PETER'S QUESTION

"How many times should I forgive my brother?"

JESUS' ANSWER

'NOT SEVEN, BUT SEVENTY TIMES SEVEN'
(emphasizing unlimited forgiveness)

THE LESSON

FORGIVENESS FROM THE HEART

Just as God has forgiven us an immeasurable debt, we are called to forgive others completely. Failure to forgive leads to severe consequences. Forgive freely and unlimitedly.

1. A GREAT DEBT FORGIVEN

A servant owed the King an immense, unpayable debt.

COMPASSION AND MERCY

The King felt pity and canceled his enormous debt.

2. A SMALL DEBT UNFORGIVEN

The forgiven servant found a fellow servant who owed him a few hundred denarii.

He demanded payment and threw him into prison.

3. THE KING'S JUDGMENT

Other servants were outraged and reported it. The King was furious.

"YOU WICKED SERVANT! I FORGAVE ALL THAT DEBT BECAUSE YOU BEGGED ME."

"Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant?"

Points of Reflection

- In a way, today's Gospel is a logical extension of the golden rule. Earlier, Jesus taught his disciples, "Do to others whatever you would have them do to you" (Matthew 7:12). Today's parable teaches them: Forgive others as you would have them forgive you. He closes with the kicker: God will forgive you as you forgive others. None of us is sinless. None of us always does the right thing. None of us is proud of our weakest moment. Yes, we may be in the right in whatever case is leading to our resentment or anger. But if we don't forgive the person who injured us, we can't expect forgiveness from God, let alone a neighbor we ourselves have wronged.
- It is one thing to forgive a minor slight, but forgiving a terrible crime is tremendously difficult. Life in prison without parole and the death penalty are consequences applied in our country to punish those found guilty of a terrible crime. Many people would say that they deserve it. As justified as we may feel in applying these sentences, both Jesus and Sirach invite us to live in a world where even the worst violence can be forgiven. Neither promises it to be easy, but it does release the burden of leaving wrath and anger to fester in our hearts.
- The king in Jesus' parable is so extravagant with his mercy that he doesn't just allow the servant to delay repayment of his debt, he forgives the debt altogether. Like the father of the prodigal son or Jesus on the cross forgiving the ones who put him to death, this king is merciful beyond expectations. He is moved with compassion and this leads him to mercy without limit. He has chosen to make his world one of mercy. The servant, on the other hand, cannot appreciate the gift he's been given. He lives in a world where anger and debts fester and never truly are forgiven. He cannot accept such profligate mercy because it makes the logic of his dog-eat-dog world senseless. We can choose the world we make. May we choose correctly.

Question of the Week

Reconciliation means making a relationship whole again. Whom do I need to forgive to make our relationship whole once more?

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MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

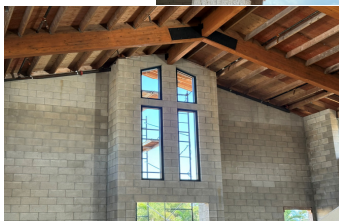
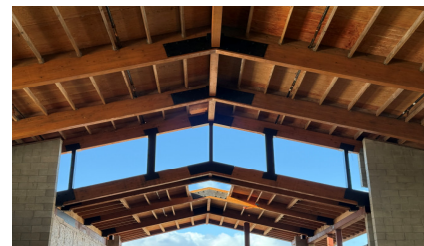
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
