PASTOR'S PAGE

Points of Reflection

- The weed in the first parable we hear today is darnel, an insidious weed because in its early stages of growth it looks very much like wheat. Sometimes referred to as "false wheat," it can induce sleep or even death. No wonder Jesus expected that most people would agree that it should be pulled out as soon as possible. But because in their early stages darnel is difficult to distinguish from good wheat, trying to eradicate one hundred percent of the bad wheat would also eradicate some percentage of the good wheat. And the kingdom of heaven is not a place where even one shoot of good wheat should be thrown out with the bad. Hence the call to wait until the good wheat and the false wheat have matured and shown their true natures. In a similar way, we may perceive someone as toxic, but they may just not have matured yet.
- You know what else looks alike? Three measures of wheat flour and three measures of wheat flour with a handful of yeast mixed in. No one can tell just from looking at both piles initially, or even when each is made into dough. But over time, one will rise and the other will not. The kingdom of heaven in our midst may likewise be imperceptible, hidden among all the worldly matters that manifest themselves in the headlines or within our neighborhoods or towns. But like mustard seeds, the kingdom blossoms and grows among us, microscopically at first, but eventually large enough to give a home for many.
- At the Last Supper, Jesus assures the disciples that "in my Father's house there are many dwelling places" (John 14:2). As the mustard bush provides many dwelling places for birds, the kingdom provides many dwelling places for us. With God's grace, we spend our lives nurturing the mustard bush so that it continues to grow and expand, inviting more and more disciples to flock in its branches.

How can I nurture the kingdom of God in my community, drawing more and more others to dwell inside it?

Duties and Responsibilities of Parents

(Excerpts from the Diocesan Norms for the Preparation for and Celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation and First Penance)

For parents whose child or children are in the second year of preparation for First Penance and Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Holy Communion: Parents ...

- Have the right and the duty to be involved in preparing their children for the reception of the sacraments
- Are encouraged to support their child/children by going to confession regularly and speaking about God's love and mercy in their child's moral formation
- Are to assist their child/children with the memorization of Act of Contrition.
- Are to accompany their child/children to Sunday (Or Saturday evening) Mass, initiating their child/children into the worshipping community and encouraging them to participate as fully as possible. ***(Starting on August 9 and every Sunday thereafter, children and youth who are in their second year of preparation for Confirmation and First Holy Communion are to attend 11 a.m. Mass to be seated in the first two rows in the front).***
- Are to ensure their child/children regularly attends a parish or home catechetical program.

Act of Contrition

Here is the Act of Contrition from the Order of Penance of 2023:

O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do, because by sinning I have offended you, who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin. Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.

MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third

Orders Regular and Secular;

- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic

Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and

female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by

his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

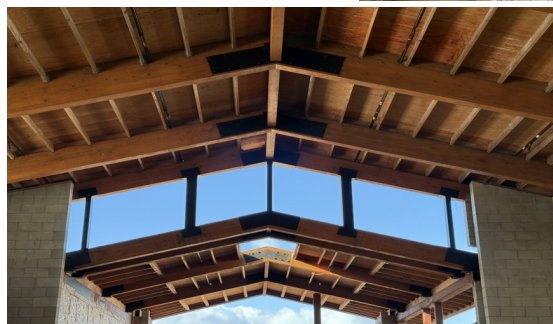
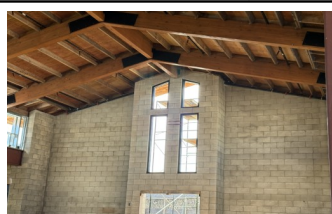
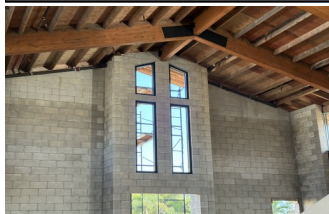
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
