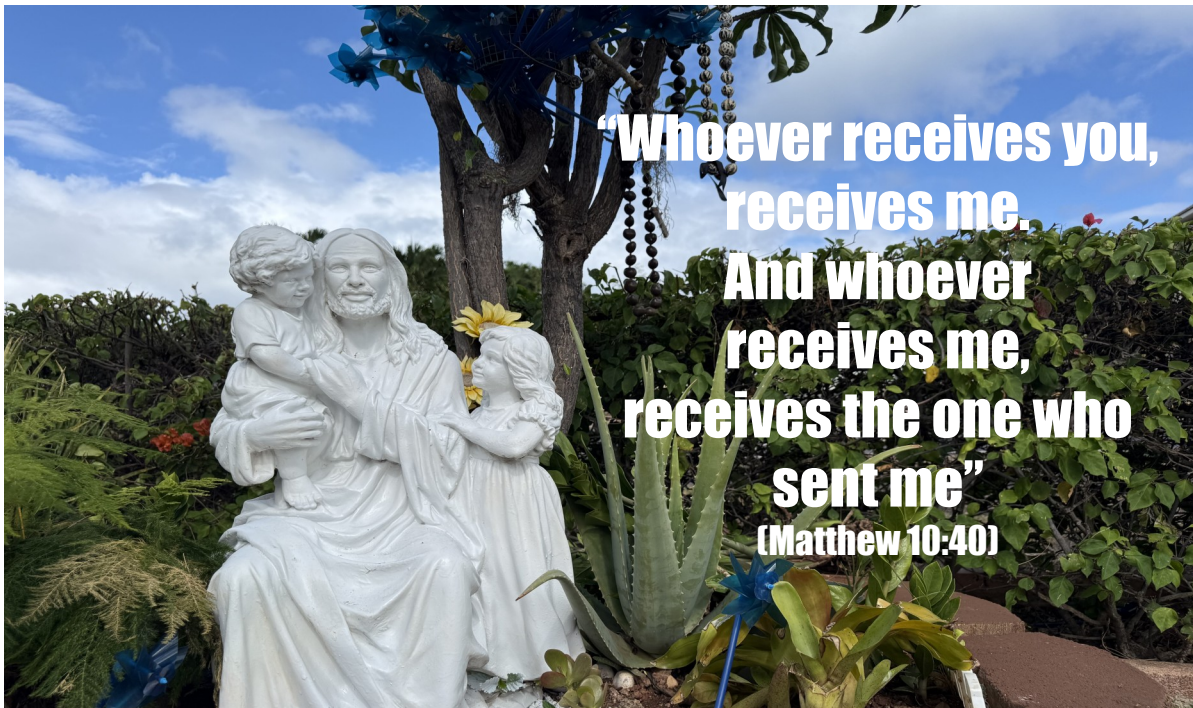

PASTOR'S PAGE

Points of Reflection

- No one will come to your door with a name tag that says “Disciple” on their shirt or jacket. Nor will the person you see begging for spare change identify themselves as one of Christ’s disciples. To whom should you offer a cup of cold water, as Jesus himself counseled? How can you tell who’s worthy? The only way to ensure that you are helping a disciple in need is to help *everyone* you encounter who is in need, even if it’s just with a drink of cold water.
- Jesus delivers bad news and good news in the Gospel passage we hear today. First the bad news: being a disciple means giving yourself to Jesus. You must take up your cross and live a life of self-sacrifice, putting Christ before not only yourself but even your loved ones. However, the good news is that if you live unselfishly for the sake of the gospel you will be rewarded. When Jesus tells his disciples that “whoever loses his [or her] life for my sake will find it” (Matthew 10:39), he is telling us that if we “lose” our self-centeredness we will find that life in Christ has much greater rewards.
- Saint Paul writes that through baptism we now live in “newness of life” (Romans 6:4). The woman of Shunem gives Elisha a foretaste of the newness of life by offering hospitality to him from the goodness of her heart. In return, Elisha literally promises newness of life in prophesying a newborn son. Jesus promises newness of life to those who become his disciples, who take up their cross and follow him. They will receive the reward of eternal life from the one who is the resurrection and the (newness of) life. To picture the practice of baptism by immersion, which was the norm in Paul’s time, the moment when you cannot breathe is like a death to your old self and sin, followed by a rising to new life.

- What metaphorical “cup of cold water,” some simple thing I can do for someone, will I do this week and for whom?

OCIA Starts this Wednesday

Aloha everyone.

To all 18 years old and above: You still have time to register for the adult's session that starts this Wednesday, July 1st. If you:

- Have not been baptized at all.
- Have a valid baptism from a non-Catholic Church. For the Catholic Church to recognize your baptism as valid, the minister must have baptized using water with the Trinitarian formula, i.e. I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Were baptized in the Catholic Church when you were a baby and needs Confirmation and First Holy Communion.
- Have received a Catholic baptism and First Holy Communion but needs the sacrament of Confirmation.

Come on July 1st with your completed "Diocese of Honolulu Adult Initiation Inventory" which you can pick up from the registration table before or after any Mass, or pick it up from the parish office, or download from the diocesan website: <https://www.catholichawaii.org/media/646774/adult-initiation-inventory.pdf>

Registration for Children and Youth

We will continue to take registration for children and youth this weekend (June 27/28) and next weekend (July 4 and 5). We will order resources on July 7. After the July 5 weekend, we will take a break in registration but will resume on July 25 and 26, and August 1 and 2. Parents may also register at the parish office Tuesday to Friday between 9 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Which class to register for:

- Pre-K and Kinder, Ages 4 and 5. Please also register the children for baptism if they have not been baptized yet.
- Year 1 of Confirmation and First Communion in First Grade to high school. The groupings would be First and Second Grade, Grades 3 to 5, Grades 6 to 8, and high school. Those who have not been baptized belong to these groups also.
- Year 2 of Confirmation and First Communion who were in Catechetical Year 2025-2026.
- FI or Fully Initiated, Grades 3 to 5. Children in Grades 3 to 5 who have completed their initiation sacraments belong to this group.

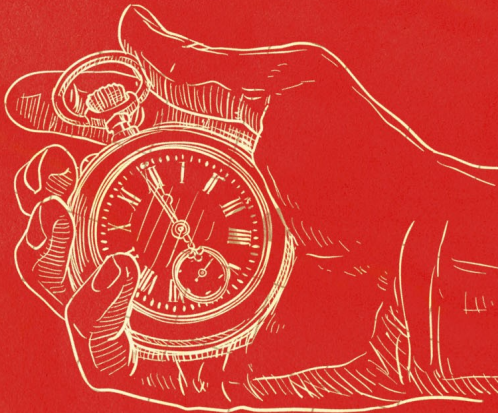

MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;
- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

As the Diocese continues the financial system conversions there are the gradual report updates received by the Parish. Progress continues albeit with several rain event interruptions. We are currently preparing for 5 separate Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours with control joints/saw cuts to prevent the floors from cracking. Concrete will then be ground & polished to show some of the aggregate. The Sanctuary, Baptismal Font, and possibly the center aisle will have a Mapei floor coating applied over the concrete.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining has commenced with roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing to follow. Simultaneously fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting & RTU AC curbs are being installed. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

This will be followed by DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the windows and the completions of the data com, electrical, and unisex restrooms. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry is scheduled to arrive and installed in the July-August time frame. Interior work will take place over the next few months following that.
