Financial update

July 2025

Envelope giving for July came in at \$37,748, which is about \$1,500 below our budget and \$1,100 less than last July. On the income side, we brought in \$45,370, which fell short of our budget and last year's numbers. Expenses totaled \$55,606, resulting in a monthly deficit of around \$10,200. Last July, we had a surplus of \$6,500.

Looking at the year-to-date, envelope giving is at \$205,882, which is \$24,600 below budget and \$22,400 less than last year (a 10% drop). Total income through July is \$307,031, while expenses are \$343,060, leaving a deficit of \$36,029. This is more than double the shortfall we had at this time last year.

We're grateful for over \$12,000 in grants and the success of our special events, but our regular weekly and monthly giving has taken a hit. We need to find ways to strengthen this steady support to keep our ministry and commitments to St. John going.


HHH Tutors/Mentors are Needed!


Prayer ofr Compassion


God of compassion,
