

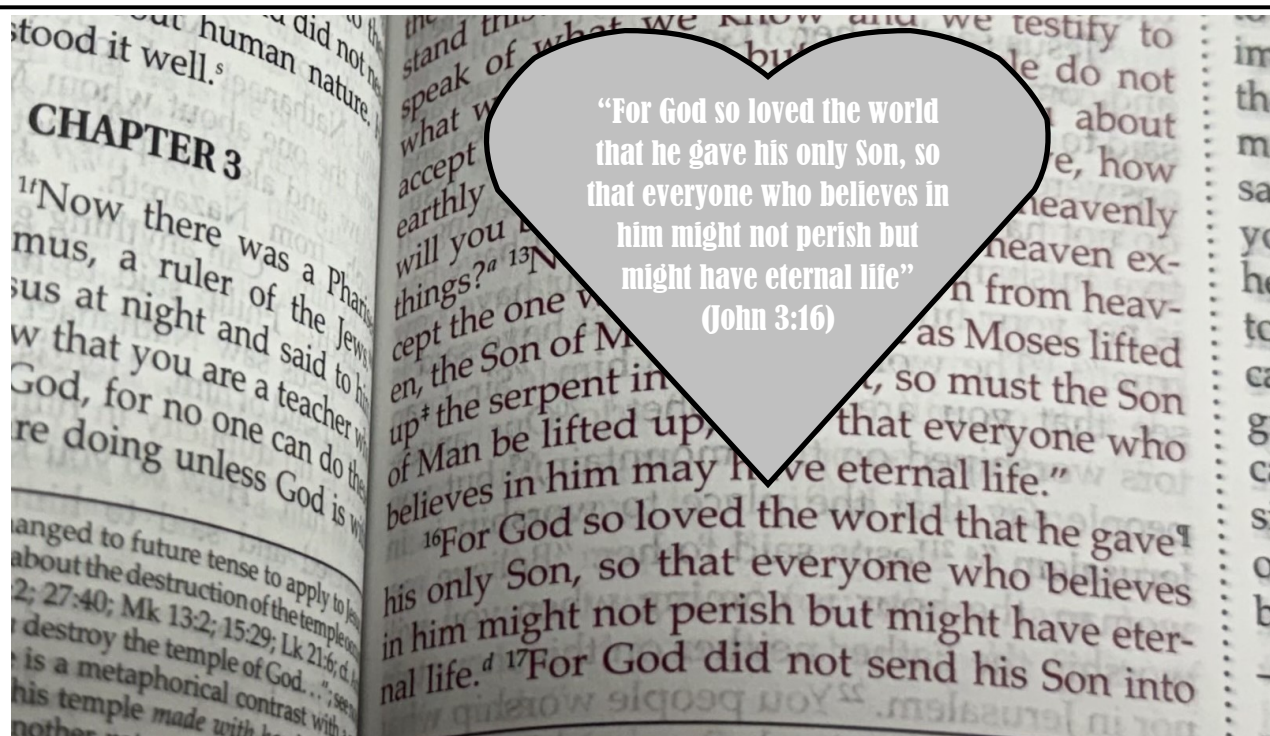

# PASTOR'S PAGE

## Points of Reflection

- “The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity,” God says to Moses in the first reading (Exodus 34:6). It is interesting that God uses a description that does not include the first words that may come to mind regarding the divine essence: words like all-powerful, all-knowing, infinite, or perfect. These words are true, of course, but God instead chooses to use words that are relational. God cannot be any of these things—merciful or gracious, kind or faithful—without someone else. But the fact that God is three persons means that God is relational from the start. Indeed, Jesus relies on these qualities when he faces his suffering and death. He relies on his faith that the Father is merciful to him, is gracious to him, is faithful to him. He also relies on these qualities when he promises the Holy Spirit to his disciples. Our God is a relational God, and God’s mercy, grace, love, and fidelity to us reflects these qualities among Father, Son, and Spirit.
- God’s generosity is strongly reflected in today’s readings. God’s self-description to Moses relates God’s generosity with mercy, grace, forgiveness, kindness, and faithfulness. Perhaps the ultimate example of God’s generosity comes in God’s Son—a gift to the world in the incarnation who gives himself over to death on the cross. As John points out, God is also generous with salvation. It is available to anyone who believes in the Son. Finally, God has given us the Holy Spirit, who remains with us always. Generosity is another relational quality, needing another person to be generous to.
- We cannot be all-powerful, all-knowing, infinite, or perfect. Nor can we bring salvation to the world. However, we can be merciful, gracious, slow to anger, kind, faithful, loving, and generous. The qualities that God puts first and foremost as godlike are qualities we can have—and use—as well. When we forgive and bear with one another, act kindly, give of ourselves, and love each other, we are acting as God self-identifies.

## Infant Baptism

Infant Baptism in June will be on June 20, Saturday, at 10:00 a.m. with preparation class for parents and godparents on June 13, Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Infant baptism is for children under seven (7) years old. Parents, please pick up a baptism packet either at the registration table after each Mass or parish office, Monday to Friday, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Deadline for application is June 5, 2026.

Qualifications for godparents:

- ◆ Must have completed 16 years of age
- ◆ Fully initiated Roman Catholic having received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist
- ◆ Practicing Catholic means coming to Mass regularly and living the Catholic faith
- ◆ If married, marriage must be in the Catholic Church and if single, not cohabitating

## Registration for Religious Education

Registration for all classes in Religious Education is going on with deadline set for July 5. We have to order books and educational materials on July 7<sup>th</sup>. Parents: registration after July 5 is subject to additional fee as we would have to order additional materials. Please know or be reminded that shipping charges to Hawaii from the mainland are high. Which class to register for:

- ◆ CFC1 (Confirmation and First Communion, Year 1) For first graders or second graders who missed last year's CFC1
- ◆ CFC1, Grades 3 to 5
- ◆ CFC1, Grades 6 to 8
- ◆ CFC1, High school
- ◆ CFC2, Second graders (Confirmation and First Communion, Year 2)
- ◆ CFC2, Grades 3 to 5
- ◆ CFC2, Grades 6 to 8
- ◆ CFC1, high School
- ◆ FI, Grades 3 to 5 (FI – Fully initiated)

NOTE: CFC2 means the children were in CFC1 in Catechetical Year 2025 to 2026

## MEMORANDUM

**TO: All the Faithful**

**FROM:** Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

**DATE:** May 25, 2026

**RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu**

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third Orders Regular and Secular;
- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

**The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).**

# MASTER PLAN UPDATE

As the Diocese continues the financial system conversions there are the gradual report updates received by the Parish. Progress continues albeit with several rain event interruptions. We are currently preparing for 5 separate Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours with control joints/saw cuts to prevent the floors from cracking. Concrete will then be ground & polished to show some of the aggregate. The Sanctuary, Baptismal Font, and possibly the center aisle will have a Mapei floor coating applied over the concrete.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining has commenced with roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing to follow. Simultaneously fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting & RTU AC curbs are being installed. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

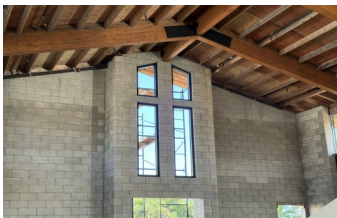
This will be followed by DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the windows and the completions of the data com, electrical, and unisex restrooms. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry is scheduled to arrive and installed in the July-August time frame. Interior work will take place over the next few months following that.
