Financial update

November brought an encouraging shift in St. John's financial picture. The General Fund recorded a surplus of **\$26,466**, the strongest month of 2025. This one month reduced the year-to-date deficit from **-\$54,948** to **-\$28,481**, giving us welcome momentum as we approach year-end.

Envelope Giving: Encouraging Progress

Envelope Giving in November totaled **\$49,367**, one of the highest November levels in recent years. This response arrived at an important moment and reflects the steady commitment of our congregation.

While giving remains below our annual target and below last year, November's improvement was significant. Continued strong support in December will help us maintain this positive trajectory.

Expenses Remain Under Budget

Total November expenses were **\$34,600**, well below the monthly budget. Savings continue from:

- The Associate Pastor vacancy, and
- Careful management of ministry and operational expenses.

Facility costs were elevated this month due to a required repair on one of the elevators, but overall spending remains well controlled.

Overall Position

As of November 30, the General Fund deficit stands at **-\$28,481**, a substantial improvement from earlier in the year. December has traditionally been our strongest giving month, and with continued generosity, we are hopeful for a solid finish to 2025.

Thank you for your faithful support of St. John's ministry and mission.



Our book club has chosen the next book we will be reviewing
The Four Winds by Kristin Hannah

Texas, 1921. A time of abundance. The Great War is over, the bounty of the land is plentiful, and America is on the brink of a new and optimistic era. But for Elsa Wolcott, deemed too old to marry in a time when marriage is a woman's only option, the future seems bleak. Until the night she meets Rafe Martinelli and decides to change the direction of her life. With her reputation in ruin, there is only one respectable choice: marriage to a man she barely knows. By 1934, the world has changed; millions are out of work and drought has devastated the Great Plains. Farmers are fighting to keep their land and their livelihoods as crops fail and water dries up and the earth cracks open. Dust storms roll relentlessly across the plains. Everything on the Martinelli farm is dying, including Elsa's tenuous marriage; each day is a desperate battle against nature and a fight to keep her children alive. In this uncertain and perilous time, Elsa—like so many of her neighbors—must make an agonizing choice: fight for the land she loves or leave it behind and go west, to California, in search of a better life for her family. *The Four Winds* is a rich, sweeping novel that stunningly brings to life the Great Depression and the people who lived through it—the harsh realities that divided us as a nation and the enduring battle between the haves and the have-nots. A testament to hope, resilience, and the strength of the human spirit to survive adversity, *The Four Winds* is an indelible portrait of America and the American dream, as seen through the eyes of one indomitable woman whose courage and sacrifice will come to define a generation.

Everyone is welcome. Plan on reading the book prior to attending the book review. Bring your thoughts and come share in the discussion. We plan on meeting on Tuesday afternoon **January 20th at 1:00 p.m.** We are meeting in the Parlor. We hope you will join us.
