Points of Reflection for the 3rd Sunday of Advent 2025

<> >< <> >< <> >< <> >< <>

- John the Baptist is a far different man from the one who prepared the people for Jesus' coming and then baptized him in the River Jordan. There was no mistaking the Son of God then, what with the dove and the voice of God from on high. But now? John has been arrested and thrown in jail for daring to speak out against Herod. Left alone in his prison cell for days on end, he begins to doubt. Where is this Messiah whom he had proclaimed? Listen to the deeds that Jesus ticks off, all quoted from Isaiah about the day of salvation. Sure, the blind see and the lame walk, but what about "liberty to the captives, release to the prisoners" (Isaiah 61:1)? Had Jesus turned his back on his cousin? Have we often wondered the same thing? If Jesus is our brother, where is he in times of trouble? If we are adopted sons and daughters of God, why do we sometimes feel abandoned?
- It is ironic that Jesus leads with "the blind regain their sight" (Matthew 11:5), for John himself has lost his eyes of faith. With eyes of faith, John was able to see the kingdom of heaven at hand, trees bearing good fruit, and chaff thrown into unquenchable fire (as we heard last week), much as Isaiah could see flowers blooming in the desert, disabilities eradicated, and joy banishing sorrow. But in prison he can't see as he used to and can't see what Jesus' disciples are seeing. Can we see past the surface ourselves? Sometimes we feel stuck with our maladies, our problems, and our inadequacies and don't see the possibilities in the light of Christ. Sometimes reimagining our lives from God's perspective can make the difference in how we feel about our situation in life.
- It seems incongruous for Jesus to say, "Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me," after ticking off all the miraculous things he's done (Matthew 11:6). Yet we know that many took offense. The well-to-do may have resented the poor being raised up. Many regarded lepers as beneath them and their sudden cures didn't affect the way they felt about them as people. It had been easier to ignore the disabled, the homeless, and the outcasts. By the end of his ministry, the inoffensive little baby in the manger becomes the condemned man on the cross. Radically remaking the world to reflect the kingdom of God threatens the status quo and offends many.

GAUDETE SUNDAY

The third Sunday of Advent is called “Gaudete” Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for “rejoice” and is taken from the Entrance Antiphon: “Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near” (Philippians 4:4-5).

The liturgical color for Gaudete Sunday is rose, not pink. Priests’ and deacons’ vestments are colored rose. We also light the third candle on the Advent wreath which is supposed to be colored rose also. Liturgical environment should also use rose color.

The first reading from Isaiah speaks of “joy and gladness”, “the steppe will rejoice and bloom ... with abundant flowers”, “God will come and save you” so the blind will see, the deaf will hear, the lame will “leap like a stag” and the mute will sing. These imageries are fulfilled in Matthew’s Gospel : “the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them”.

THE “O” ANTIPHONS

The Roman Church has been singing the “O” antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the “*Magnificat*” canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative “Come!” embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. (*uscgb.org, 12/9/2025*)

- * Dec. 17 – O Sapiensa. O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge.
- * Dec. 18 – O Adonai. O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power.
- * Dec. 19 – O Radix Jesse. O Root of Jesse’s stem, sign of God’s love for all his people: come to save us without delay.
- * Dec. 20 – O Clavis David. O Key of David, opening the gates of God’s eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness.
- * Dec. 21 – O Oriens. O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.
- * Dec. 22 – O Rex Gentium. O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust.
- * Dec. 23 – O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God.

- **December 29, 2024** (Feast of the Holy Family) Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of his cathedral, Saint John Lateran, which on November 9, 2024 celebrated the 1700th anniversary of its dedication.
- **January 1, 2025** (Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God) Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of the Papal Basilica of Saint Mary Major.

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

- CMU wall installation has been completed by Affiliated Construction.
- Structural steel has been installed. Design Build Hawaii, the contractor, is working on the beams for the roofing.
- We have confirmation from Arcadia that fabrication of our storefront doors is underway.
- Stormwater retention & drainage system excavation and connection is complete and backfilled adjacent to the existing church, including the section from front of church to the box drain in North Road.
- HECO has approved switchboard submittal from Roy's Electric & DPP has also given approval of electrical panel installation once the roof of the whole utility room is installed, which has been worked on.
- Monitored security system is being finalized.
- Sauder Worship finalized & executed pricing for furnishing: celebrant chairs, ambry, credence table, etc. These items will ship together with the pews.
- Data Com is being finalized with Comtel & Pacific Direct Connect.
- Church furnishings like: processional crucifix and candles, chalice and ciboria, statues of St. Joseph and Sacred Heart of Jesus, and Gospel Book metal cover, are already delivered.
- Artesanos Don Bosco has shipped to us the altar, ambo, crucifix, stained glass, mosaic for baptismal font flooring, and stations of the cross. These liturgical furnishings are already delivered in campus.
