April was another strong month for giving. Your envelope contributions totaled **\$44,923** — the fourth consecutive month above budget. Through the end of April, year-to-date envelope giving stands at **\$138,568, which is \$21,419 ahead of where we budgeted.** That sustained generosity is the foundation on which this church's ministry rests, and we do not take it for granted.

Looking at the full picture through four months, the church is **running about \$3,100 behind our year-to-date budget plan.** April brought a significant building project — we ordered a new standby generator — along with backflow protection work on our plumbing and HVAC repairs. The generator was paid for entirely from a designated grant fund and did not come out of your weekly offerings. The plumbing and HVAC work are necessary investments in the health and safety of our building.

Your music program received an outpouring of support in April, with more than \$2,650 in music-designated donations. Thank you to everyone who contributed — those gifts directly fund the instruments, licensing, and maintenance that enrich our worship each week.

HHH continues to serve families in our community and is supported through your HHH donations and a substantial grant from the Lutheran Foundation.

We are grateful for every dollar you give and for the trust you place in this congregation. Four months are behind us and we head deeper into spring with your generosity leading the way. If you ever want to know more about where things stand financially, just ask — your deacons and finance team are always glad to share.

Saint John UCC is hosting **Life Line Screening, Friday, June 12, 2026.**

Screenings are fast, painless and affordable. Three key tests check for blocked carotid arteries, an irregular heart rhythm called atrial fibrillation, and high blood pressure, which are the three leading risk factors for stroke.

Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and hardening of the arteries in the legs. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and c-reactive protein screenings, as well as take-home colon cancer early detection tests.

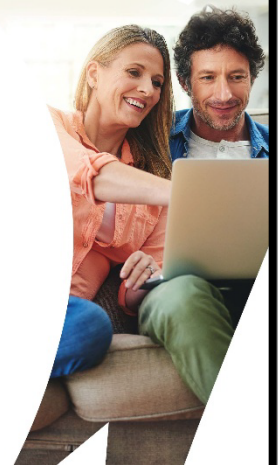

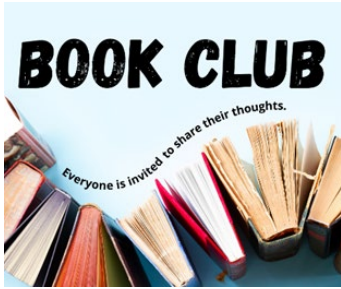


The children of St. John led the worship service on Sunday, May 17th. From the music to the message, our kiddos shared how they let their "light" shine.

Our book club has chosen the next book we will be reviewing: ***Ragtime*** by E.L. Doctorow.

The story opens in 1906 in New Rochelle, New York, at the home of an affluent American family. One lazy Sunday afternoon, the famous escape artist Harry Houdini swerves his car into a telephone pole outside their house. And almost magically, the line between fantasy and historical fact, between real and imaginary characters, disappears. Henry Ford, Emma Goldman, J. P. Morgan, Evelyn Nesbit, Sigmund Freud, and Emiliano Zapata slip in and out of the tale, crossing paths with Doctorow's imagined family and other fictional characters, including an immigrant peddler and a ragtime musician from Harlem whose insistence on a point of justice drives him to revolutionary violence. (Published in 1975, *Ragtime* changed our very concept of what a novel could be. An extraordinary tapestry, *Ragtime* captures the spirit of America in the era between the turn of the century and the First World War.)

Everyone is welcome. Plan on reading the book prior to attending the book review. Bring your thoughts and come to share the discussion. We plan to meet on Tuesday afternoon **June 23rd at 1:00 p.m.** We are meeting in the Atrium. We hope you will join us.

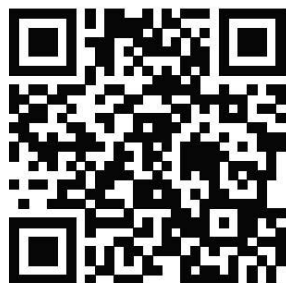
