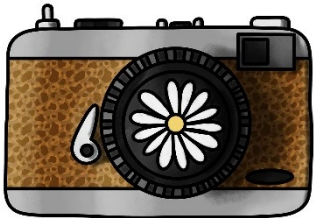


Youth Ministries **Italian Fest** Parking Fundraiser

The Italian Fest is September 18 and 19, which means it is time for Youth Ministries to block off the parking lots at St. John Church and volunteers to collect money to raise funds for the youth.

July Financial Stewardship Report

Gratitude in the Heart of Summer

As summer moves along, we give thanks for the faithfulness that carries St. John through every season. Your envelope giving has continued to run ahead of plan for the year — through July, envelope offerings are about \$13,300 (roughly 6%) ahead of budget. It is a steady, encouraging sign of the commitment so many of you make to the life and ministry of our church.

We also want to keep sharing an honest picture of where we stand. Through the first seven months, our expenses have outpaced our offerings, leaving the General Fund with a shortfall of about \$70,600 at this point in the year. Some of that reflects seasonal and one-time costs. Still, it is a good reminder that our ministry depends on steady, year-round generosity. If you are able to keep up — or increase — your regular offering, it truly helps keep us on solid footing.

We are grateful, too, for the way you supported our HHH ministry and this summer's youth camp. Thanks to your gifts and to generous grant support, these programs were very nearly funded in full — allowing our young people to take part without adding strain to the church's budget. Your gifts to these ministries go directly to the work they support.

This month we also give thanks for a generous memorial gift from the estate of Robert Karrer. Gifts like this, given in loving memory, become a lasting blessing to the congregation and a testimony to a life of faith.

Thank you for your continued faithfulness and generosity. If you have questions about giving or would like to set up electronic offerings, please reach out to the church office — we are always glad to help.

Dear St. John UCC members and friends of HHH:

On July 26th we wrapped up our 13th Annual HHH Summer Camp with a special song during service and the 2026 Art Show and reception during coffee hour. THANK YOU to all who attended!

From June 1st through July 23rd, HHH provided a fun and safe place for 105 children and teens ages 4 to 18 across race, religion, ability, and socioeconomic status. On average, 50 campers and 10 teen helpers attended each day to eat a free lunch and participate in summer camp activities.

The 2026 theme was “Fable Forest”, and each week was based around a life lesson from Aesop’s Fables. From Monday through Thursday, children aged four to thirteen enjoyed classes including Art, Music, STEM, Brain Games, Reading Buddies, P.E., LEGO, Board Games, Puzzles, Cooking Class, and more. High school age youth were our junior leaders, assisting the adult volunteers with taking each group of children around to activities and often participating themselves as well.

In partnership with the Collinsville Food Pantry and our financial sponsors, St. John provided more than one thousand, seven hundred free hot lunches and three hundred and twelve “Tote Me Home” bags of groceries for families to take home for the weekend. We also offered free vision screenings, free haircuts, and backpacks filled with school supplies for each camper.

None of that would have been possible without your support!

I would like to especially thank the more than 80 adult and teen volunteers (many from our own congregation) who put in a combined total of more than two-thousand one hundred hours to make this year’s summer camp possible!

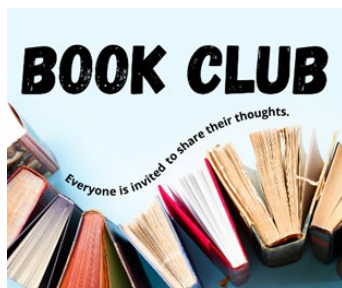

Theo of Golden by Allen Levi

One spring morning, a stranger named Theo arrives in the small Southern city of Golden. He doesn't explain much about where he came from or why he's there—but when he visits the local coffeehouse, where pencil portraits of the people of Golden hang on the walls, he begins purchasing them, one at a time,

and giving each portrait to the person depicted. In exchange, he asks only for the person's story. And so portrait by portrait, person by person, secrets are revealed, regrets are shared, and ordinary lives are profoundly altered.

A story of giving and receiving, of seeing and being seen, *Theo of Golden* is an unforgettable novel about the power of generosity, the importance of connection, and the quiet miracles that happen when we choose kindness and wonder.

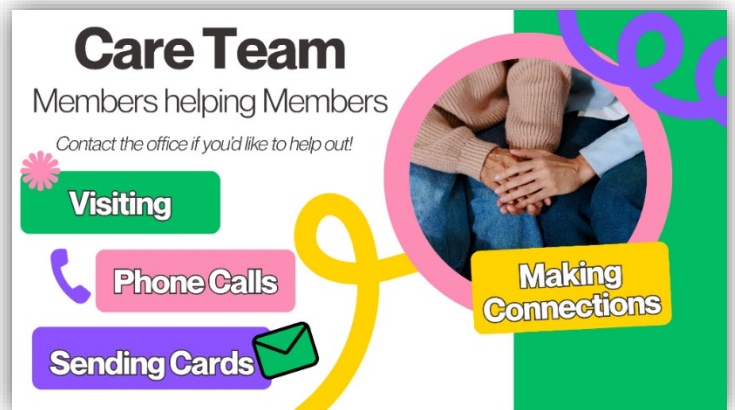
A word from “Mrs. Cat” about our church’s Care Ministry Team

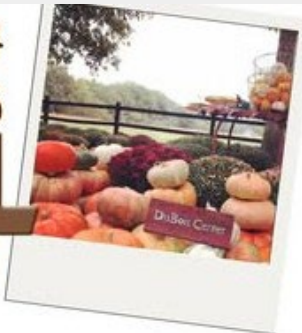
