Financial Update:

Giving and Growth We are pleased to report a strong start to the new year. Total Revenues for January reached **\$35,214.14**. This growth was driven by a healthy **\$25,693.58** in Envelope giving and a successful month for our Fund Raisers (formerly Special Events), which brought in **\$2,461.78**. We also received **\$2,405.00** in Special Offerings. It is important to note that a portion of the increase in our offerings this month was due to year-end gifts from 2025 being processed during the first week of January.

Expenses and Stewardship Total expenses for January were **\$32,371.73**, a significant decrease compared to the same time last year. Our facility costs were particularly low this month at **\$6,825.48**. This was due to a combination of favorable billing cycles for our utilities (including no electricity bill this month) and the timing of our annual insurance premiums.

Monthly Results Thanks to your continued generosity and diligent cost management, we ended January with a **Net Total surplus of \$2,842.41**. Our checking account remains healthy at **\$94,285.94**, and our total investments across our Edward Jones and Cornerstone accounts stand at **\$517,880.58**.
