PASTOR'S PAGE

Points of Reflection

- Given the chance to ask one thing of God for ourselves, what would we choose? Before we answer, we would be wise to look back at other things we've wished for, even longed for, and have received. Have they brought us the joy we thought they would? Or did our satisfaction fade over time? Remember, God is infinitely good, the source of all goodness, constant goodness, whether that is love, peace, or happiness. Solomon asked for an understanding heart so that he could exercise wise judgment. With this, he could judge among many good things and discern what truly would bring him joy. But we don't need this. Jesus has revealed the greatest treasure to us—the kingdom—and it will bring us true joy. May we trust in him and pursue the kingdom over all other good things.
- It would be easy to misinterpret the first two parables we hear in today's Gospel and conclude that they were about becoming wealthy beyond our wildest dreams. Both the person who finds the buried treasure and the merchant who finds the pearl of great price sell all they have to buy their treasure. But note that they don't turn around and sell these objects for a huge windfall. Nor are they holding them as investments that can appreciate in value. No, these objects are their goal. They have found their true treasures. For us disciples, Jesus says, our treasure is the kingdom of heaven. May we appreciate the treasure of the kingdom and joyfully pay the cost of discipleship, bear our crosses, make our sacrifices, and give what we have to those in need in order to obtain it.
- Like the "false wheat" we heard about last week, which was allowed to grow along side the wheat until it was harvested, then thrown into "the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth" (Matthew 13:42, 50), the "bad" fish meet the same end. In each case, we trust God to make the judgment between good and bad. In each case, we are given a warning about those who are wicked, who try to corrupt those who are righteous. But it is also a warning to those who do evil, that they have until the time of the harvest to change their ways. May we heed God's warning and take advantage of our opportunity to repent of our sins as soon as possible, for we know not when the net will sweep us up.

Reminder on CFC2

August 9, Sunday. First day of classes are for the above classes only.

OCIA Corner

What is the OCIA? OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is faith formation of adults and a process by which they come into the Catholic Faith. Adults 18 years old and above are prepared for the reception of initiation sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist or First Holy Communion). There are three groups in the OCIA:

Those who need full initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist)

Those who were baptized in the Catholic Church and needs completion of initiation sacraments (Confirmation and Eucharist)

Those who need full communion of the Catholic Church which means they have a valid baptism from a non-Catholic Church. They will also receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist with Reconciliation. For baptism to be valid, the minister must have used water with the Trinitarian formula – "I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit".

Is there OCIC for children under 18? There is no Order of Christian Initiation for Children. Those who are between 7 and 18 years old are prepared for their initiation sacraments under the OCIA process but with age-appropriate educational materials.

These can be messages of best wishes, sentiments of congratulations, etc. You can also use this space to advertise your business. The making of these pages is completely in your hands. Share a PDF, print-ready copy by the end of October to grottopics26@gmail.com. For a full page, there is a cost of \$200. Half a page is \$100 and one quarter of a page is \$50. Make sure you submit your print-ready copy by the end of September. Include your name and phone number in the email so we know how to contact you.

4. The book will include a collage of parishioners standing in front of the grotto that houses the statue of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. If you have a picture of you or a loved one (living or deceased) in front of the Grotto you may submit it to be included in the collage. It can be in front of the old church on Ft. MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third

Orders Regular and Secular;

- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic

Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

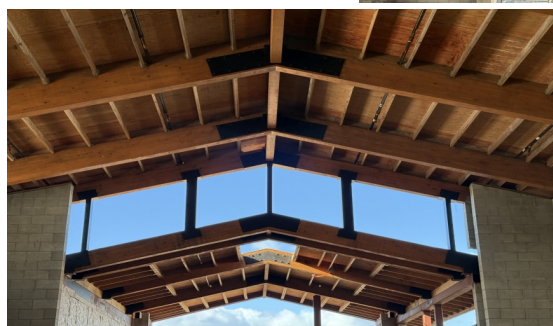
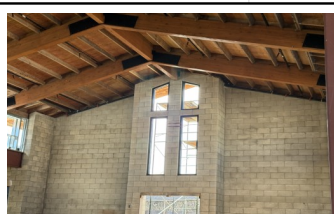
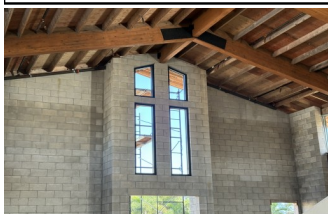
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
