### PLEASE READ!!

- Hospitality to travelers was of paramount importance in ancient times. Roadside diners and gas stations or charging stations did not exist, let alone air-conditioned cars. So Abraham immediately provides water, food, and cool shade to these three strangers. To have failed to do so would have meant that these folks could have become ill or even died before they reached their destination. However, for Abraham and Sarah, treating these traveling strangers as guests to be served is also an act of faith in God's presence in others. They discover that God is manifested when one reaches out in kindness, in mercy, in hospitality to strangers in need. We may not discover God's presence in such a clear-cut way, but we may find God manifested in subtle ways when we welcome the stranger.
- Mary has every right to be overwhelmed when her sister welcomes Jesus into their home. Here is the Messiah himself, sitting at their table. She is transfixed by his every word, probably not even noticing that Martha is doing all the work. Poor Martha! She is the conscientious one, doing all the serving and cleaning up and anything else that needed to be done for their guest. Tired and overworked, she can't help but complain and now Jesus seems to be siding with her lazy sister. But Jesus is aware of Mary's need right there right now to give him her undivided attention, not unlike his closest disciples. Long after all the dishes are washed and put away, and long after all of Martha's worries and anxieties are past, Mary's experience of sitting at the Lord's feet and glorying in his presence will stay with her. Truly she has chosen the better part, for she has chosen with her heart.
- But don't give up on Martha! The next time we encounter Mary and Martha, when their beloved brother Lazarus had just died, it is Martha who makes one of the most powerful proclamations in the entire Gospels when Jesus asks her if she believes that he is the resurrection: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:27). Somehow in between all her cooking and serving and cleaning, Martha absorbed what Jesus said and who he is and is able to confess her faith at one of the most traumatic points of her life. Sometimes we don't realize the faith we've internalized until much later.

How am I hospitable to others in need of food or rest, or just some companionship? How can I see the Lord in such hospitality?

- Fully Initiated children, Grades 3 to 5. Fully initiated means they already received and completed their initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist or First Holy Communion. This group of children will continue with their faith formation. We prepared them to receive their sacraments. Now is the time for them to deepen their knowledge and love of God and the practice of their faith most especially coming to weekend Masses.
- Fully initiated Grades 6 to high school should register and attend Youth Ministry: Edge for Middle School and Life Teen for High School.

# OCIA – Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

OCIA is for 18 years old and above who fall in any of the categories below:

- ⇒ Full initiation. Need Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- ⇒ Full Communion of the Catholic Church. This means the person has a valid Baptism from a non-Catholic Christian church and would like to be Catholic
- ⇒ Adults with Catholic baptism in infancy and need Confirmation and Eucharist



### **MASTERPLAN UPDATE**

Our biggest concern is the delivery of structural steel & storefront doors and the potential delays to overall schedule & cost. Design Build Hawaii (DBH) is currently seeking updates from Parsons, the steel fabricator, on the delivery date of structural steel after missing the anticipated delivery in January 2025. We have confirmation from Arcadia that fabrication of our storefront doors is underway.

Stormwater retention & drainage system excavation and connection is complete and backfilled adjacent to the existing church. Excavation between drains A1 & A2 is partially completed to North Rd. due to our current electrical service line obstructing the path of the drain line. DBH is renewing the trenching permit & awaiting HECO sign-off to complete the section from front of church to the box drain in North Road. Crews are working on the drain line section between A4 & A5.

- CMU wall installation has been completed by Affiliated Construction short of top-of-wall. An issue arose where several tube steel columns need to be installed. Without these columns Affiliated Construction is unable to complete top-of-wall. Details for tube steel columns have been released by Mutual Welding to a local shop for fabrication.
- HECO has approved switchboard submittal from Roy's Electric & DPP has also given approval of electrical panel installation once the CMU walls are completed with a temporary roof.
- Lifeline prepared final pricing & contract documents for review & approval of monitored security system. Meeting being scheduled to discuss.
- Sauder Worship finalized & executed pricing for furnishings; celebrant chairs, ambry, credence table, etc. These items will ship together with the pews.
- Artesanos Don Bosco has completed the carvings on the stations of the cross that have been reviewed by Frs. Ed & Kurt.
- ♦ Data Com meeting scheduled with Comtel & Pacific Direct Connect to discuss & finalize details for wiring through conduit versus microwave on 1/28/25.
