Points of Reflection

- You can almost hear laborers who worked all day crying out, "It's not fair!" They're right, of course. It really isn't fair. They worked a lot longer and a lot harder and at the end of the day received the same amount. Even viewed from the landowner's perspective, it's wrongheaded. Who is going to volunteer to work all day the following day, knowing that they could show up with an hour to go and get the same pay? But, as the landowner says, he did not cheat anyone. The dedicated workers received exactly what they were promised: a just wage. The landowner's generosity to the latecomers doesn't change the amount they received at all, which is what they agreed to in the first place. Yet, while the latecomers feel grateful, the others feel envy and resentment.
- But remember how Jesus begins his parable. He compares the kingdom of heaven not to any of the workers, but to the landowner. The generosity of the landowner illustrates the kingdom, not the reaction of any of the workers. God is generous beyond expectation, beyond reason, beyond fairness. We are the workers, the recipients of God's generosity. We are all sinners. We all have sinned against God and against others. We all have needed forgiveness. Like the latecomers in the parable, we are unworthy of the reward we will receive. But in God's infinite mercy, we are all able to receive the ultimate reward
- We are called to increase the generosity in our hearts so that we may imitate God's generosity in the way we give of ourselves to others, appreciate the generosity given to others without resentment or envy, and accept humbly the generosity of mercy and forgiveness when we do not deserve it. By doing so, we may, as Saint Paul put it, "conduct [ourselves] in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ" (Philippians 1:27)

Question of the Week

When have I resented the generosity shown to someone else? When have I failed to realize the generosity shown to me?

1. Family Photos. We are already one month into the picture taking for our Commemorative Book. Please sign up for an appointment to have your family take a family portrait because space is limited. There is a \$15 fee for which you will receive a copy of the portrait to take home and an electronic copy will be sent to you so you can print more copies. Your portrait will then become part of the Parishioner's section in the book. Only those who take their photos with our photographer will be put in the book. If you wish to have your pictures taken the soonest or taken on a week day, please call the Parish office at 808-689-8681 to make your appointment. On the day and time of your appointment, bring your family to the church (former Blessed Sacrament chapel at the back of the church), and your portrait will be taken.

2. Book sales. The sales of the book are by pre-order only. If you wish to pre-order the book, see us after Mass under the tent outside. The cost of the book is just \$35.00. Make checks out to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church or you may pay with Cash or Card.

3. Personal Message or Business Ads: This option is now sold out as of 17 August 2026. However, there is a waiting list should pages become available, first come-first served. Your family may share a message of best wishes, sentiments of congratulations, etc. You can also use this space to advertise your business. Given a space, you have to provide a PDF, print-ready copy by the end of October to grotttopics26@gmail.com. For a full page, there is a cost of \$200. Half a page is \$100 and one quarter of a page is \$50. Make sure you submit your print-ready copy by the end of October. Include your name and phone number in the email so we know how to contact you.

4. The book will include a collage of parishioners standing in front of the grotto that houses the statue of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. If you have a picture of you or a loved one (living or deceased) in front of the Grotto you may submit it to be included in the collage. It can be in front of the old church on Ft. Weaver Rd. or in front of this existing church. MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Diocese continues the rollout of the new financial system to the parishes along with gradual report updates. Progress continues across several fronts; Slab on Grade (SOG) Pours, interior wall framing, RTU AC units & 2 smaller package units installed, and Data Com room completed with power.

Glu Lam Beam sanding & staining is complete as well as roof sheathing, roofing and fireproofing. Fire sprinklers, HVAC ducting is complete with the exception for exterior ducting from AC units. This will be followed by the rough-in of lighting, audio visual speakers, and cameras.

The raised Sanctuary concrete pour is being scheduled with forms in place. This pour will be more complex with stairs and recessed sections to accommodate tile.

DensGlass/Flashings around the metal stud light gauge framing for the clerestory windows has commenced along with the installation of unisex restroom drywall. The restroom ceilings will be insulated & closed. Pews, celebrant chairs, prie dieu, podium, and ambry are scheduled to arrive and installed in the October/November time frame. Interior work has commenced with the placement of light fixtures, speakers, and cameras followed by insulation and drywall installation in the ceiling.

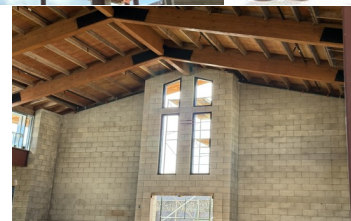
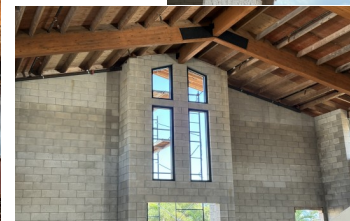
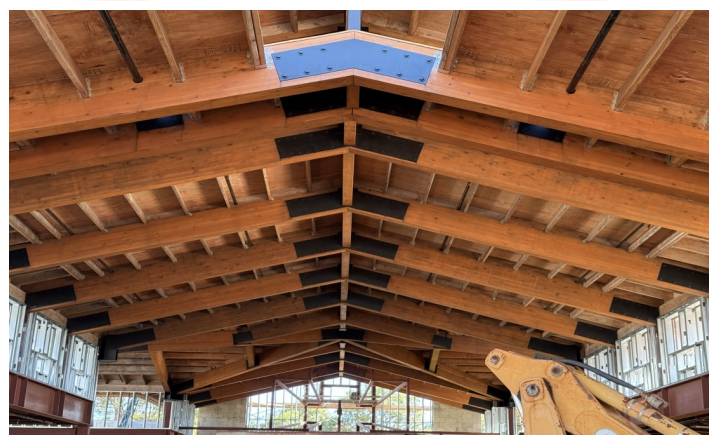
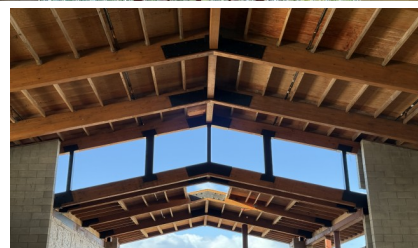
Exterior & site work will run from August thru November.
