Previously, they depended on a single government borewell about 300 meters away for all daily needs. Because it relied on electricity, it often failed during outages, forcing residents to use a nearby stream. Accessing cleaner drinking water required walking nearly 500 meters, a burden especially for women, children, and the elderly.

In response, Quenched Ministry installed a new borewell, drilled to 240 feet with 80 feet of casing for durability and safety.

Now dedicated for community use, the well provides reliable, nearby access to clean water—bringing relief, dignity, and renewed hope to the families. The villagers are deeply grateful to Quenched Ministry and all who made this possible, and thank God for this lasting blessing.

Our previous wells were shallow, under 100 feet, and produced yellow, foul-smelling water due to high iron content, which affected our health. Many people were often sick, yet we had no choice but to use it. Only one or two wells provided somewhat clean water.

We learned clean water could be found at around 180 feet, but drilling that deep was too expensive for daily wage laborers. Our request to the local ward was denied due to lack of budget, and some families had no well at all.

Finally, we approached the church for help. With the community's agreement, this well was installed along the roadside for everyone to access.

Today, more than 235 people benefit from this 184-foot-deep well, which now provides clean water close to home. It has brought new hope and ended our long struggle.

A water well was successfully installed in Bandipur village, in the Siraha district of southern Nepal. The community includes a diverse group of families, and the well was placed at Tabernacle Church (Bandipur), which is currently under construction. There was a strong need for a reliable water source for both the church and nearby households. Before the well was installed, people had to walk about 400 meters to collect water, and some families had no water source at all, relying on distant locations for their daily needs. This well was installed to serve both the church and the surrounding community. The well is now used for church activities such as cleaning, sanitation, and gatherings, while also providing easy access to clean water for nearby families. More than 50 people are directly benefiting, with many others impacted indirectly.

MEET THE RECIPIENTS

My name is Raso Majhi. This well is installed in Musahari Tole, Birta village, in the Sarlahi district of southern Nepal. Most families here have very limited financial resources, and access to clean water has been a major challenge.

Our previous wells were shallow, under 100 feet, and produced yellow, foul-smelling water due to high iron content, which affected our health. Many people were often sick, yet we had no choice but to use it. Only one or two wells provided somewhat clean water.

We learned clean water could be found at around 180 feet, but drilling that deep was too expensive for daily wage laborers. Our request to the local ward was denied due to lack of budget, and some families had no well at all.

Finally, we approached the church for help. With the community's agreement, this well was installed along the roadside for everyone to access.

Today, more than 235 people benefit from this 184-foot-deep well, which now provides clean water close to home. It has brought new hope and ended our long struggle.

MEET THE RECIPIENTS

A new well was recently installed in Sodiyyayin Village in the Siraha district of eastern Nepal. The community is primarily made up of Yadav, Ram, and Saday families, many of whom face deep poverty. A major reason for this well was the widespread contamination of existing water sources with arsenic.

Most households relied on shallow wells between 30–60 feet deep, where the groundwater contained high levels of arsenic. The water often had a bad smell and a yellowish color, and many people became sick with illnesses such as diarrhea and dysentery. Some families did not even have their own wells and had no choice but to use this unsafe water. With over 90% of the community depending on groundwater, access to clean water was a serious need.

To address this, careful research was conducted, and a deep well was installed to reach arsenic-free groundwater. This new well extends to a depth of 165 feet and provides clean, safe drinking water. Local authorities have confirmed the water quality is excellent.

MEET THE RECIPIENTS

A new well was recently installed in Sodiyyayin Village in the Siraha district of eastern Nepal. The community is primarily made up of Yadav, Ram, and Saday families, many of whom face deep poverty. A major reason for this well was the widespread contamination of existing water sources with arsenic.

Most households relied on shallow wells between 30–60 feet deep, where the groundwater contained high levels of arsenic. The water often had a bad smell and a yellowish color, and many people became sick with illnesses such as diarrhea and dysentery. Some families did not even have their own wells and had no choice but to use this unsafe water. With over 90% of the community depending on groundwater, access to clean water was a serious need.

To address this, careful research was conducted, and a deep well was installed to reach arsenic-free groundwater. This new well extends to a depth of 165 feet and provides clean, safe drinking water. Local authorities have confirmed the water quality is excellent.
