Points of Reflection

- By this point, Peter had witnessed Jesus performing many miracles, from the multiplication of the loaves and fishes to walking on water. He had seen him heal the sick, restore sight to the blind, and drive out demons. But when Peter identifies him as "the Christ, the Son of the living God," Jesus says that it is his Father who has revealed this to him, not what he has witnessed him do in the flesh (Matthew 16:16). It is the gift of faith, which Peter received from God the Father, that enables him to identify the Son. We received the gift of faith from God in baptism, and through that gift God's Son is also revealed to us. What others may see as bread and wine, we recognize as our Lord's Body and Blood as we receive it in the Eucharist.
- We are Jesus' disciples, so he asks us now just as he'd asked the Twelve then, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). Our answer may depend on the stage of life we're in, the recency of traumatic events, or our tendency to doubt. May we rest assured that Jesus is always ready to be recognized, through prayer, through the Word, through the Eucharist, or through our neighbor. Answering this question may always be a challenge, but we pray that we may continue to grow in wisdom and understanding.
- While Saint Peter immediately identifies Jesus as the Messiah as the rest of the apostles struggle with the question, Saint Paul grapples with the fact that so many of the people Jesus came to save don't accept him as the Messiah. He concludes that trying to understand God's plan is impossible: "How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways!" (Romans 11:33). This is where the gift of faith comes in. Paul famously did not receive that gift until traveling the road to Damascus to persecute those who had already received the gift. Peter's own faith wavered on the choppy waters of the Sea of Galilee. Hebrews says, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Blest are we to have been given this gift without being able to understand the mind of God.

If you or someone you know needs any of the initiation sacraments as shown below, it is not too late to join the group. See us under the tent or call the parish office, Tuesday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

- > Full initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist or first holy communion)
- > Completion of initiation sacraments. If you were baptized in the Catholic Church and now needs Confirmation and First Holy Communion
- > You have a valid baptism from a non-Catholic church and now would like to be received into full communion of the Catholic Church

Infant Baptism

Children under seven years of age are baptized under the Order of Baptism of Children. The next infant baptism is on September 19 with preparation class for parents and godparents on September 12. See us under the tent for forms or any questions. Some common questions we receive from parents are:

- > Can their child be baptized even if they are not married in the Catholic Church? The answer is YES. The requirements are: one or both parents are Catholic and that they will raise the child in the Catholic faith. Of course we add: maybe it's time for them to be married in the Catholic Church but we emphasize that marriage of the parents in the Catholic Church is not a "must" because we do not punish the children for the sin of their parents.
- > How many godparents can they have? One is required, either male or female. If you have two godparents, you must have one female and one male. Can they have more than two? Two primary godparents, a male and a female whose names will be in the baptism register. You can have secondary godparents.

OLPH Commemorative Book 2026

3. Personal Message or Business Ads: This option is now sold out as of 17 August 2026. However, there is a waiting list should pages become available, first come-first served. Your family may share a message of best wishes, sentiments of congratulations, etc. You can also use this space to advertise your business. Given a space, you have to provide a PDF, print-ready copy by the end of October to grotttopics26@gmail.com. For a full page, there is a cost of \$200. Half a page is \$100 and one quarter of a page is \$50. Make sure you submit your print-ready copy by the end of September. Include your name and phone number in the email so we know how to contact you.

4. The book will include a collage of parishioners standing in front of the grotto that houses the statue of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. If you have a picture of you or a loved one (living or deceased) in front of the Grotto you may submit it to be included in the collage. It can be in front of the old church on Ft. Weaver Rd. or in front of this existing church. Space is an issue, therefore when you submit your picture electronically, the date you submit it will be noted and the use of the pictures will be on a first come, first served basis. MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

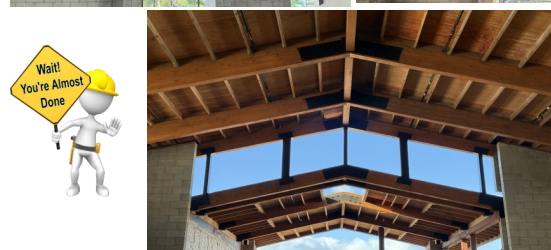
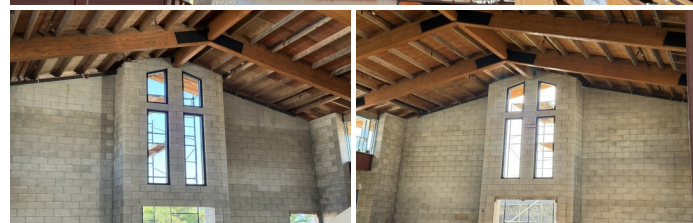
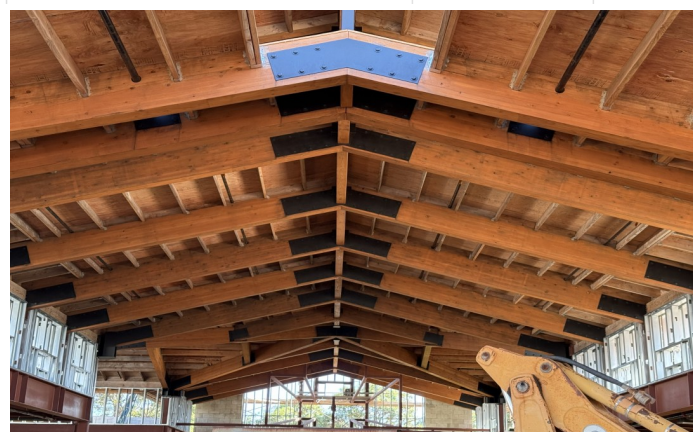
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
