- It is not a surprise to see Peter out on the sea fishing. He was, after all, a fisherman. Without Jesus to lead him, Peter returns to his old vocation. It is also unsurprising to see him fishing at night. From the middle of the sea, he won't be able to hear the rooster crowing at dawn, that daily reminder of his betrayal on that fateful morning. Finally, it was inevitable that their labor produce nothing; the same thing happened before they encountered Jesus the first time. Symbolically, the contrast between their catch without Jesus (zero) and with Jesus (one hundred fifty-three, thought to represent all the known species) cannot be starker. At last, Peter realizes that his true vocation is to "catch" disciples from every place on earth.
- After Jesus had been arrested and taken away, Peter stood by a charcoal fire to warm himself when he was accused three times of being one of Jesus' disciples. Now, after Jesus has died and risen and returned to reveal himself to his disciples, he and Peter are again surrounding a charcoal fire when Jesus asks him three times if he loves him. Jesus had known that Peter would deny him three times. Now he gives him the opportunity to reconcile with him three times. By allowing Peter to make amends, Jesus forgives him. Though we do not hear the cock crow at all, we are told all this happens after dawn. With dawn, a new day for Peter and all the disciples arises.
- We hear Peter answer Jesus in the Gospel, but we see him show his love and loyalty to Jesus in the first reading. The Sanhedrin were determined to prevent any mention of Jesus, let alone preaching and teaching in his name. Not only does Peter *not* deny Jesus, he proudly and courageously testifies to Jesus' glory and declares that he will follow God's orders and not theirs. Peter has put his convictions into action. He has given his fellow disciples, then and now, a model to follow.



Simala Shrine

DAY 1: FLIGHT TO MANILA

Your pilgrimage begins today, boarding your international flight to the Philippines capital of Manila. Rest assured, all necessary preparations for your trip have been made. Just sit back, relax, and enjoy your flight. Your spiritual journey starts here.

DAY 2: ARRIVE IN MANILA

You will land at Ninoy Aquino International Airport in Manila and change flights to board your flight to Ilo-Ilo. Upon arrival, you will meet your Nativity Pilgrimage tour guide and check into your hotel for the evening. Dinner & overnight accommodations will be at your hotel.

DAY 3: ILO-ILO

After breakfast, we will begin our tour of Ilo-Ilo at Casa Marikit, sometimes known as Javelina-Lopez Heritage House, the oldest existing heritage house in Ilo-Ilo, constructed in 1803. Next, we will visit the Molo Church, a neogothic Roman Catholic Church recognized as "the women's church" or "the feminist church" because it only features images of female saints inside, including Saint Anne, the patron saint of Molo. Our tour continues, stopping at the Samson Montinola House, Lopez House, Casa Real, Calle Real, and Ilo-Ilo City Hall. After lunch, we will learn about Iloilo's cultural heritage at the Museo Ilo-Ilo, followed by the Philippine Maritime History Museum. Today's tour will also include visits to Fort San Pedro, Muelle Loney, and Explanade 8. Tonight, enjoy a native barbecue dinner out and sample some of the local cuisine. Overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 4: ILO-ILO / CENTENNIAL OF THE DOMINICAN SISTERS OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY-ILOILO

After breakfast, we will spend time at Iro Cathedral for prayer. After lunch, we will visit the Dominican Motherhouse and explore the museum. We will return to our hotel this afternoon to relax before celebrating "Fast Day" Mass this evening, followed by a sponsored dinner reception for clergy, religious, and Honolulu Delegates. Overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 5: DOMINICAN JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

After breakfast, we will join the Centennial Celebration of the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary of the Philippines. At 10:00 am, we will attend a Thanksgiving Mass at Santa Ana Parish Iloilo City with Eminence Jose F. Cardinal Adriaens. Archbishop of Manila, at the Ilo-Ilo Convention Center. After lunch, we will continue our tour with visits to San Joaquin Church, Tigbauan Church, Magao Church (UNESCO World Heritage Site), and Camila Balay na Bato. Tonight, enjoy a buffet dinner with your fellow pilgrims. Overnight accommodations will be at your hotel.

DAY 6: FLIGHT TO CEBU

After breakfast, we will spend time at the Biscocho and Baquillas Houses before transferring to the airport, where we will board our flight to Cebu. Upon arrival in Cebu, we will begin a half-day tour of the city, including Siron Garden, the Temple of Leah, and the Twin Temple. After lunch, we will check in at our hotel to rest and freshen up. Tonight, we will enjoy a nice dinner at Tops of Cebu. Overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 7: CEBU

After breakfast, we will visit the Basilica Minore Del Santo Niño and Magellan's Cross. After lunch, we will visit the Metropolitan Cathedral, explore Fort San Pedro, and see the Church of the Holy Child. Tonight's dinner will be at Lantaw Restaurant. Overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 8: SIMALA

After breakfast, our bus will pick us up from the hotel at 8:00 am. Our first stop today will be at the Simala Shrine, also known as the Monastery of the Holy Eucharist, a Roman Catholic pilgrimage church dedicated to the Virgin Mary, constructed in 1998 by the Marian Monks of Eucharistic Adoration. After lunch, we will visit more local churches and enjoy some of the local cuisine at the Carcar Pasalubong Center. Dinner tonight will be at House of Lechon. Overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 9: FLIGHT TO MANILA

After breakfast, we will check out of your hotel and proceed to the airport for our flight back to Manila. We will meet our Nativity Pilgrimage Tour Coordinator upon arrival and have lunch. After checking into our hotel, you will have a

DAY 10: MANILA

After breakfast, we will travel to Batangas. Midway, we will stop to celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Martin de Tours in Taal. After lunch, we will explore the Caysay Shrine and Santa Lucia Well. We will then travel by bus to Tagaytay via Lenary Mountain Highway, which has the finest view of the Taal Volcano! Finally, we will visit the Pink Sisters Convent and Chapel. After dinner, we will head back to Manila for overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 11: BATANGAS / TAGAYTAY

After breakfast, we will travel to Batangas. Midway, we will stop to celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Martin de Tours in Taal. After lunch, we will explore the Caysay Shrine and Santa Lucia Well. We will then travel by bus to Tagaytay via Lenary Mountain Highway, which has the finest view of the Taal Volcano! Finally, we will visit the Pink Sisters Convent and Chapel. After dinner, we will head back to Manila for overnight accommodations at your hotel.

DAY 12: RETURN FLIGHT HOME

After breakfast at the hotel, we will check out and attend a final Mass (time permitting) before proceeding to the airport for our return flight home.

MASTERPLAN UPDATE

Our biggest concern is the delivery of structural steel & storefront doors and the potential delays to overall schedule & cost. Design Build Hawaii (DBH) is currently seeking updates from Parsons, the steel fabricator, on the delivery date of structural steel after missing the anticipated delivery in January 2025. We have confirmation from Arcadia that fabrication of our storefront doors is underway.

Stormwater retention & drainage system excavation and connection is complete and backfilled adjacent to the existing church. Excavation between drains A1 & A2 is partially completed to North Rd. due to our current electrical service line obstructing the path of the drain line. DBH is renewing the trenching permit & awaiting HECO sign-off to complete the section from front of church to the box drain in North Road. Crews are working on the drain line section between A4 & A5.

- ◆ CMU wall installation has been completed by Affiliated Construction short of top-of-wall. An issue arose where several tube steel columns need to be installed. Without these columns Affiliated Construction is unable to complete top-of-wall. Details for tube steel columns have been released by Mutual Welding to a local shop for fabrication.
- ◆ HECO has approved switchboard submittal from Roy's Electric & DPP has also given approval of electrical panel installation once the CMU walls are completed with a temporary roof.
- ◆ Lifeline prepared final pricing & contract documents for review & approval of monitored security system. Meeting being scheduled to discuss.
- ◆ Sauder Worship finalized & executed pricing for furnishings; celebrant chairs, ambry, credence table, etc. These items will ship together with the pews.
- ◆ Artesanos Don Bosco has completed the carvings on the stations of the cross that have been reviewed by Frs. Ed & Kurt.
- ◆ Data Com meeting scheduled with Comtel & Pacific Direct Connect to discuss & finalize details for wiring through conduit versus microwave on 1/28/25.
