A CATHOLIC'S GUIDE TO HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is the most important week in Catholicism. This week of great reverence and reflection spans the final eight days of Jesus' life—from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. It is astounding how much wisdom, insight and inspiration are available to us during this one week. Here is just a sample of what happens during Holy Week:

- Palm Sunday, Jesus triumphantly enters Jerusalem
- Monday of Holy Week, Jesus clears out the temple with a whip
- Tuesday of Holy Week, Jesus is anointed with oil at Bethany and preaches on the Mount of Olives
- Spy Wednesday, Jesus is betrayed by Judas
- Holy Thursday, Jesus celebrates the Last Supper, prays in the Garden of Gethsemane, and is arrested
- Good Friday, Jesus is sentenced to death, scourged, beaten, crucified, and dies on the Cross
- Holy Saturday, Jesus is buried in the tomb and descends into hell
- Easter Sunday, Jesus rises from the dead

We are all trying to make sense of life. One way for us to understand our lives is to look at them through the great experiences that happen during Holy Week. Just try this exercise—at the end of every day, ask yourself, “What sort of day did I have today? Did I have an Ash Wednesday day, or did I have an Easter Sunday day? Did I have a Good Friday day, or did I have a Holy Saturday day?”

What defines those sorts of days? Good Friday is an easy one—it's a day of suffering and sacrifice. There are some days you get to the end of, and you feel like that's the kind of day you've had. What's Holy Saturday? It's a day of darkness, doubt, anxiety, confusion, and a day where faith is tested. What's Easter Sunday? It's a day of new life. Maybe there's a birth of a child in the family, and we see it as a miracle, a gift from God.

We're trying to make sense of our lives, and God is constantly trying to help us make sense of them. These great moments in the life of the Church and the life of Jesus provide powerful lenses through which we can see our lives in a new way, expanding our understanding of ourselves and others.



Sunday Reflection

In the long form of the Passion from Luke’s Gospel, Jesus refers to himself as “the one who serves” (Luke 22:27). This reminds me of today’s second reading from Paul’s letter to the Philippians. He says that Christ “emptied himself, taking the form of a slave” (Philippians 2:7). Jesus is not just being humble here. He gives us an example of how far God will go in loving humanity.

I suspect the apostles were confused when Jesus talked this way. Yet he tells them to be like a servant—expect little reward for what you do for others. Now the apostles might have thought, “Sure, I can do that. I’ll preach about the Kingdom of God for free. Then I’ll really look important and holy.” So Jesus reminds them that the world looks at the person being served as more important than the servant. But he is one who serves. and if the apostles are to be leaders of the church they will need to be servants, too. Why? Because that is how God comes to the people.

In the Passion according to Luke, Jesus heals one of the men sent to arrest him. Barabbas, a murderer, is set free so Jesus can be crucified. As he is led to the cross, he consoles the women who weep for him. And even on the cross, he is the suffering servant who asks the Father to forgive those who are killing him.

With the example of service that Jesus shows toward those who put him to death, can we at least be “one who serves” those around us? Can we at least forgive those who hurt us—maybe even pray for our leaders, especially the ones with whom we disagree.

En la versión larga de la Pasión del Evangelio de Lucas, Jesús se refiere a sí mismo como “el que sirve” (Lucas 22,27). Esto me recuerda de la segunda lectura de hoy de la carta de Pablo a los Filipenses. Dice que Cristo “se anonadó a sí mismo, tomando la condición de siervo” (Filipenses 2,7). Jesús no solo está siendo humilde aquí. Nos da un ejemplo de hasta dónde llegará Dios por amor a la humanidad.

Me imagino que los apóstoles estaban confundidos cuando Jesús habló de esta manera. Sin embargo, les dice que sean como un sirviente: esperen poca recompensa por lo que hacen por los demás.

Ahora bien, los apóstoles podrían haber pensado: “Claro, yo puedo hacer eso. Predicaré sobre el Reino de Dios sin cobrar y así me verá verdaderamente importante y santo”. Entonces Jesús les recuerda que el mundo ve a la persona servida como más importante que el sirviente. Pero Él es uno que sirve, y si los apóstoles han de ser líderes de la Iglesia, también tendrán que ser sirvientes. ¿Por qué? Porque así es como Dios se presenta al pueblo.

En la Pasión según San Lucas, Jesús sana a uno de los hombres enviados a arrestarlo. Dejan libre a Barrabás, un asesino, para que Jesús sea crucificado. Mientras es conducido a la cruz, consuela a las mujeres que lloran por Él, e incluso en la cruz, es el siervo sufriente que pide al Padre que perdone a quienes lo están matando.

Con el ejemplo de servicio que Jesús muestra hacia quienes lo condenaron a muerte, ¿podríamos por lo menos ser “el que sirve” a quienes nos rodean? ¿Podríamos por lo menos perdonar a los que nos hagan daño, tal vez incluso rezar por nuestros líderes, especialmente aquellos con quienes no estamos de acuerdo?
