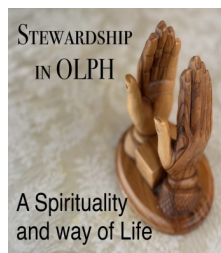

PASTOR'S PAGE

Points of Reflection

- We all have times when we feel the need to be alone. We may be depressed, or grouchy, or overwhelmed, or just plain tired. In the Gospel today, Jesus was grieving when he sought a deserted spot to be by himself. But when seeing the crowds following him, "his heart was moved with pity for them" (Matthew 14:14). The Greek word Matthew uses is perhaps closer in meaning to guts; either way, this implies that the feeling comes from deep inside him and is as physical as mental. This visceral feeling drives Jesus to change his plans, teach the vast number of pilgrims, cure those who were sick, and, his heart still moved with pity, feed the entire crowd. Let us pray that when we see others in need even when we wish to be left alone, our hearts will be moved to help, and in our guts we will know we should reach out.
- Easily overlooked in the account of the feeding of the multitudes is that no distinctions are made among the people in the crowd. No division is made between those who believed and those who just tagged along, between those who had plenty of food back home and those who often went hungry, between those who were Jewish and those who were not, between the disciples themselves and the crowd, or among men, women, and children: "they all ate and were satisfied" (Matthew 14:20). Jesus did not separate the people by religion or baptism or race or ethnicity or immigration status or criminality or age or gender or any other criteria, nor did he discriminate in any way. All were seated. All were served. All were satisfied.
- Jesus' non-discriminatory generosity mirrors the Father's abundant generosity, which is celebrated in the responsorial psalm. Jesus models that generosity every time he dines with a Roman collaborator (as tax collectors were stereotyped), forgives an adulterer, befriends a prostitute, or eats with sinners. After all, he was sent in order to save sinners. All sinners. In fact, the first person to follow him into the kingdom of God was a criminal: the thief who was crucified alongside him.

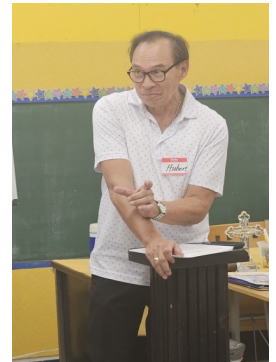


OCIA Corner

MEMORANDUM

TO: All the Faithful

FROM: Rev. Alfred Omar B. Guerrero, Director of the Office of Worship, Diocese of Honolulu

DATE: May 25, 2026

RE: Plenary Indulgences for Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis in the Diocese of Honolulu

On the occasion of the Year of Saint Francis, which runs until January 2027, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father), also applicable in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory:

1) to members:

- of the Franciscan Families of the First, Second and Third

Orders Regular and Secular;

- of Institutes of Consecrated Life, Societies of Apostolic

Life and public or private associations of the faithful, male and female, who observe the Rule of Saint Francis or are inspired by his spirituality or perpetuate his charism in any form;

2) to all the faithful without distinction

who, **with a heart detached from sin, participate in the Year of Saint Francis by visiting, in the form of a pilgrimage, any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to Saint Francis or connected to him for any reason**, and there devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God so that, following the example of Saint Francis, feelings of Christian charity towards their neighbors and authentic vows of harmony and peace among peoples may spring forth in their hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Clare and all the Saints of the Franciscan Family.

The elderly, the sick and those who take care of them, and all those who are unable to leave their homes for serious reasons may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence, provided they detach themselves from any sin and intend to fulfil the three usual conditions as soon as possible, if they unite themselves spiritually to the jubilee celebrations of the Year of Saint Francis, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains or sufferings of their lives.

The designated pilgrimage sites by Bishop Larry Silva in the Diocese of Honolulu are: Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa (Honolulu), St. Francis Church (Kalaupapa), Holy Trinity Church (Kuliouou), St. Rita Church (Nanakuli), Immaculate Conception Church (Lihue), Christ the King Church (Kahului), St. Damien Church (Kaunakakai), Sacred Hearts (Lanai), St. Michael the Archangel Church (Kailua-Kona), and St. Joseph Church (Hilo).

MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

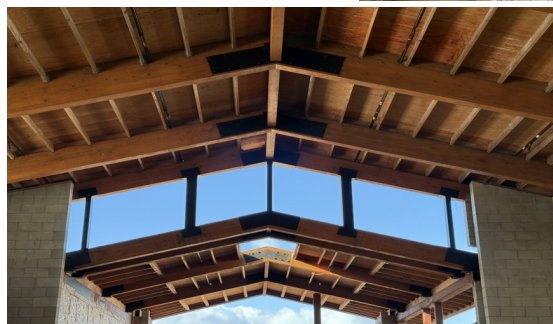
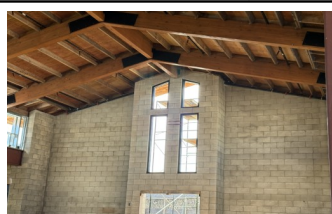
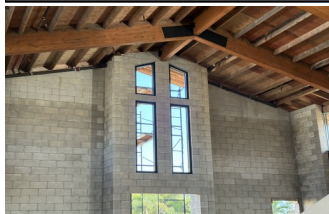
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
