Some Fun Facts about Older American Month

- Did you know that President J. F Kennedy, in 1963, designated May as Senior Citizens Month. It was later changed to Older American Month. Each year has a theme, with 2026 theme being 'Champion for your Health: Prevention, Wellness, and Personal Responsibility'.
- Prevention and Wellness: Encouraging regular health screenings, vaccinations and lifestyle choices that support long-term health.
- Personal Responsibility: Promoting self-advocacy and informed decision-making regarding diet, exercise and medical care.
- Seniors are encouraged to strengthen social connections and partnerships helping older adults maintain health and well-being.
- More than 10,000 'baby boomers reach the age of 65 each day, making it the fastest growing demographic group in the US.

- Seniors are tech-savvy. Over half of the US seniors are active online. They are connected to Facebook, social media, and shopping.
- Seniors are living longer. Today there are over 50,000 people over 100 years old. It is estimated there will be well over 400,000+ by 2050.
- Seniors have volunteer power. Over half of all seniors volunteer in some capacity.
- Studies show lifestyle choices influence over 70-% of aging characteristics. Physical activity and healthy dietary choices can slow the elder aging process.

March Financial Update:

March was a remarkable month for giving. Your envelope contributions totaled \$42,738 — the strongest single month of 2026. Through the end of March, year-to-date envelope giving stands at \$93,646, which is \$18,771 ahead of where we budgeted. That gap represents your generosity above and beyond what we planned for, and it matters enormously to the ministry of this church.

Looking at the full picture through the first quarter, we are running \$732 ahead of our year-to-date budget plan. March itself was an expensive month — annual property insurance, plumbing repairs, sprinkler maintenance, and a skylight replacement all came due at once, along with some benefit billing that arrived a month later than expected. Those costs are now behind us. The reason we absorbed them without disruption is straightforward: your faithfulness at the offering plate.

HHH hosted a Family Fun Night in March and continues to serve families in our community. HHH is supported through your HHH donations and a substantial grant for the Luthern Foundation.

We are grateful for every dollar you give and for the trust you place in this congregation. The first quarter is behind us and we head into spring on solid ground. If you ever want to know more about where things stand financially, just ask — your deacons and finance team are always glad to share.

Council Highlights

- Approved use of Faith Hall on August 29 for Kahok Booster Club Rock and Roll Bingo; sponsored by Abe Cyrus.
- A "School's Out Scavenger Hunt" Party for our youth will be held in May.
- Thanks to grants obtained by the Grants Team, Homework Help and Hoops (HHH) expenses are no longer needing support from the General Fund.
- March giving was exceptionally strong!
- Members of the Council and the Long Rangers met April 20 to plan for our transition as Pastor Jenn leaves.
- A generator has been purchased to provide power to Faith Hall in an emergency, potentially allowing it to be used as a shelter. A grant paid for the generator but we will pay for installation.
- A new garbage disposal has been ordered for Fellowship Hall.
- Approved installation of a separate water line in the Fellowship Hall kitchen; required by City regulations.
- Community Care has hired Kayla Abbott as the new Executive Director. She has been their Adult Day Program Director for several years.

Hand Bell Help!

Please help keep our Hand Bell Choir going strong. Our bells are in desperate need of refurbishment! Refurbishment is a complete overhaul of the bells including cleaning, polishing, repairing, and tuning. Our church organ and pianos are tuned twice a year, but it has been MANY years since our hand bells have gotten attention.

Our hand bells are very valuable and are an important part of our Music Ministry. A single hand bell can cost \$600 or more. A refurbishment of one octave of bells will cost \$1420. The first octave to be refurbished has 8 bells. St. John owns 5 octaves with a total of 61 bells.

Please consider giving to our bell fund. We plan to refurbish one octave of bells now and hope to continue until all 5 octaves are refurbished.

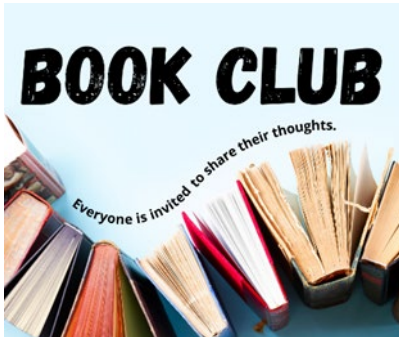

Our book club has chosen the next book we will be reviewing: **The Binding** by Bridget Collins.

Books are dangerous things in Collins's alternate universe, a place vaguely reminiscent of 19th-century England. It's a world in which people visit book binders to rid themselves of painful or treacherous memories. Once their stories have been told and are bound between the pages of a book, the slate is wiped clean and their memories lose the power to hurt or haunt them. After having suffered some sort of mental collapse and no longer able to keep up with his farm chores, Emmett Farmer is sent to the workshop of one such binder to live and work as her apprentice. Leaving behind home and family, Emmett slowly regains his health while learning the binding trade. He is forbidden to enter the locked room where books are stored, so he spends many months marbling end pages, tooling leather book covers, and gilding edges. But his curiosity is piqued by the people who come and go from the inner sanctum, and the arrival of the lordly Lucian Darnay, with whom he senses a connection, changes everything. An unforgettable novel of enchantment, mystery, memory, and forbidden love, *The Binding* is a beautiful homage to the allure and life-changing power of books—and a reminder to us all that knowledge can be its own kind of magic.

Everyone is welcome. Plan on reading the book prior to attending the book review. Bring your thoughts and come to share in the discussion. We plan to meet on Tuesday afternoon **May 19th at 1:00 p.m.** We are meeting in the Atrium. We hope you will join us.

I’m now our Care Ministry Team leader, and you’ll hear from me monthly! J Let me know if you want to help our team: mccallcarolyn@yahoo.com , 618-381-6411.

This is what we put in the recent Annual Congregational Meeting booklet: *The mission of the Care Ministry Team is to foster connections with members of the congregation who can no longer attend worship services and other church activities without assistance. This can include personal visits, sending cards, and making phone calls.*

Our team will meet in person twice a year. Our next meeting will be held on **May 17** after church, in the atrium. In addition to myself and Pastor Miranda, we already have more than a dozen members on board. Not all Care Team members do the same things; we’d love your help! Let me know if you can help ANY of these things:

- In-person visits
- Phone calls
- Send snail mail cards (Cards are on the narthex table each Sunday to be sent from the whole congregation PLUS I’ll begin coordinating “card showers” to all ages of our people who are having special joys/concerns.)
- Befriend new people who come to St. John (Not sure who’s new? Befriend EVERYONE! You don’t have to be an official Care Team member to do this.)
- Craft gifts- we need small prayer cloths (knitted, crocheted or sewn) or crosses to share with others. They fit in pockets; you hold the cloth or cross in your hand when you pray. They’re a reminder that together we are the hands of God.
- Special event help (including assisting with funeral luncheons at the church, delivering Christmas gift bags, etc.)

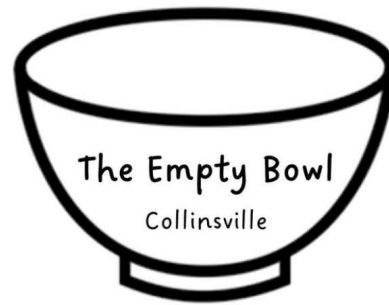
