A Message from Fr. Patrick

Hello!

I am Reverend Father Patrick MPETE EBALA-LING, a priest of the Society of African Missions (SMA). I was born on July 6, 1984, in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). I come from a large family of ten children, including 2 girls and 8 boys, and I am the ninth child. I entered the seminary in 2006, completed one year of propedeutics (preparatory), three years of philosophy (in Congo), one year of novitiate in the Republic of Benin, one year of pastoral experience in Ghana, three years of theology in the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, one year of diaconal internship, and finally, I was ordained a priest on May 8, 2016, in the DRC. After my ordination, I pursued higher studies (5 years) in agronomic and veterinary sciences. Therefore, I hold a Master's degree in Animal Science.

I enjoy reading, working for community development, I like cultivating the field, I enjoy raising animals (pigs, goats, chickens, cattle...), I also enjoy working with poor people and the homeless. Since last year, I have been appointed as the pastor of a young parish (St. Thomas Aquinas, 5 years old) on the outskirts of the

Archdiocese of Kinshasa (170 km away). We serve 13 outstations, which are very distant from each other across the parish.

I am here in the USA to share my missionary experience with you and to find potential benefactors who can support the SMA mission in Congo and especially our young parish that is striving to take flight.

The Better Part

In this Sunday's Gospel, we are invited into the home of Martha and Mary, two sisters who welcome Jesus in very different ways. Martha, the ever-dedicated hostess, is busy with the tasks of hospitality—preparing, serving, and ensuring everything is just right. Meanwhile, Mary chooses to sit at the feet of Jesus, listening intently to His words.

Martha, feeling overwhelmed and frustrated, turns to Jesus for help. "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?" she asks. But Jesus gently responds, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her."

This exchange reminds us of something essential: in the midst of our busy lives, our first call is to be pre-



sent with the Lord. Like Martha, we all have responsibilities and good work to do, but we must not allow those tasks to pull us away from the One who gives our work meaning. Mary's choice to pause and listen to Jesus is not a dismissal of Martha's service—it is a reminder that our activity must be grounded in prayer and relationship with God.

This week, let us consider how we might better balance our *"doing"* with our *"being"*—to take time in stillness, in prayer, and in quiet reflection. For in choosing to sit with Christ, we too choose the better part.
