In today's Gospel, we see the Samaritan woman coming to faith. The steps she takes are our steps, too. Though she needs Jesus' help, he approaches her first. He invites us to make the journey of faith long before we start, by putting us into a faithful family, giving us a curious heart that seeks the truth, sending us a friend or spouse whose example draws us to the Lord.

The next step is acknowledging our need and our sinfulness. Admitting our need for God, and especially for God's forgiveness, opens us to God's saving grace. Another step is drawing closer to God in prayer. Jesus tells the woman, and us, that the best worship is honest and from the Spirit.

When we begin to share our faith with others, we take the step of living our faith. Like the woman who told her neighbors about Jesus, we find that the people we have touched begin to find the Lord on their own. Our catechumens are taking these steps now, thanks to those who have helped them experience Jesus' invitation to faith.

El siguiente paso es reconocer nuestra necesidad y nuestra condición de pecadores. Admitir nuestra necesidad de Dios, y especialmente de su perdón, nos abre a su gracia salvadora. Otro paso es acercarnos a Dios en la oración. Jesús le dice a la mujer, y a nosotros, que la mejor adoración es sincera y proviene del Espíritu.

Quando comenzamos a compartir nuestra fe con los demás, damos el paso de vivirla. Como la mujer que habló de Jesús a sus vecinos, descubrimos que las personas a quienes hemos impactado comienzan a encontrar al Señor por sí mismas. Nuestros catecúmenos están dando estos pasos ahora, gracias a quienes les han ayudado a experimentar la invitación de Jesús a la fe.

Interesting facts about Lent

Why Catholics abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent as a form of penance to honor Christ's sacrifice, reflecting self-discipline and spiritual devotion.

Historical and Religious Background
The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays dates back to the early Church. Friday was chosen because it is the day Jesus Christ suffered and died on the cross, making it a day of penance and reflection.

Abstinence from meat is one of the oldest Christian traditions, originating from the "black fast" in the first century, where believers refrained from flesh meat to honor Christ's sacrifice. Historically, meat was considered a luxury and associated with feasting, while fish was more common and not linked to celebrations, making meat a meaningful sacrifice.

Canonical and Age Requirements
According to Church law, abstinence from meat is required for all Catholics aged 14 and older, with no upper age limit. During Lent, all Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence, meaning Catholics are expected to refrain from eating meat from mammals and poultry.

Spiritual Significance
Abstaining from meat is a form of **penance**, helping Catholics unite their sufferings with Christ and practice self-discipline. It serves as a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice and encourages reflection on spiritual priorities over worldly pleasures. The act of giving up meat, a celebratory food, symbolizes simplicity and humility, aligning with the Lenten focus on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

The Sanctuary Lamp



Pagar por una vela o veladora del Santísimo Sacramento es un acto de devoción católica, a menudo llamado "vela votiva", que simboliza una intención especial, oración o agradecimiento ante la presencia real de Cristo.

Paying for a votive candle before the Blessed Sacrament is an act of Catholic devotion, often called a "votive candle," that symbolizes a special intention, prayer, or expression of gratitude before the Real Presence of Christ.

Representa dejar el corazón unido a Dios, ofreciendo luz, fe y esperanza por una necesidad particular.

It represents uniting one's heart to God, offering light, faith, and hope for a particular need.

La vela encendida ante el Santísimo representa la luz de Cristo y es un signo visible de la oración de los fieles que permanece ante Él, incluso cuando la persona se retira.

The candle lit before the Blessed Sacrament represents the light of Christ and is a visible sign of the prayer of the faithful that remains before Him, even after the person leaves.

They are lit to ask for favors, in gratitude for answered prayers, or as a sign of solidarity and love for someone.

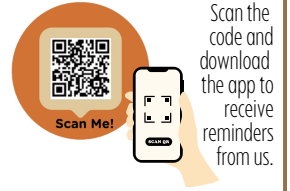

As parents, we think a lot about the kind of people we want our kids to become: wise, compassionate, and capable of navigating the world with integrity and confidence. But in a culture full of noise and shifting values, we're often left wondering: Who or what is really shaping our children?

That's why more families are asking a deeper question:



Should faith play a role in my child's education?

At SPX, this isn't just about teaching Bible class. It means exploring science, history, literature, and art in ways that point students to what's good, true, and beautiful. In other words, we don't just teach what to think, but how to think with wisdom and conviction.

Kids naturally ask, Who am I? Why does this matter? What's my purpose? If we don't guide them toward answers rooted in truth, the world will offer its own.

Faith-based education helps students see their identity as image bearers of God, created with purpose. It roots them in a story bigger than themselves one that brings meaning to their learning and their lives.

At SPX, students are reminded often: they are part of God's story. From Jr.K to 8th grade, they're encouraged to discover how their gifts and calling fit into His plan.

Strong academics are essential but they're not enough on their own. As C.S. Lewis put it, "Education without values... may make a man a more clever devil."

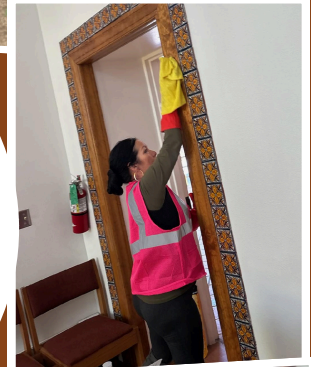
A faith based approach shapes the whole child's mind, heart, and soul. It doesn't just prepare students for college. It prepares them for life.
