## MEET THE USERS

Suwarnapur is a small village in the Kailali District of far-western Nepal. Most of the people living there belong to the Tharu community. Many families are poor and have limited access to education. Most adults work as daily wage laborers and earn only enough to meet basic needs.

For a long time, three houses in the village faced serious challenges accessing clean drinking water because there was no well or public tap nearby. They had to rely on a neighbor's private well located about 50 meters away. Because the well did not belong to them, they could not use it freely and often had to endure unkind words. Collecting water each day was exhausting and stressful. Simple daily activities—like bathing, washing clothes, and keeping the home clean—became difficult. At times, families had no choice but to walk even farther to use other private tube wells outside their community. Carrying heavy containers of water back home every day required significant time and physical effort. The water problem affected more than just drinking needs. It became difficult to maintain personal hygiene, keep the surroundings clean, water small vegetable gardens, and care for livestock.

## MEET THE USERS (CONT.)

Daily life grew harder, and families struggled to improve their living conditions. Because this situation continued for so long, there was a clear need for a dependable water source.

To address this need, a public well was installed in the community.

This well directly benefits three households and also supports more than 30 other local people, including farmers and visitors. With clean water now nearby, daily life has become much easier. Families can bathe, wash clothes, keep their homes clean, grow vegetables, and care for their animals with far less difficulty. The well has brought great relief and happiness to the community.

In addition to meeting physical needs, the well has also opened doors for building relationships and sharing the gospel of Jesus with the people. The community has responded positively, and relationships between residents and the church have grown stronger. The service shown by the Christians has been deeply appreciated, and the people have expressed sincere gratitude to Quenched for helping bring clean water and hope to their village.
