

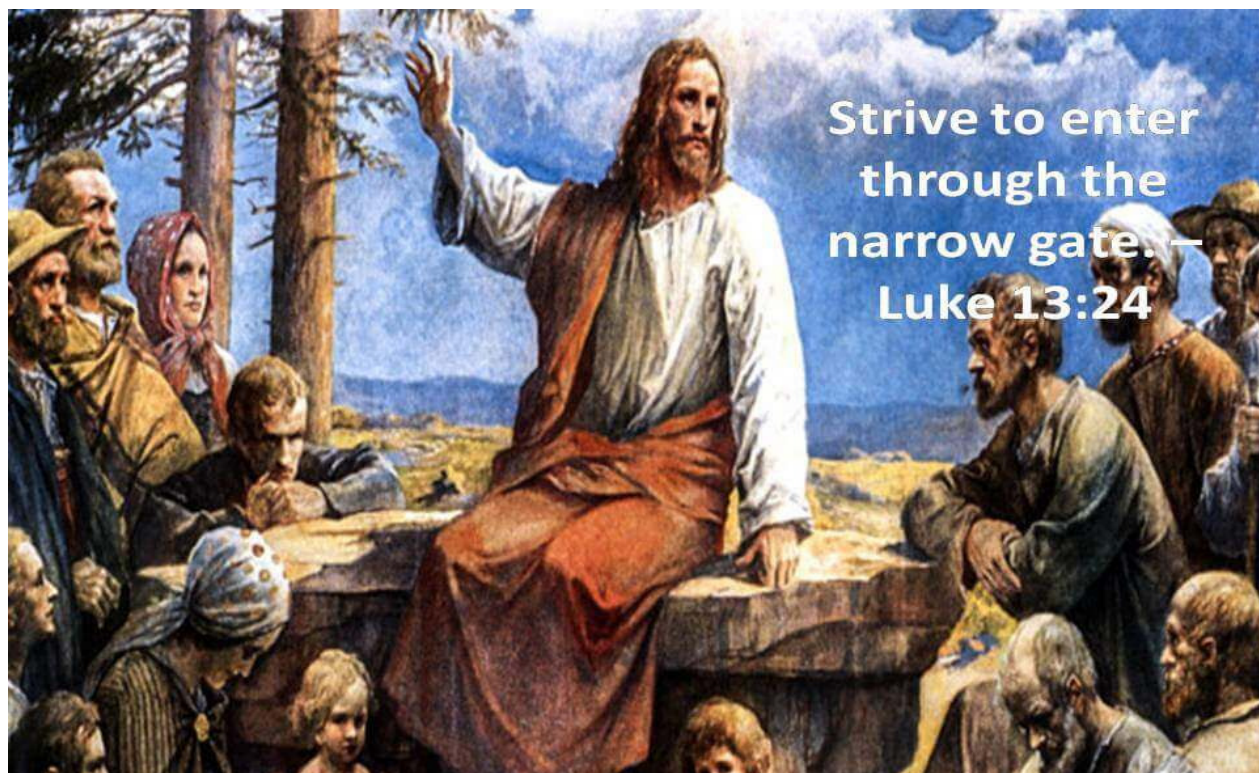

PLEASE READ!

- The passage we hear in the first reading today was written during a key era in Israel's history. The Babylonians have just been defeated and the Jewish people can once again rule over Judah. At this point Isaiah could have called for only the Jewish faithful to return and refused entry to all pagans. But this is not what the LORD tells Isaiah. No, the LORD invites "nations of every language," those who "have never heard of my fame, or seen my glory" (Isaiah 66:18–19). For Isaiah, then, this is an opportunity for the faith to spread well beyond the formerly exiled Chosen People and draw in people from Africa, Europe, and Asia, where the nations listed in these verses are located. Not only that, some of these "foreigners" even will be chosen by God to serve as priests and Levites. Those previously thought of as unclean and unworthy to worship at all will now be able to offer sacrifice and perform cultic functions. God is truly the God of all.
- If it seems as if the responsorial psalm is quite short today, it's because these two verses are the entire psalm. Psalm 117 is not only the shortest psalm in the Bible, it's the shortest chapter in the Bible. And yet, it says all that really needs to be said: God's kindness and faithfulness lasts forever, and all God's children should praise and glorify God. God's mercy and love are shown through that kindness. We have seen that even when we are not faithful to God, God is always faithful to us—through the covenant passed down from Abraham to the new covenant consummated by Jesus' sacrifice. All that's missing today from that psalm is its final word: Hallelujah!
- Four times in the second reading we hear the word discipline, each time in a positive way, given out of love to help us grow. It is no coincidence that it comes from the same root in Latin as the word for disciple. Discipline teaches us how to be good disciples. Discipline is necessary to stay true to our mission, to love God and love our neighbor as ourselves, and to see the Christ in others. Doing so habitually forms us into the kind of disciples whom Jesus called to follow him.

Question of the Week:

What must I do to grow in the discipline of being a good disciple of the Lord?
What can strengthen my "drooping hands and weak knees" (Hebrews 12:12)?

BAPTISM

The next celebration of infant baptism is on September 20, Saturday. Preparation class for parents and godparents is on the same day, September 20, from 8:30 a.m. to 10:45. Baptism follows at 11:00 a.m. Infant baptism is for children who are below 7 years old. Otherwise, children seven years old and above who need baptism will be prepared for the three initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist through the OCIA process (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults).

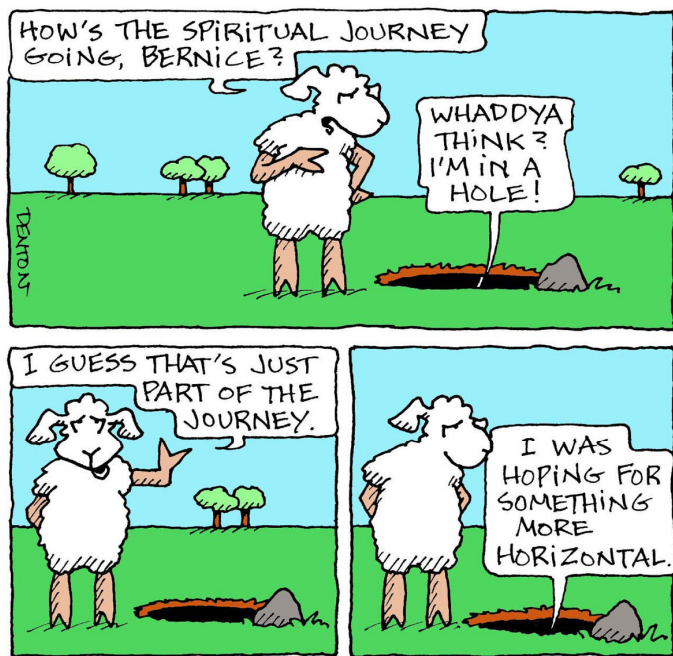
Parents may pick up application forms for infant baptism at the parish office and should turn in the completed forms as soon as possible or no later than September 8. Please call the parish office at 808-689-8681 Ext. 107 if you have any questions.

OCIA

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process to join Jesus through the Church. The process is for:

- ◆ Those who are seven years old and above who need full initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- ◆ Those seven years old and above who have a valid baptism from a non-Catholic Christian Church. Valid baptism means the minister use water and the Trinitarian formula: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit".
- ◆ Adults, 18 years old and above, baptized Catholic and need completion of initiation sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.





MASTERPLAN UPDATE

Our biggest concern is the delivery of structural steel & storefront doors and the potential delays to overall schedule & cost. Design Build Hawaii (DBH) is currently seeking updates from Parsons, the steel fabricator, on the delivery date of structural steel after missing the anticipated delivery in January 2025. We have confirmation from Arcadia that fabrication of our storefront doors is underway.

Stormwater retention & drainage system excavation and connection is complete and backfilled adjacent to the existing church. Excavation between drains A1 & A2 is partially completed to North Rd. due to our current electrical service line obstructing the path of the drain line. DBH is renewing the trenching permit & awaiting HECO sign-off to complete the section from front of church to the box drain in North Road. Crews are working on the drain line section between A4 & A5.

- ◆ CMU wall installation has been completed by Affiliated Construction short of top-of-wall. An issue arose where several tube steel columns need to be installed. Without these columns Affiliated Construction is unable to complete top-of-wall. Details for tube steel columns have been released by Mutual Welding to a local shop for fabrication.
- ◆ HECO has approved switchboard submittal from Roy's Electric & DPP has also given approval of electrical panel installation once the CMU walls are completed with a temporary roof.
- ◆ Lifeline prepared final pricing & contract documents for review & approval of monitored security system. Meeting being scheduled to discuss.
- ◆ Sauder Worship finalized & executed pricing for furnishings; celebrant chairs, ambry, credence table, etc. These items will ship together with the pews.
- ◆ Artesanos Don Bosco has completed the carvings on the stations of the cross that have been reviewed by Frs. Ed & Kurt.
- ◆ Data Com meeting scheduled with Comtel & Pacific Direct Connect to discuss & finalize details for wiring through conduit versus microwave on 1/28/25.
