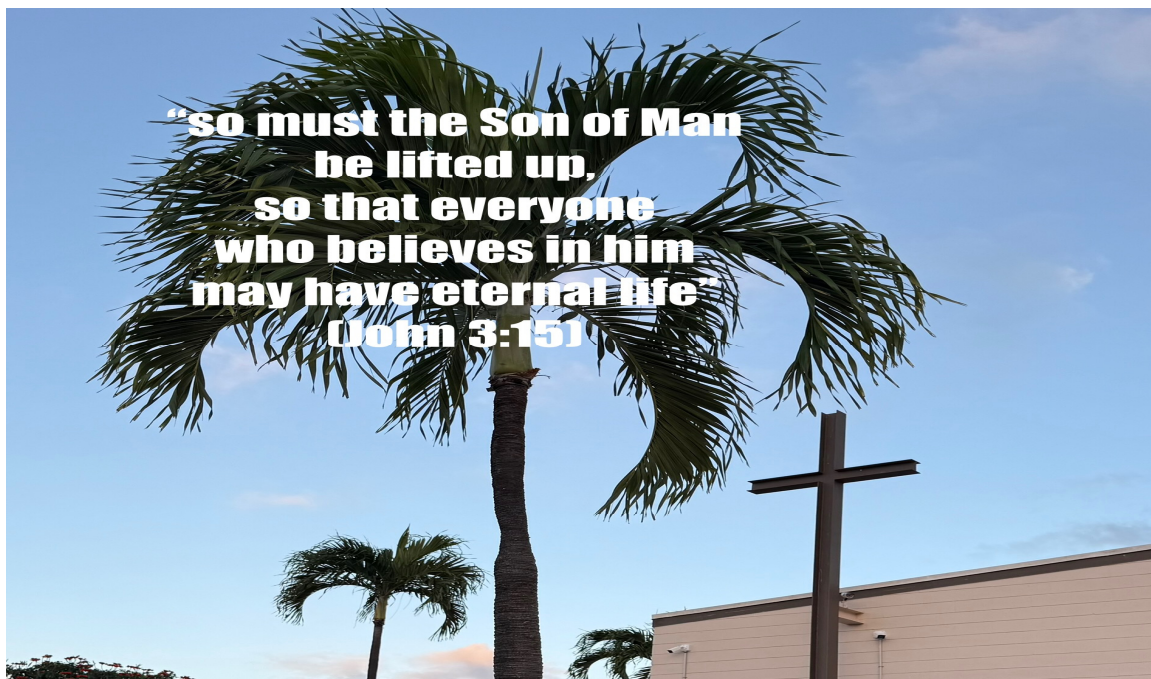
Parish Mission Statement

...LEADS A GIVER'S HEART TO JESUS



When those sinners who had been bitten by venomous snakes looked upon the bronze serpent that Moses lifted up high, they lived. Compare this with what Jesus tells Nicodemus, that those sinners who look upon the Son of Man, who would be lifted up, will have eternal life. Through the cross, like a venomous snake, an instrument of death, our immortal souls are saved. As God gave new life to the sinful people in the desert, Christ offers new life to us in the desert of sin. Jesus' self-sacrificing love for us brings us healing and life.

Nicodemus is a fascinating character. He comes to Jesus at night, suggesting that he was afraid of being seen. He was likely a member of the Sanhedrin and feared for his reputation. Later, when he defends Jesus before his peers, he is identified as one of the chief priests. After Jesus' death, he anoints his body, then with Joseph of Arimathea—another secret disciple—carries his body to a tomb, perhaps also after nightfall. Through all this time, the people Nicodemus worked with, worshiped with, and even lived with may not have known the journey of faith he was making. In the same vein, we may not know the inner lives of those we think we know.

By accepting his death and sacrificing his life, Jesus transforms the cross from an instrument of execution to one of triumph. When we were baptized and the sign of the cross was made over us, we were given a share in this triumph. We affirm this each time we trace the cross on ourselves. We are not given an exemption from the cross. But our crosses are not just instruments of suffering and hardship. Our crosses have been sanctified for they are shared by Christ, who carried his cross to the end. Our crosses too can transform death into life.

Question of the Week

How can I imitate Christ by helping someone else carry their cross, as he helps me carry mine?

INFANT BAPTISM

Our next celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is on September 20, 2025, Saturday at 11:00 a.m. Preparation class for parents and godparents is on the same day from 8:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Here are some questions parents always ask when they call for infant baptism:

- ♦ Parents are not married. Would we baptize their child? Answer: Yes, we will. Parents are not required to be married to have their child baptized. This is a teachable moment for such parents. We talk about the Sacrament of Matrimony and their responsibility to raise their child (or children) in the Catholic faith. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church; otherwise, they will not be able to receive Holy Communion.
- ♦ What if the chosen godparent is not Catholic? Answer: Godparents must be fully initiated Roman Catholic having received the three initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Non-Catholic Christians could perform the role of a Christian witness but only with a qualified Catholic godparent.

The qualifications for a godparent are:

- a) Must have completed 16 years of age.
- b) Fully initiated Roman Catholic
- c) Must lead a life in harmony with the Catholic faith
- d) If married, marriage must be in the Catholic Church

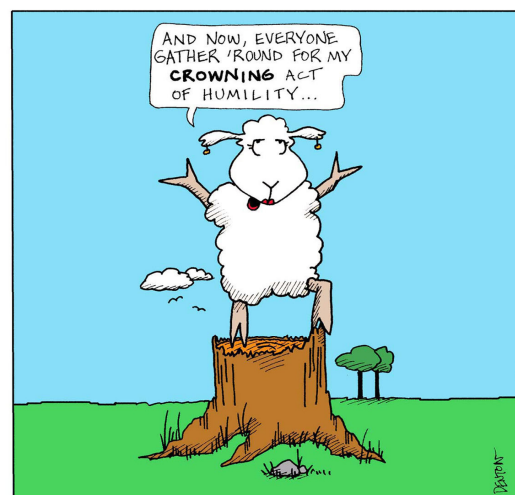

The leadership of the Pearson Place and Pearson Foundation of Hawaii will be joining us at the 9am and 11am Masses on Sunday, 21 September 2025. Brochures will be distributed on various topics that relate primarily to the youth of our parish though adults, too, may find the information useful in terms of discussing some of the topics with their children. Topics include chastity and abstinence, healthy relationships, in utero child development, abortion, options to abortion, contraceptives, and the like. See you all!

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

- CMU wall installation has been completed by Affiliated Construction.
- Structural steel has been installed. Design Build Hawaii, the contractor, is working on the beams for the roofing.
- We have confirmation from Arcadia that fabrication of our storefront doors is underway.
- Stormwater retention & drainage system excavation and connection is complete and backfilled adjacent to the existing church, including the section from front of church to the box drain in North Road.
- HECO has approved switchboard submittal from Roy's Electric & DPP has also given approval of electrical panel installation once the roof of the whole utility room is installed, which has been worked on.
- Monitored security system is being finalized.
- Sauder Worship finalized & executed pricing for furnishing: celebrant chairs, ambry, credence table, etc. These items will ship together with the pews.
- Artesanos Don Bosco has shipped to us the altar, ambo, crucifix, stained glass, mosaic for baptismal font flooring, and stations of the cross. They are expected to arrived on campus by the end of September.
- Other church furnishings have been delivered to us: processional crucifix and candles, chalice and ciboria, statues of St. Joseph and Sacred Heart of Jesus, and Gospel Book metal cover.
- Data Com is being finalized with Comtel & Pacific Direct Connect.
