MEET THE RECIPIENTS

A new well was installed in Bahadurpur village in the Kailali District of far-western Nepal, home to families from the marginalized Tharu community. Most households rely on daily wage labor and struggle to meet basic needs.

Before the well was installed, access to clean drinking water was extremely difficult. Families without their own water source depended on a private well about 100 meters away, often waiting in long lines and sometimes returning home without water. Adults missed work and children missed school due to the time spent collecting water, and limited access made it hard to maintain hygiene and keep families healthy. To meet this critical need, a new well was installed to provide safe and reliable drinking water. It now directly serves about 40 people and indirectly benefits another 30 to 35 nearby residents. With easy access to clean water, families spend less time collecting water, can better manage daily routines, and experience improved health and reduced stress.

This well has brought dignity, improved health, and peace of mind to the people of Bahadurpur village. Thank you, Quenched.

MEET THE CARETAKER

My name is Govind Thapa, and I serve as a coordinator in this area. I would like to share my testimony about this village and the impact of the well installed here.

Before the well was built, the community faced serious water challenges. There was no proper public well, and people struggled daily to collect drinking water. A former public well became private after land division, leaving families without a reliable water source and often facing difficulty, fear, and humiliation while trying to collect water.

After the new well was installed, I witnessed immediate and meaningful change. The community now has easy access to clean water, and even people passing along the road can stop and drink. Most importantly, people no longer hear harsh words or feel afraid when collecting water. Everyone can use the well freely and with dignity. The installation process was not easy. At first, no water came out, and we had to dig repeatedly for five days. It required great patience and hard work, but when water finally flowed, it brought great joy to the entire community.

This well has not only solved the water problem but has also brought unity, relief, and hope to the village. The community is deeply thankful to Quenched.
